HOUSE BILL NO. 938

AN ACT TO REPEAL SECTION 41-41-45, MISSISSIPPI CODE OF 1972, 1 2 WHICH PROHIBITS ABORTION EXCEPT FOR THE PRESERVATION OF THE 3 MOTHER'S LIFE OR WHERE THE PREGNANCY IS CAUSED BY RAPE; TO REPEAL 4 SECTION 97-3-3, MISSISSIPPI CODE OF 1972, WHICH CREATES A FELONY 5 CRIME FOR ANY PERSON WHO WILLFULLY AND KNOWINGLY CAUSES ANY 6 PREGNANT WOMAN TO ABORT OR MISCARRY A CHILD; TO REPEAL SECTION 97-3-4, MISSISSIPPI CODE OF 1972, WHICH CREATES A FELONY CRIME FOR 7 ALLOWING A CHILD DELIVERED IN FAILED ABORTION TO DIE; TO REPEAL 8 9 SECTION 97-3-5, MISSISSIPPI CODE OF 1972, WHICH CREATES A 10 MISDEMEANOR CRIME FOR ANY PERSON WHO PROVIDES AN INSTRUMENT OR 11 MEDICINE TO ASSIST A WOMAN IN OBTAINING AN ABORTION; AND FOR 12 RELATED PURPOSES.

13 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI:

14 **SECTION 1.** Section 41-41-45, which prohibits abortion except

15 for the preservation of the mother's life or where the pregnancy

16 is caused by rape, is repealed.

17 SECTION 2. Section 97-3-3, which creates a felony crime for

18 any person who willfully and knowingly causes any pregnant woman

19 to abort or miscarry a child, is repealed.

20 SECTION 3. Section 97-3-4, which creates a felony crime for 21 allowing a child delivered in failed abortion to die, is repealed. SECTION 4. Section 97-3-5, which creates a misdemeanor crime for any person who provides an instrument or medicine to assist a woman in obtaining an abortion, is repealed.

25 SECTION 5. This act shall take effect and be in force from 26 and after July 1, 2023.
