29 MISSISSIPPI CODE OF 1972, TO PROVIDE THAT MONIES PROVIDED BY THE
30 LEGISLATURE IN A CERTAIN FUND CREATED IN THE MISSISSIPPI BUSINESS
31 ACT MAY BE USED TO REIMBURSE REASONABLE ACTUAL AND NECESSARY COSTS
32 INCURRED BY THE MISSISSIPPI DEVELOPMENT AUTHORITY; TO AMEND
33 SECTION 65-4-15, MISSISSIPPI CODE OF 1972, TO PROVIDE THAT MONIES
34 PROVIDED BY THE LEGISLATURE IN THE ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT HIGHWAY



35 FUND MAY BE USED TO REIMBURSE REASONABLE ACTUAL AND NECESSARY
36 COSTS INCURRED BY THE MISSISSIPPI DEVELOPMENT AUTHORITY; TO AMEND
37 SECTION 57-1-221, MISSISSIPPI CODE OF 1972, TO PROVIDE THAT MONIES
38 PROVIDED BY THE LEGISLATURE IN THE MISSISSIPPI INDUSTRY INCENTIVE
39 FINANCING REVOLVING FUND MAY BE USED TO REIMBURSE REASONABLE
40 ACTUAL AND NECESSARY COSTS INCURRED BY THE MISSISSIPPI DEVELOPMENT
41 AUTHORITY; TO AMEND SECTION 57-1-601, MISSISSIPPI CODE OF 1972, TO
42 PROVIDE THAT MONIES PROVIDED BY THE LEGISLATURE IN THE MISSISSIPPI
43 MAIN STREET INVESTMENT GRANT FUND MAY BE USED TO REIMBURSE
44 REASONABLE ACTUAL AND NECESSARY COSTS INCURRED BY THE MISSISSIPPI
45 DEVELOPMENT AUTHORITY; TO AMEND SECTION 65-1-183, MISSISSIPPI CODE
46 OF 1972, TO AUTHORIZE THE DEPARTMENT OF TRANSPORTATION TO TRANSFER
47 FUNDS FROM THE 2022 INFRASTRUCTURE MATCH FUND TO THE DEPARTMENT'S
48 AGENCY SUPPORT FUND SUBJECT TO CERTAIN PROVISIONS; AND FOR RELATED
49 PURPOSES.

50 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI:

51 **SECTION 1.** Section 27-104-371, Mississippi Code of 1972, is
52 amended as follows:

53 27-104-371. (1) A special fund, to be designated as the
54 "2022 Local Improvements Projects Fund," is created within the
55 State Treasury. The fund shall be maintained by the State
56 Treasurer as a separate and special fund, separate and apart from
57 the General Fund of the state. Unexpended amounts remaining in
58 the fund at the end of a fiscal year shall not lapse into the
59 State General Fund, and any interest earned or investment earnings
60 on amounts in the fund shall be deposited into such fund.

61 (2) Monies deposited into the fund shall be disbursed by the
62 Department of Finance and Administration as follows:

63 (a) To the Department of Archives and History for the
64 purpose of providing a grant to the Scott Ford House, Inc., to
65 develop the property located at 136 East Cohea Street in the City
66 of Jackson, the home of the former slave Mary Scott Green, to tell
67 her story and that of other Mississippi midwives, and to develop



68 the property located at 138 East Cohea Street in the City of
69 Jackson as a house museum to tell the family story of the midwife
70 Virginia Scott Ford.....\$ 200,000.00

71 (b) To assist in paying costs associated with repair,

1321 **SECTION 4.** Section 5, Chapter 64, Law of 2022, is amended as
1322 follows:

1323 Section 5. Of the funds appropriated under the provisions of
1324 this act, the following positions are authorized:

1325 AUTHORIZED HEADCOUNT:

1326 Permanent: * * * 925

1327 Time-Limited: * * * 82

1328 With the funds herein appropriated, it shall be the agency's
1329 responsibility to make certain that funds required for Personal
1330 Services for Fiscal Year 2024 do not exceed Fiscal Year 2023 funds
1331 appropriated for that purpose unless programs or positions are
1332 added to the agency's Fiscal Year 2023 budget by the Mississippi



1333 Legislature. The Legislature shall determine the agency's
1334 personal services appropriation, which shall be published by the
1335 State Personnel Board. Additionally, the State Personnel Board
1336 shall determine and publish the projected annualized payroll costs
1337 based on current employees. It shall be the responsibility of the
1338 agency head to ensure that actual personnel expenditures for
1339 Fiscal Year 2023 do not exceed the data provided by the
1340 Legislative Budget Office. If the agency's Fiscal Year 2023
1341 projected cost exceeds the annualized costs, no salary actions
1342 shall be processed by the State Personnel Board with the exception
1343 of new hires that are determined to be essential for the agency.

1344 Any transfers or escalations shall be made in accordance with
1345 the terms, conditions and procedures established by law or
1346 allowable under the terms set forth within this act. The State
1347 Personnel Board shall not escalate positions without written
1348 approval from the Department of Finance and Administration. The
1349 Department of Finance and Administration shall not provide written
1350 approval to escalate any funds for salaries and/or positions
1351 without proof of availability of new or additional funds above the
1352 appropriated level.

1353 No general funds authorized to be expended herein shall be
1354 used to replace federal funds and/or other special funds which are
1355 being used for salaries authorized under the provisions of this
1356 act and which are withdrawn and no longer available.



1357 None of the funds herein appropriated shall be used in
1358 violation of Internal Revenue Service's Publication 15-A relating
1359 to the reporting of income paid to contract employees, as
1360 interpreted by the Office of the State Auditor.

1361 Funds have been appropriated herein for the purpose of
1362 funding Project SEC2 minimum salaries for all employees covered
1363 under the Colonel Guy Groff/Neville Kenning Variable Compensation
1364 Plan. It shall be the agency's responsibility to ensure that the
1365 funds are used to increase all employees' salaries up to the
1366 minimum level as determined by the State Personnel Board.

1367 **SECTION 5.** Section 9, Chapter 98, Laws of 2022,
1368 appropriation to the Workers' Compensation Commission, is amended
1369 as follows:

1370 Section 9. Of the funds appropriated under the provisions of
1371 Section 2 of this act, Seventy-five Thousand Dollars (\$75,000.00),
1372 or so much thereof, shall be derived out of any money in the State
1373 Treasury to the credit of the Capital Expense Fund, as created in
1374 Section 27-103-303, Mississippi Code of 1972, and allocated in a
1375 manner as determined by the Treasurer's Office. This
1376 appropriation is made for the purpose of * * * infrastructure
1377 improvements to the commission's building, including, but not
1378 limited to, compliance with the Americans with Disabilities Act.

1379 **SECTION 6.** Section 57-1-16, Mississippi Code of 1972, is
1380 amended as follows:

1381 57-1-16. (1) As used in this section:



1382 (a) "Extraordinary economic development opportunity"
1383 means a new or expanded business or industry which maintains a
1384 strong financial condition and minimal credit risk and creates
1385 substantial employment, particularly in areas of high
1386 unemployment. The term "extraordinary economic development
1387 opportunity" does not include any medical cannabis establishment
1388 as defined in the Mississippi Medical Cannabis Act.

1389 (b) "Local economic development entities" means state
1390 institutions of higher learning or public or private nonprofit
1391 local economic development entities including, but not limited to,
1392 chambers of commerce, local authorities, commissions or other
1393 entities created by local and private legislation or districts
1394 created pursuant to Section 19-5-99.

1395 (c) "MDA" means the Mississippi Development Authority.

1396 (2) (a) There is hereby created in the State Treasury a
1397 special fund to be designated as the ACE Fund, which shall consist
1398 of money from any public or private source designated for deposit
1399 into such fund. Unexpended amounts remaining in the fund at the
1400 end of a fiscal year shall not lapse into the State General Fund,
1401 and any interest earned on amounts in the fund shall be deposited
1402 to the credit of the fund. The purpose of the fund shall be to
1403 assist in maximizing extraordinary economic development
1404 opportunities related to any new or expanded business or industry
1405 or to assist a local unit of government as authorized in
1406 subsection (5) of this section. Such funds may be used to make



1407 grants to local economic development entities to assist any new or
1408 expanding business or industry that meets the criteria provided in
1409 this section when such assistance aids the consummation of a
1410 project within the State of Mississippi, including any federal
1411 Indian reservation located within the geographical boundary of
1412 Mississippi, or to make grants to a local unit of government as
1413 authorized in subsection (5) of this section.

1414 (b) Monies in the fund which are derived from the
1415 proceeds of general obligation bonds or provided by the
1416 Legislature may be used to reimburse reasonable actual and
1417 necessary costs incurred by the MDA for the administration of the
1418 various grant, loan and financial incentive programs administered
1419 by the MDA. An accounting of actual costs incurred for which
1420 reimbursement is sought shall be maintained by the MDA.
1421 Reimbursement of reasonable actual and necessary costs shall not
1422 exceed three percent (3%) of the proceeds of bonds issued or the
1423 monies provided by the Legislature. Reimbursements made under
1424 this subsection shall satisfy any applicable federal tax law
1425 requirements.

1426 (3) The MDA shall establish a grant program to make grants
1427 from the ACE Fund created under this section. Local economic
1428 development entities may apply to the MDA for a grant under this
1429 section in the manner provided for in subsection (4) of this
1430 section. Local units of government may apply to the MDA for a



1431 grant under this section in the manner provided in subsection (5)
1432 of this section.

1433 (4) (a) Any business or industry desiring assistance from a
1434 local economic development entity under this section shall submit
1435 an application to the local economic development entity which
1436 shall include, at a minimum:

1437 (i) Evidence that the business or industry meets
1438 the definition of an extraordinary economic development
1439 opportunity;

1440 (ii) A demonstration that the business or industry
1441 is at an economic disadvantage by locating the new or expanded
1442 project in the county;

1443 (iii) A description, including the cost, of the
1444 requested assistance;

1445 (iv) A description of the purpose for which the
1446 assistance is requested;

1447 (v) A two-year business plan;

1448 (vi) Financial statements or tax returns for the
1449 three (3) years immediately prior to the application;

1450 (vii) Credit reports on all persons or entities
1451 with a twenty percent (20%) or greater interest in the business or
1452 industry; and

1453 (viii) Any other information required by the MDA.

1454 (b) The MDA shall require that binding commitments be
1455 entered into requiring that:



1456 (i) The minimum requirements of this section and
1457 such other requirements as the MDA considers proper shall be met;
1458 and

1459 (ii) If such requirements are not met, all or a
1460 portion of the funds provided by this section as determined by the
1461 MDA shall be repaid.

1462 (c) Upon receipt of the application from a business or
1463 industry, the local economic development entity may apply to the
1464 MDA for assistance under this section. Such application must
1465 contain evidence that the business or industry meets the
1466 definition of an extraordinary economic development opportunity, a
1467 demonstration that the business or industry is at an economic
1468 disadvantage by locating the new or expanded project in the
1469 county, a description, including the cost, of the requested
1470 assistance, and a statement of what efforts have been made or are
1471 being made by the business or industry for securing or qualifying
1472 for other local, state, federal or private funds for the project.

1473 (d) The MDA shall have sole discretion in the awarding
1474 of ACE funds, provided that the business or industry and the local
1475 economic development entity have met the statutory requirements of
1476 this section. However, in making grants under this section, the
1477 MDA shall attempt to provide for an equitable distribution of such
1478 grants among each of the congressional districts of this state in
1479 order to promote economic development across the entire state.



1480 (5) (a) The MDA may make grants to local units of
1481 government to assist the local unit of government in purchasing
1482 real property for the benefit of an existing industry that commits
1483 to maintain a minimum of one thousand three hundred (1,300) jobs
1484 for a minimum of ten (10) years after the date the grant is made.
1485 The MDA shall not make grants under this subsection to assist
1486 local units of government for the benefit of any medical cannabis
1487 establishment as defined in the Mississippi Medical Cannabis Act.

1488 (b) Any local unit of government seeking a grant
1489 authorized under this subsection shall apply to MDA. The
1490 application shall contain such information as the MDA may require.

1491 (c) The MDA shall require that binding commitments be
1492 entered into requiring that:

1493 (i) The minimum requirements of this subsection
1494 and such other requirements as the MDA considers proper shall be
1495 met; and

1496 (ii) If such requirements are not met, all or a
1497 portion of the funds provided by this section as determined by the
1498 MDA shall be repaid.

1499 (6) The MDA shall promulgate rules and regulations, in
1500 accordance with the Mississippi Administrative Procedures Law, for
1501 the implementation of this section. However, before the
1502 implementation of any such rules and regulations, they shall be
1503 submitted to a committee consisting of five (5) members of the
1504 Senate Finance Committee and five (5) members of the House of



1505 Representatives Ways and Means Committee, appointed by the
1506 respective committee chairmen.

1507 **SECTION 7.** Section 57-1-701, Mississippi Code of 1972, is
1508 amended as follows:

1509 57-1-701. (1) For the purposes of this section, the
1510 following words and phrases shall have the meanings ascribed in
1511 this subsection unless the context clearly indicates otherwise:

1512 (a) "Eligible entity" means any (i) county, (ii)
1513 municipality or (iii) public or private nonprofit local economic
1514 development entity including, but not limited to, local
1515 authorities, commissions, or other entities created by local and
1516 private legislation or pursuant to Section 19-5-99.

1517 (b) "Optioned property" means industrial property that
1518 is subject to a real estate option to purchase contract entered
1519 into between an eligible entity and a real estate owner, where
1520 such option shall be for a minimum of three (3) years and the
1521 option price shall not exceed the appraised fair market value of
1522 the real estate.

1523 (c) "Eligible expenditures" means:

1524 (i) Fees for architects, engineers, environmental
1525 consultants, attorneys, and such other advisors, consultants and
1526 agents that MDA determines are necessary to complete site due
1527 diligence associated with site development improvements located on
1528 industrial property that is publicly owned or is optioned
1529 property;



1530 (ii) Contributions toward site development
1531 improvements, as approved by MDA, located on industrial property
1532 that is publicly owned;

1533 (iii) Contributions toward public infrastructure
1534 improvements directly serving industrial property that is publicly
1535 owned or is optioned property; and/or

1536 (iv) Contributions toward acquisition of publicly
1537 owned real property used for economic development purposes by an
1538 eligible entity, where the acquisition price shall not exceed the
1539 appraised fair market value of the property.

1540 (d) "MDA" means the Mississippi Development Authority.

1541 (e) "Site development improvements" means site
1542 clearing, grading, and environmental mitigation; improvements to
1543 drainage systems; easement and right-of-way acquisition; sewer
1544 systems; transportation directly affecting the site, including
1545 roads, bridges or rail; bulkheads; taxiways and parking ramps;
1546 land reclamation; water supply (storage, treatment and
1547 distribution); telecommunications systems, including fiber optic;
1548 natural gas distribution systems; aesthetic improvements; the
1549 dredging of channels and basins; or other improvements as approved
1550 by MDA.

1551 (2) (a) There is hereby created in the State Treasury a
1552 special fund to be designated as the "Mississippi Site Development
1553 Grant Fund," which shall consist of funds made available by the
1554 Legislature in any manner and funds from any other source



1555 designated for deposit into such fund. Unexpended amounts
1556 remaining in the fund at the end of a fiscal year shall not lapse
1557 into the State General Fund, and any investment earnings or
1558 interest earned on amounts in the fund shall be deposited to the
1559 credit of the fund. Monies in the fund shall be used to make
1560 grants to assist eligible entities as provided in this section.

1561 (b) Monies in the fund which are derived from proceeds
1562 of bonds issued under Section 2 of Chapter 390, Laws of 2017,
1563 Section 5 of Chapter 412, Laws of 2018, Section 1 of Chapter 421,
1564 Laws of 2019, Section 4 of Chapter 492, Laws of 2020, or Section 8
1565 of Chapter 480, Laws of 2021 or provided by the Legislature, may
1566 be used to reimburse reasonable actual and necessary costs
1567 incurred by MDA for the administration of the various grant, loan
1568 and financial incentive programs administered by MDA. An
1569 accounting of actual costs incurred for which reimbursement is
1570 sought shall be maintained by MDA. Reimbursement of reasonable
1571 actual and necessary costs shall not exceed three percent (3%) of
1572 the proceeds of bonds issued or the monies provided by the
1573 Legislature. Reimbursements under this subsection shall satisfy
1574 any applicable federal tax law requirements.

1575 (3) (a) MDA shall establish a program to make grants to
1576 eligible entities to match local or other funds associated with
1577 improving the marketability of publicly owned industrial property
1578 for industrial economic development purposes and other property
1579 improvements as approved by MDA. An eligible entity may apply to



1580 MDA for a grant under this program in the manner provided for in
1581 this section. An eligible entity desiring assistance under this
1582 section must provide matching funds in an amount determined by
1583 MDA. Matching funds may be provided in the form of cash and/or
1584 in-kind services as determined by MDA.

1585 (b) An eligible entity desiring assistance under this
1586 section must submit an application to MDA. The application must
1587 include:

1588 (i) A description of the eligible expenditures for
1589 which assistance is requested;

1590 (ii) The amount of assistance requested;

1591 (iii) The amount and type of matching funds to be
1592 provided by the eligible entity; and

1593 (iv) Any other information required by MDA.

1594 (c) Upon request by MDA, an eligible entity shall
1595 provide MDA with access to all studies, reports, documents and/or
1596 plans developed as a result of or related to an eligible entity
1597 receiving assistance under this section.

1598 (4) MDA shall have all powers necessary to implement and
1599 administer the program established under this section, and the
1600 department shall promulgate rules and regulations, in accordance
1601 with the Mississippi Administrative Procedures Law, necessary for
1602 the implementation of this section.

1603 (5) MDA shall file an annual report with the Governor, the
1604 Secretary of the Senate and the Clerk of the House of



1605 Representatives not later than December 1 of each year, describing
1606 all assistance provided under this section.

1607 **SECTION 8.** Section 57-61-21, Mississippi Code of 1972, is
1608 amended as follows:

1609 57-61-21. (1) There is hereby created a special fund in the
1610 State Treasury to be known as the Mississippi Business Investment
1611 Fund dedicated to the purpose of providing grants and/or loans to
1612 municipalities for the purpose of providing for improvements
1613 authorized by this chapter. All monies received by the board to
1614 carry out the purposes of this chapter, by legislative
1615 appropriation, issuance of bonds or otherwise, shall be deposited
1616 into the Mississippi Business Investment Fund. Expenditures
1617 authorized herein shall be paid by the State Treasurer upon
1618 warrants drawn from the Mississippi Business Investment Fund, and
1619 the State Auditor, or his successor to such duties, shall issue
1620 warrants upon requisitions signed by the Chairman or Executive
1621 Director of the Mississippi * * * Development Authority.

1622 (2) Any monies repaid to the state from loans funded through
1623 the Mississippi Business Investment Fund shall be deposited into
1624 the Mississippi Business Investment Sinking Fund, which is hereby
1625 created in the State Treasury. Funds required in excess of the
1626 amounts available in the Mississippi Business Investment Sinking
1627 Fund to retire bonds issued pursuant to this chapter shall be
1628 appropriated from the State General Fund.



1629 (3) Monies in the fund which are derived from the proceeds
1630 of general obligation bonds or provided by the Legislature may be
1631 used to reimburse reasonable actual and necessary costs incurred
1632 by the MDA for the administration of the various grant, loan and
1633 financial incentive programs administered by the MDA. An
1634 accounting of actual costs incurred for which reimbursement is
1635 sought shall be maintained by the MDA. Reimbursement of
1636 reasonable actual and necessary costs shall not exceed three
1637 percent (3%) of the proceeds of bonds issued or the monies
1638 provided by the Legislature.

1639 **SECTION 9.** Section 57-61-25, Mississippi Code of 1972, is
1640 amended as follows:

1641 57-61-25. (1) The seller is authorized to borrow, on the
1642 credit of the state upon receipt of a resolution from the
1643 Mississippi Development Authority requesting the same, monies not
1644 exceeding the aggregate sum of Three Hundred Ninety-seven Million
1645 Five Hundred Thousand Dollars (\$397,500,000.00), not including
1646 monies borrowed to refund outstanding bonds, notes or replacement
1647 notes, as may be necessary to carry out the purposes of this
1648 chapter. The rate of interest on any such bonds or notes which
1649 are not subject to taxation shall not exceed the rates set forth
1650 in Section 75-17-101, Mississippi Code of 1972, for general
1651 obligation bonds.

1652 (2) As evidence of indebtedness authorized in this chapter,
1653 general or limited obligation bonds of the state shall be issued,



1654 from time to time, to provide monies necessary to carry out the
1655 purposes of this chapter for such total amounts, in such form, in
1656 such denominations payable in such currencies (either domestic or
1657 foreign, or both) and subject to such terms and conditions of
1658 issue, redemption and maturity, rate of interest and time of
1659 payment of interest as the seller directs, except that such bonds
1660 shall mature or otherwise be retired in annual installments
1661 beginning not more than five (5) years from date thereof and
1662 extending not more than thirty (30) years from date thereof.

1663 (3) All bonds and notes issued under authority of this
1664 chapter shall be signed by the chairman of the seller, or by his
1665 facsimile signature, and the official seal of the seller shall be
1666 affixed thereto, attested by the secretary of the seller.

1667 (4) All bonds and notes issued under authority of this
1668 chapter may be general or limited obligations of the state, and
1669 the full faith and credit of the State of Mississippi as to
1670 general obligation bonds, or the revenues derived from projects
1671 assisted as to limited obligation bonds, are hereby pledged for
1672 the payment of the principal of and interest on such bonds and
1673 notes.

1674 (5) Such bonds and notes and the income therefrom shall be
1675 exempt from all taxation in the State of Mississippi.

1676 (6) The bonds may be issued as coupon bonds or registered as
1677 to both principal and interest, as the seller may determine. If



1678 interest coupons are attached, they shall contain the facsimile
1679 signature of the chairman and secretary of the seller.

1680 (7) The seller is authorized to provide, by resolution, for
1681 the issuance of refunding bonds for the purpose of refunding any
1682 debt issued under the provisions of this chapter and then
1683 outstanding, either by voluntary exchange with the holders of the
1684 outstanding debt or to provide funds to redeem and the costs of
1685 issuance and retirement of the debt, at maturity or at any call
1686 date. The issuance of the refunding bonds, the maturities and
1687 other details thereof, the rights of the holders thereof and the
1688 duties of the issuing officials in respect to the same shall be
1689 governed by the provisions of this section, insofar as they may be
1690 applicable.

1691 (8) As to bonds issued hereunder and designated as taxable
1692 bonds by the seller, any immunity of the state to taxation by the
1693 United States government of interest on bonds or notes issued by
1694 the state is hereby waived.

1695 (9) The proceeds of bonds issued under this chapter after
1696 April 9, 2002, and any monies provided by the Legislature may be
1697 used to reimburse reasonable actual and necessary costs incurred
1698 by the Mississippi Development Authority for the administration of
1699 the various grant, loan and financial incentive programs
1700 administered by the authority. An accounting of actual costs
1701 incurred for which reimbursement is sought shall be maintained by
1702 the Mississippi Development Authority. Reimbursement of



1703 reasonable actual and necessary costs shall not exceed three
1704 percent (3%) of the proceeds of bonds issued or the monies
1705 provided by the Legislature. Reimbursements under this subsection
1706 shall satisfy any applicable federal tax law requirements.

1707 **SECTION 10.** Section 65-4-15, Mississippi Code of 1972, is
1708 amended as follows:

1709 65-4-15. (1) There is hereby established a special fund in
1710 the State Treasury to be known as the "Economic Development
1711 Highway Fund" which shall consist of such monies as the
1712 Legislature shall appropriate thereto or such other monies as the
1713 Legislature may designate to be deposited therein. Any monies to
1714 the credit of such fund may be expended by the Mississippi
1715 Department of Transportation or political subdivision, as
1716 appropriate, upon approval of requisitions therefor by the
1717 Mississippi Development Authority for any expenses incurred by the
1718 Transportation Department or political subdivision in constructing
1719 and improving highways and highway segments which have been
1720 approved by the Mississippi Development Authority under the
1721 provisions of this chapter. From and after July 1, 2004, no
1722 monies to the credit of the fund may be expended for the
1723 construction and improvement of highways for high economic benefit
1724 projects that are being developed for the primary purpose of
1725 conducting retail sales unless the Mississippi Development
1726 Authority has received an application for the project prior to
1727 July 1, 2004; however, the primary purpose is not conducting



1728 retail sales if the project is a mixed-use development for which
1729 retail space is no more than twenty percent (20%) of the square
1730 footage of the development. With regard to a high economic
1731 benefit project as defined in Section 65-4-5(1)(c)(xiii) for which
1732 the Mississippi Development Authority approved and allocated
1733 monies in the fund before January 1, 2016, for constructing or
1734 improving a highway or highway segment related to the high
1735 economic benefit project, the Mississippi Development Authority
1736 may reallocate such monies from the original highway or highway
1737 segment purpose and allocate the funds for constructing or
1738 improving another highway or highway segment provided that such
1739 highway or highway segment is located within three (3) miles of
1740 the high economic benefit project for which the Mississippi
1741 Development Authority originally allocated and approved the
1742 monies. The Office of State Aid Road Construction shall be
1743 entitled to reimbursement from monies in the fund, upon approval
1744 by the Mississippi Development Authority of requisitions therefor
1745 by the State Aid Engineer, for the actual expenses incurred by the
1746 office in administering and providing engineering services to
1747 political subdivisions. Monies remaining unexpended to the credit
1748 of such special fund at the end of a fiscal year shall not lapse
1749 into the State General Fund, and any interest earned on the
1750 investment of monies in the special fund shall be deposited to the
1751 credit of the fund.



1752 (2) Monies in the Economic Development Highway Fund which
1753 are derived from proceeds of bonds issued under this chapter after
1754 July 1, 2003, or provided by the Legislature may be used to
1755 reimburse reasonable actual and necessary costs incurred by the
1756 Mississippi Development Authority for the administration of the
1757 various grant, loan and financial incentive programs administered
1758 by the authority. An accounting of actual costs incurred for
1759 which reimbursement is sought shall be maintained by the
1760 Mississippi Development Authority. Reimbursement of reasonable
1761 actual and necessary costs shall not exceed three percent (3%) of
1762 the proceeds of bonds issued or the monies provided by the
1763 Legislature. Reimbursements to the Mississippi Development
1764 Authority under this subsection shall satisfy any applicable
1765 federal tax law requirements.

1766 **SECTION 11.** Section 57-1-221, Mississippi Code of 1972, is
1767 amended as follows:

1768 57-1-221. (1) As used in this section:

1769 (a) "Approved business enterprise" means any project
1770 that:

1771 (i) Locates or expands in this state, including
1772 any federal Indian reservation located within the geographical
1773 boundary of this state, and creates a minimum of two hundred fifty
1774 (250) new, full-time jobs with a total capital investment in the
1775 state of a minimum of Thirty Million Dollars (\$30,000,000.00) in
1776 Tier 1 or Tier 2 counties;



1777 (ii) Locates or expands in this state, including
1778 any federal Indian reservation located within the geographical
1779 boundary of this state, and creates a minimum of one hundred fifty
1780 (150) new, full-time jobs with a total capital investment in the
1781 state of a minimum of Fifteen Million Dollars (\$15,000,000.00) in
1782 areas federally designated as low-income census tracts;

1783 (iii) Locates or expands in this state, including
1784 any federal Indian reservation located within the geographical
1785 boundary of this state, and creates a minimum of one thousand
1786 (1,000) new, full-time jobs;

1787 (iv) Is a manufacturer of high-end kitchen
1788 appliances having at least four hundred (400) employees working at
1789 its Mississippi facilities on January 1, 2015, and with a capital
1790 investment of at least Five Million Dollars (\$5,000,000.00) made
1791 after July 1, 2014, through four (4) years after July 1, 2015,
1792 that expands in this state, including any federal Indian
1793 reservation located within the geographical boundary of this
1794 state, and retains a minimum of four hundred (400) jobs; or

1795 (v) Locates or expands in this state, including
1796 any federal Indian reservation located within the geographical
1797 boundary of this state, with significant regional impact as
1798 determined by MDA.

1799 (b) "MDA" means the Mississippi Development Authority.

1800 (c) "Facility related to the project" means and
1801 includes any of the following, as they may pertain to the project:



1802 (i) Facilities to provide potable and industrial
1803 water supply systems, sewage and waste disposal systems and water,
1804 natural gas and electric transmission systems to the site of the
1805 project;

1806 (ii) Building facilities and equipment necessary
1807 to operate the facility;

1808 (iii) Rail lines;

1809 (iv) Airports, airfields, air terminals and port
1810 facilities;

1811 (v) Highways, streets and other roadways; and

1812 (vi) Fire protection facilities, equipment and
1813 elevated water tanks.

1814 (d) "Project" means any industrial, commercial,
1815 research and development, warehousing, distribution,
1816 transportation, processing, mining, United States government or
1817 tourism enterprise together with all real property required for
1818 construction, maintenance and operation of the enterprise that is
1819 approved by the MDA. The term "project" does not include any
1820 medical cannabis establishment as defined in the Mississippi
1821 Medical Cannabis Act.

1822 (2) (a) There is created a special fund in the State
1823 Treasury to be known as the Mississippi Industry Incentive
1824 Financing Revolving Fund which shall consist of monies from any
1825 source designated for deposit into the fund. Unexpended amounts
1826 remaining in the fund at the end of a fiscal year shall not lapse



1827 into the State General Fund, and any interest earned on amounts in
1828 the fund shall be deposited to the credit of the fund. Except as
1829 otherwise provided, monies in the fund shall be disbursed by the
1830 Mississippi Development Authority for the purposes authorized in
1831 subsection (3) of this section. The Mississippi Development
1832 Authority shall allocate and disburse Thirty Million Dollars
1833 (\$30,000,000.00) from the fund as a grant to Mississippi State
1834 University for the construction, furnishing and equipping of a
1835 high-performance computing data center that is home to federally
1836 designated centers of computing excellence. The disbursement of
1837 such funds shall not be subject to any requirements of this
1838 section relating to grants and loans made by the Mississippi
1839 Development Authority under this section. The Mississippi
1840 Development Authority shall allocate and disburse Three Million
1841 Dollars (\$3,000,000.00) from the fund as a grant to Delta Health
1842 System for capital costs related to hospital systems expansion.
1843 The disbursement of such funds shall not be subject to any
1844 requirements of this section relating to grants and loans made by
1845 the Mississippi Development Authority under this section. The
1846 Mississippi Development Authority shall disburse such funds to
1847 Delta Health System not later than thirty (30) days after April
1848 22, 2021.

1849 (b) Monies in the fund that are derived from the
1850 proceeds of general obligation bonds or provided by the
1851 Legislature may be used to reimburse reasonable actual and



1852 necessary costs incurred by the MDA for the administration of the
1853 various grant, loan and financial incentive programs administered
1854 by the MDA. An accounting of actual costs incurred for which
1855 reimbursement is sought shall be maintained by the MDA.
1856 Reimbursement of reasonable actual and necessary costs shall not
1857 exceed three percent (3%) of the proceeds of bonds issued or the
1858 monies provided by the Legislature. Reimbursements made under
1859 this subsection shall satisfy any applicable federal tax law
1860 requirements.

1861 (3) The MDA shall establish a program to make grants or
1862 loans from the Mississippi Industry Incentive Financing Revolving
1863 Fund to local governments, including, but not limited to,
1864 counties, municipalities, industrial development authorities and
1865 economic development districts, and approved business enterprises
1866 to construct or otherwise provide facilities related to the
1867 project. Local governments are authorized to accept grants and
1868 enter into loans authorized under the program, and to sell, lease
1869 or otherwise dispose of a project or any property related to the
1870 project in whole or in part.

1871 (4) (a) Except as otherwise provided in this section, any
1872 business enterprise or local government desiring a grant or loan
1873 under this section shall submit an application to the MDA which
1874 shall include, at a minimum:

1875 (i) Evidence that the business or industry meets
1876 the definition of an approved business enterprise;



1877 (ii) A description, including the cost, of the
1878 requested assistance;

1879 (iii) A description of the purpose for which the
1880 assistance is requested; and

1881 (iv) Any other information required by the MDA.

1882 (b) Except as otherwise provided in this section, the
1883 MDA shall require that binding commitments be entered into
1884 requiring that:

1885 (i) The minimum requirements of this section and
1886 such other requirements as the MDA considers proper shall be met;
1887 and

1888 (ii) If such requirements are not met, all or a
1889 portion of the funds provided by this section as determined by the
1890 MDA shall be repaid.

1891 (c) Upon receipt of the application from a business
1892 enterprise or local government for a grant or loan under this
1893 section, the MDA shall determine whether the enterprise meets the
1894 definition of an approved business enterprise and determine
1895 whether to provide the assistance requested in the form of a grant
1896 or a loan.

1897 (d) Except as otherwise provided in subsection (2) (a)
1898 of this section, the MDA shall have sole discretion in providing
1899 grants or loans under this section. The terms of a grant or loan
1900 provided under this section and the manner of repayment of any
1901 loan shall be within the discretion of the MDA. Repayments of



1902 loans made under this section shall be deposited to the credit of
1903 the Mississippi Industry Incentive Financing Revolving Fund until
1904 the uncommitted balance in the fund reaches Fifty Million Dollars
1905 (\$50,000,000.00). Once the uncommitted balance in the fund
1906 reaches Fifty Million Dollars (\$50,000,000.00), repayments of
1907 loans under this section shall be deposited to the credit of Fund
1908 No. 3951 in the State Treasury to pay debt service on bonds until
1909 such time as the uncommitted balance in the fund falls below Fifty
1910 Million Dollars (\$50,000,000.00).

1911 (e) The MDA shall notify the Chairman of the Senate
1912 Finance Committee and the Chairman of the House Ways and Means
1913 Committee of the approval of any grant or loan application thirty
1914 (30) days prior to the disbursement of any monies for the loan or
1915 grant from the Mississippi Industry Incentive Financing Revolving
1916 Fund. The notification shall identify the applicant and the
1917 purposes for which the loan or grant is made.

1918 (5) (a) Contracts, by local governments, including, but not
1919 limited to, design and construction contracts, for the
1920 acquisition, purchase, construction or installation of a project
1921 shall be exempt from the provisions of Section 31-7-13 if:

1922 (i) The MDA finds and records such finding on its
1923 minutes, that because of availability or the particular nature of
1924 a project, it would not be in the public interest or would less
1925 effectively achieve the purposes of this section to enter into
1926 such contracts on the basis of Section 31-7-13; and



1927 (ii) The approved business enterprise that is
1928 involved in the project concurs in such finding.

1929 (b) When the requirements of paragraph (a) of this
1930 subsection are met:

1931 (i) The requirements of Section 31-7-13 shall not
1932 apply to such contracts; and

1933 (ii) The contracts may be entered into on the
1934 basis of negotiation.

1935 (6) It is the policy of the MDA and the MDA is authorized to
1936 accommodate and support any enterprise that receives a loan under
1937 this section for a project defined in Section 17-25-23 that wishes
1938 to have a program of diversity in contracting, and/or that wishes
1939 to do business with or cause its prime contractor to do business
1940 with Mississippi companies, including those companies that are
1941 small business concerns owned and controlled by socially and
1942 economically disadvantaged individuals. The term "socially and
1943 economically disadvantaged individuals" shall have the meaning
1944 ascribed to such term under Section 8(d) of the Small Business Act
1945 (15 USCS 637(d)) and relevant subcontracting regulations
1946 promulgated pursuant thereto; except that women shall be presumed
1947 to be socially and economically disadvantaged individuals for the
1948 purposes of this subsection.

1949 (7) The MDA shall promulgate rules and regulations, in
1950 accordance with the Mississippi Administrative Procedures Law, for
1951 the implementation of this section.



1952 **SECTION 12.** Section 57-1-601, Mississippi Code of 1972, is
1953 amended as follows:

1954 57-1-601. (1) For the purposes of this section, the
1955 following words shall have the following meanings ascribed in this
1956 section, unless the context clearly otherwise requires:

1957 (a) "MDA" means the Mississippi Development Authority.

1958 (b) "Municipality" means any municipality with a
1959 population of less than fifteen thousand (15,000) according to the
1960 latest federal decennial census at the time the municipality
1961 submits an application to the MDA under this section.

1962 (c) "Revitalization zone" means an area in the
1963 municipality officially designated by ordinance or resolution of
1964 the governing authorities of the municipality as a revitalization
1965 zone and approved and certified by the MDA as meeting the
1966 requirements of this section.

1967 (2) (a) There is created in the State Treasury a special
1968 fund to be designated as the "Mississippi Main Street Investment
1969 Grant Fund" which shall consist of funds from any source
1970 designated for deposit into the fund. Unexpended amounts
1971 remaining in the fund at the end of a fiscal year shall not lapse
1972 into the State General Fund, and any interest earned on amounts in
1973 the fund shall be deposited to the credit of the fund. Monies in
1974 the fund shall be used by the MDA for the purposes authorized in
1975 subsection (3) of this section.



1976 (b) Monies in the fund which are derived from the
1977 proceeds of general obligation bonds or provided by the
1978 Legislature may be used to reimburse reasonable actual and
1979 necessary costs incurred by the MDA in providing grants under this
1980 section through the use of proceeds of such general obligation
1981 bonds. An accounting of actual costs incurred for which
1982 reimbursement is sought shall be maintained for the program.
1983 Reimbursement of reasonable actual and necessary costs for
1984 assistance shall not exceed three percent (3%) of the proceeds of
1985 bonds issued for such assistance or the monies provided by the
1986 Legislature. Reimbursements made under this subsection shall
1987 satisfy any applicable federal tax law requirements.

1988 (3) The MDA shall establish a program to make grants to a
1989 municipality to assist with maintaining and improving the
1990 viability of revitalization zones. The proceeds of a grant made
1991 to a municipality under this section may be used for maintaining
1992 and/or improving the viability of a revitalization zone through
1993 means deemed appropriate by the governing authorities of a
1994 municipality, including, but not limited to, making loans, grants
1995 and/or other forms of assistance to any person or public or
1996 private association or other entity for use for infrastructure
1997 projects, improvements to properties, signage and other purposes
1998 related to maintaining and/or improving the viability of the
1999 revitalization zone.



2000 (4) (a) If a municipality desires a grant under this
2001 section, the municipality shall submit an application to the MDA
2002 seeking (i) approval and certification of the proposed
2003 revitalization zone and (ii) a grant for the purposes authorized
2004 in this section. The application shall include, at a minimum:

2005 1. The name of the proposed revitalization
2006 zone, together with the words, "revitalization zone";

2007 2. A description of the revitalization zone
2008 by metes and bounds;

2009 3. A map showing the parcels of real property
2010 included in the revitalization zone and the present use of such
2011 parcels;

2012 4. A master plan for the revitalization zone
2013 that has been approved by sixty percent (60%) of the property
2014 owners within the zone at the time the municipality submits the
2015 application; and

2016 5. Any other information required by the MDA.
2017 The governing authorities of a municipality may designate the
2018 boundaries of a proposed revitalization zone by adoption of an
2019 ordinance or resolution that is spread upon its minutes and
2020 describes the boundaries of the zone.

2021 (b) The MDA shall review the application to confirm
2022 that the revitalization zone meets the requirements of this
2023 section. A revitalization zone may embrace two (2) or more
2024 separate parcels of real property, and such property may be



2025 publicly and/or privately owned. Each revitalization zone shall
2026 be of such size and form as to include all properties that, in the
2027 determination of the municipality and the MDA, constitute an
2028 integral part of the revitalization zone. If the MDA determines
2029 that the boundaries of the proposed revitalization zone exceed the
2030 area that is reasonably deemed to be integral to the
2031 revitalization zone, the MDA may reduce the boundaries of the
2032 proposed area. Upon the approval and selection of a municipal
2033 revitalization zone project, the MDA shall certify the
2034 revitalization zone.

2035 (5) The MDA shall have all powers necessary to implement and
2036 administer the program established under this section, and the MDA
2037 shall promulgate rules and regulations, in accordance with the
2038 Mississippi Administrative Procedures Law, necessary for the
2039 implementation of this section.

2040 **SECTION 13.** Section 65-1-183, Mississippi Code of 1972, is
2041 amended as follows:

2042 65-1-183. There is created in the State Treasury a special
2043 fund to be designated as the "2022 Infrastructure Match Fund,"
2044 which shall consist of funds made available by the Legislature in
2045 any manner and funds from any other source designated for deposit
2046 into such fund. The fund shall be maintained by the State
2047 Treasurer as a separate and special fund, separate and apart from
2048 the General Fund of the state. Unexpended amounts remaining in
2049 the fund at the end of a fiscal year shall not lapse into the



2050 State General Fund, and any investment earnings or interest earned
2051 on amounts in the fund shall be deposited to the credit of the
2052 fund. Monies in the fund shall be used by the Department of
2053 Transportation, upon appropriation by the Legislature, to provide
2054 for funds necessary to match projected federal funds available
2055 through the following federal fiscal year from the annual Federal
2056 Highway Administration appropriations and from the supplemental
2057 Infrastructure Investment and Jobs Act (IIJA) appropriations. The
2058 Department of Transportation is authorized to transfer funds from
2059 the 2022 Infrastructure Match Fund to the department's agency
2060 support fund subject to the following provisions: The total
2061 amount of all such transfers shall not exceed the amount
2062 appropriated by the Legislature from the 2022 Infrastructure Match
2063 Fund for the fiscal year in which the transfers are made, and
2064 those transfers shall not reduce the amount of the spending
2065 authority provided to the department by that appropriation. The
2066 department shall document those transfers through a reconciliation
2067 with the Department of Finance and Administration.

2068 **SECTION 14.** This act shall take effect and be in force from
2069 and after its passage.
