## HOUSE BILL NO. 1100

AN ACT TO PROHIBIT PUBLIC PRIMARY, SECONDARY AND CHARTER

2 SCHOOLS, AS WELL AS PUBLIC POSTSECONDARY EDUCATIONAL INSTITUTIONS, 3 STATE OFFICIALS AND EMPLOYEES OF STATE AGENCIES FROM USING STATE OR PUBLIC FUNDS TO TRAVEL TO OR ENGAGE IN BUSINESS WITH STATES 5 WHICH HAVE ENACTED DISCRIMINATORY RESTRICTIONS UPON ITS CITIZENS AND PUBLICLY FUNDED ENTITIES FROM TRAVELING TO OR DOING BUSINESS 6 7 WITH THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI DUE TO THE OPPOSING POSITIONS OF EACH RESPECTIVE STATE WITH REGARD TO THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI; TO 8 9 PROVIDE FOR EXCEPTIONS TO THE PROHIBITION; AND FOR RELATED 10 PURPOSES. BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI: 11 SECTION 1. (1) Effective immediately upon the passage of 12 13 this act, except as otherwise provided in subsection (2) of this section, no public primary or secondary school, including a public 14 15 charter school, which are actively engaged in extracurricular activities regulated by the Mississippi High School Activities 16 17 Association, nor any public postsecondary educational institution governed by the Board of Trustees of State Institutions of Higher 18 Learning or the Mississippi Community College Board through local 19 20 community college districts' boards of trustees, which are actively engaged in intercollegiate athletics subject to the rules 21 22 of the National Collegiate Athletic Association (NCAA), National ~ OFFICIAL ~ G1/2H. - 23 Junior College Athletic Association (NJCAA) or National
- 24 Association of Independent Association (NAIA), nor any state
- 25 official or public employees of state agencies shall expend any
- 26 public funds for the purpose of traveling to another state to
- 27 participate in any extracurricular or intercollegiate activities
- 28 sanctioned by the respective governing bodies for such activities
- 29 or engaging in business in another state if such state has enacted
- 30 discriminatory restrictions upon its citizens and publicly funded
- 31 entities from traveling to or doing business with the State of
- 32 Mississippi. Neither shall any public primary or secondary
- 33 school, including a public charter school, any public
- 34 postsecondary educational institution, or any state agency,
- 35 department or political subdivision thereof host any event in this
- 36 state that would require the participation of attendance by any
- 37 such entities from those restricted states.
- 38 (2) Subsection (1) of this section does not apply to travel
- 39 that is required for:
- 40 (a) Enforcement of this state's law;
- 41 (b) Litigation;
- 42 (c) Compliance with a contractual obligation incurred
- 43 before the effective date of this act; or
- (d) Compliance with a federal government request to
- 45 appear before a committee or tribunal.
- 46 **SECTION 2.** This act shall take effect and be in force from
- 47 and after its passage.

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ST: Reciprocity in travel; prohibit ability of publicly funded entities from traveling to or hosting entities from certain states.
