HOUSE BILL NO. 1072

AN ACT TO AMEND SECTION 29-1-145, MISSISSIPPI CODE OF 1972, 2 TO PROVIDE THAT IF A CHANCERY CLERK OR MUNICIPAL CLERK NOTIFIES THE SECRETARY OF STATE OF A HAZARDOUS TREE ON CERTIFIED TAX FORFEITED PROPERTY AND SUCH TREE IS REMOVED, THEN THE COST OF THE 5 REMOVAL MAY BE SUBMITTED TO THE SECRETARY OF STATE FOR 6 REIMBURSEMENT; TO AUTHORIZE THE SECRETARY OF STATE TO WITHHOLD A CERTAIN PERCENTAGE OF ITS PROCEEDS FROM THE SALES OF TAX FORFEITED 7 LAND TO PAY FOR THE REMOVAL; AND FOR RELATED PURPOSES. 8 9 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI: 10 **SECTION 1.** Section 29-1-145, Mississippi Code of 1972, is amended as follows: 11 12 29-1-145. The chancery clerk or municipal clerk shall report to the Secretary of State any reasonable costs incurred by the 13 14 county or municipality in maintaining unredeemed lands sold for taxes * * * that have been certified to the state. The Secretary 15 16 of State shall pay the maintenance costs out of the money deposited into the Land Records Maintenance Fund. The Secretary 17 of State shall certify to the Department of Finance and 18 19 Administration and to the State Treasurer the amount of 20 maintenance costs allowed to the county and municipality, and the 21 Department of Finance and Administration shall issue a warrant in

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22	favor	of	the	county	or	municipal	itv	for	the	amount	of	those	cost

- 23 In no event shall the maintenance costs allowed the county or
- 24 municipality exceed the market value of the lands or the purchase
- 25 money received from the sale of those lands.
- 26 (2) (a) In the event the chancery clerk or municipal clerk
- 27 notifies the Secretary of State of a tree located on tax forfeited
- 28 property that has been certified to the state, which poses an
- 29 immediate harm to life or property of the adjoining parcels, the
- 30 chancery clerk or municipal clerk is authorized to remove the tree
- 31 and submit the cost of removal to the Secretary of State for
- 32 reimbursement.
- 33 (b) To pay for the removal of trees, the Secretary of
- 34 State is authorized to withhold up to ten percent (10%) of its
- 35 proceeds from the sales of tax forfeited properties.
- 36 (c) At the end of each fiscal year, remaining funds
- 37 held by the Secretary of State to pay for tree removal shall be
- 38 turned back into the State General Fund. If at any time the fund
- 39 is exhausted, the Secretary of State is not obligated to make
- 40 disbursements.
- 41 **SECTION 2.** This act shall take effect and be in force from
- 42 and after July 1, 2023.
