50 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI: 51 SECTION 1. Section 27-104-371, Mississippi Code of 1972, is 52 amended as follows:

53 27-104-371. (1) A special fund, to be designated as the "2022 Local Improvements Projects Fund," is created within the 54 55 State Treasury. The fund shall be maintained by the State Treasurer as a separate and special fund, separate and apart from 56 57 the General Fund of the state. Unexpended amounts remaining in 58 the fund at the end of a fiscal year shall not lapse into the 59 State General Fund, and any interest earned or investment earnings 60 on amounts in the fund shall be deposited into such fund.

61 (2) Monies deposited into the fund shall be disbursed by the
62 Department of Finance and Administration as follows:

(a) To the Department of Archives and History for the
