## HOUSE BILL NO. 982

- AN ACT TO CREATE THE TORT NONECONOMIC DAMAGES ASSESSMENT TASK FORCE; TO PROVIDE THE DUTIES OF THE TASK FORCE; TO PROVIDE THE MEMBERSHIP OF THE TASK FORCE; TO REQUIRE THE TASK FORCE TO MEET BY A DATE CERTAIN; TO REQUIRE THE TASK FORCE TO RECOMMEND REVISIONS TO THE NONECONOMIC DAMAGE AMOUNT BY A CERTAIN DATE; AND FOR
- 6 RELATED PURPOSES.
- 7 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI:
- 8 **SECTION 1.** (1) There is created the Tort Noneconomic
- 9 Damages Assessment Task Force, which will be responsible for
- 10 revising the noneconomic damage amount set by statute in order to
- 11 ensure that the amount is reflective of projected inflation rates,
- 12 and providing such recommendations to the Legislature.
- 13 (2) The task force shall consist of the following seven (7)
- 14 members:
- 15 (a) The Chairpersons of the Judiciary A Committees for
- 16 the Mississippi House of Representatives and the Mississippi
- 17 Senate, or their designees;
- 18 (b) The Chairpersons of the Judiciary B Committees for
- 19 the Mississippi House of Representatives and the Mississippi
- 20 Senate, or their designees;

- 21 A member of the Mississippi Association of Justice,
- 22 chosen by the President of the Mississippi Bar Association;
- 23 A member of the Defense Bar, chosen by the
- 24 President of the Mississippi Bar Association; and
- 25 The Attorney General, or his or her designee.
- 26 At its first meeting, the task force shall elect a
- chairman and other necessary officers from amongst its membership. 27
- 28 The task force shall adopt bylaws and rules for its efficient
- 29 operation.
- 30 The task force shall meet and conduct business at (4)(a)
- 31 least monthly, with their first meeting to be held no later than
- 32 June 1, 2023. All meetings of the task force and any committees
- 33 of the task force will be open to the public, with opportunities
- for public comment provided on a regular basis. Notice of all 34
- meetings shall be given as provided in the Open Meetings Act 35
- 36 (Section 25-41-1 et seq.) and appropriate notice also shall be
- 37 given to all persons so requesting of the date, time and place of
- each meeting. A majority of the appointed members shall 38
- 39 constitute a quorum.
- 40 The task force shall submit a final report with its (b)
- 41 recommendations by December 1, 2023. Upon submission of the
- 42 report, the task force shall be dissolved.
- The task force is assigned to the Administrative Office 43
- of Courts for administrative purposes only, and the department 44
- shall designate staff to assist the task force. The task force 45

- will have a line item in the budget of the Administrative Office
  of Courts and will be financed by the Legislature through the
- 48 agency's annual appropriation.
- 49 (6) Members of the task force who are not legislators, state
- 50 officials or state employees may be compensated at the per diem
- 51 rate authorized by Section 25-3-69 and may be reimbursed in
- 52 accordance with Section 25-3-41 for mileage and actual expenses
- 53 incurred in the performance of their duties. Legislative members
- of the task force will be paid from the contingent expense funds
- of their respective houses in the same manner as provided for
- 56 committee meetings when the Legislature is not in session.
- 57 However, legislative members will not be paid per diem or expenses
- 58 for attending meetings of the task force while the Legislature is
- 59 in session. No task force member may incur per diem, travel or
- 60 other expenses unless previously authorized by vote, at a meeting
- of the task force, which action must be recorded in the official
- 62 minutes of the meeting. Nonlegislative members may be paid from
- 63 any funds made available to the task force for that purpose.
- 64 **SECTION 2.** This act shall take effect and be in force from
- 65 and after its passage.
