## HOUSE BILL NO. 1176 (As Passed the House)

AN ACT TO AMEND SECTION 37-19-7, MISSISSIPPI CODE OF 1972, TO CLARIFY THAT ONLY THOSE INDIVIDUALS WHO HAVE RECEIVED NATIONAL BOARD CERTIFICATION AND WHO ARE EMPLOYED BY A LOCAL SCHOOL DISTRICT TO PROVIDE SERVICES IN THE CAPACITY FOR WHICH THEY HAVE 5 RECEIVED NATIONAL CERTIFICATION SHALL BE ELIGIBLE FOR THE ANNUAL 6 SALARY SUPPLEMENT; TO INCLUDE LICENSED SCHOOL PSYCHOLOGISTS IN THE CATEGORY OF NATIONALLY CERTIFIED PROFESSIONALS WHO ARE ELIGIBLE TO 7 RECEIVE AN ANNUAL SALARY SUPPLEMENT; TO REMOVE ELIGIBILITY OF 8 9 INDIVIDUALS EMPLOYED BY THE STATE DEPARTMENT OF EDUCATION TO 10 RECEIVE THE ANNUAL SALARY SUPPLEMENT; TO INCLUDE SCHOOL NURSES, 11 CERTIFIED ACADEMIC LANGUAGE THERAPISTS AND LICENSED ATHLETIC 12 TRAINERS TO THE LIST OF NATIONALLY CERTIFIED EMPLOYEES WHO ARE 13 ELIGIBLE FOR REIMBURSEMENT FOR COMPLETION OF EACH COMPONENT OF THE NATIONAL CERTIFICATION PROCESS; AND FOR RELATED PURPOSES. 14 15 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI: **SECTION 1.** Section 37-19-7, Mississippi Code of 1972, is 16 17 amended as follows: 18 37-19-7. (1) The allowance in the Mississippi Adequate 19 Education Program for teachers' salaries in each public school district shall be determined and paid in accordance with the scale 20 for teachers' salaries as provided in this subsection. For 21 22 teachers holding the following types of licenses or the equivalent 23 as determined by the State Board of Education, and the following

24 number of years of teaching experience, the scale shall be as

It is the intent of the Legislature that any state funds made 65 66 available for salaries of licensed personnel in excess of the 67 funds paid for such salaries for the 1986-1987 school year shall be paid to licensed personnel pursuant to a personnel appraisal 68 69 and compensation system implemented by the State Board of 70 Education. The State Board of Education shall have the authority 71 to adopt and amend rules and regulations as are necessary to 72 establish, administer and maintain the system.

73 All teachers employed on a full-time basis shall be paid a 74 minimum salary in accordance with the above scale. However, no 75 school district shall receive any funds under this section for any 76 school year during which the local supplement paid to any individual teacher shall have been reduced to a sum less than that 77 78 paid to that individual teacher for performing the same duties 79 from local supplement during the immediately preceding school 80 The amount actually spent for the purposes of group health 81 and/or life insurance shall be considered as a part of the aggregate amount of local supplement but shall not be considered a 82 part of the amount of individual local supplement. 83 84 The level of professional training of each teacher to be used 85 in establishing the salary allotment for the teachers for each 86 year shall be determined by the type of valid teacher's license 87 issued to those teachers on or before October 1 of the current 88 school year. However, school districts are authorized, in their 89 discretion, to negotiate the salary levels applicable to licensed employees who are receiving retirement benefits from the 90 91 retirement system of another state, and the annual experience 92 increment provided above in Section 37-19-7 shall not be 93 applicable to any such retired certificated employee. 94 The following employees shall receive an annual 95 salary supplement in the amount of Six Thousand Dollars (\$6,000.00), plus fringe benefits, in addition to any other 96

compensation to which the employee may be entitled:

98	(i) Any licensed teacher who has met the
99	requirements and acquired a Master Teacher certificate from the
100	National Board for Professional Teaching Standards and who is
101	employed by a local school board * * * as a teacher and not as an
102	administrator. Such teacher shall submit documentation to the
103	State Department of Education that the certificate was received
104	prior to October 15 in order to be eligible for the full salary
105	supplement in the current school year, or the teacher shall submit
106	such documentation to the State Department of Education prior to
107	February 15 in order to be eligible for a prorated salary
108	supplement beginning with the second term of the school year.
109	(ii) A licensed nurse who has met the requirements
110	and acquired a certificate from the National Board for
111	Certification of School Nurses, Inc., and who is employed by a
112	local school board * * * as a school nurse and not as an
113	administrator. The licensed school nurse shall submit
114	documentation to the State Department of Education that the
115	certificate was received before October 15 in order to be eligible
116	for the full salary supplement in the current school year, or the
117	licensed school nurse shall submit the documentation to the State
118	Department of Education before February 15 in order to be eligible
119	for a prorated salary supplement beginning with the second term of
120	the school year.
121	(iii) Any licensed school counselor who has met

the requirements and acquired a National Certified School

123	Counselor (NCSC) endorsement from the National Board of Certified
124	Counselors and who is employed by a local school board * * * as a
125	counselor and not as an administrator. Such licensed school
126	counselor shall submit documentation to the State Department of
127	Education that the endorsement was received prior to October 15 in
128	order to be eligible for the full salary supplement in the current
129	school year, or the licensed school counselor shall submit such
130	documentation to the State Department of Education prior to
131	February 15 in order to be eligible for a prorated salary
132	supplement beginning with the second term of the school year.
133	However, any school counselor who started the National Board for
134	Professional Teaching Standards process for school counselors
135	between June 1, 2003, and June 30, 2004, and completes the
136	requirements and acquires the Master Teacher certificate shall be
137	entitled to the master teacher supplement, and those counselors
138	who complete the process shall be entitled to a one-time
139	reimbursement for the actual cost of the process as outlined in
140	paragraph (b) of this subsection.
141	(iv) Any licensed speech-language pathologist and
142	audiologist who has met the requirements and acquired a
143	Certificate of Clinical Competence from the American
144	Speech-Language-Hearing Association and any certified academic
145	language therapist (CALT) who has met the certification
146	requirements of the Academic Language Therapy Association and who
147	is employed by a local school board as a speech-language

148	pathologist or audiologist, licensed school psychologists or
149	certified academic language therapist and not as an administrator.
150	The licensed speech-language pathologist and audiologist and
151	certified academic language therapist shall submit documentation
152	to the State Department of Education that the certificate or
153	endorsement was received before October 15 in order to be eligible
154	for the full salary supplement in the current school year, or the
155	licensed speech-language pathologist and audiologist and certified
156	academic language therapist shall submit the documentation to the
157	State Department of Education before February 15 in order to be
158	eligible for a prorated salary supplement beginning with the
159	second term of the school year.
160	(v) Any licensed athletic trainer who has met the
161	requirements and acquired Board Certification for the Athletic
162	Trainer from the Board of Certification, Inc., and who is employed
163	by a local school board * * * as an athletic trainer and not as an
164	administrator. The licensed athletic trainer shall submit
165	documentation to the State Department of Education that the
166	certificate was received before October 15 in order to be eligible
167	for the full salary supplement in the current school year, or the
168	licensed athletic trainer shall submit the documentation to the
169	State Department of Education before February 15 in order to be
170	eligible for a prorated salary supplement beginning with the
171	second term of the school year.

172	(vi) Any licensed school psychologist who has met
173	the requirements and acquired certification as a Nationally
174	Certified School Psychologist (NCSP) from the National Association
175	of School Psychologists (NASP), and who is employed by a local
176	school board or the State Board of Education as a school
177	psychologist. The licensed school psychologist shall submit
178	documentation to the State Department of Education that the
179	certificate was received before October 15 in order to be eligible
180	for the full salary supplement in the current school year, or the
181	licensed school psychologist shall submit the documentation to the
182	State Department of Education before February 15 in order to be
183	eligible for a prorated salary supplement beginning with the
184	second term of the school year. The supplement authorized in this
185	subsection (2)(a) for licensed school psychologists under this
186	subparagraph (vi) shall be retroactive to July 1, 2022, for any
187	such eligible individuals employed by a local school board in such
188	capacity during the 2021-2022 school year.
189	(b) An employee shall be reimbursed for the actual cost
190	of completing each component of acquiring the certificate or
191	endorsement, excluding any costs incurred for postgraduate
192	courses, not to exceed Five Hundred Dollars (\$500.00) for each
193	component, not to exceed four (4) components, for a teacher,
194	school counselor * * * * _ speech-language pathologist and
195	audiologist, school nurse, certified academic language therapist
196	or athletic trainer, regardless of whether or not the process

resulted in the award of the certificate or endorsement. A local school district or any private individual or entity may pay the cost of completing the process of acquiring the certificate or endorsement for any employee of the school district described under paragraph (a), and the State Department of Education shall reimburse the school district for such cost, regardless of whether or not the process resulted in the award of the certificate or endorsement. If a private individual or entity has paid the cost of completing the process of acquiring the certificate or endorsement for an employee, the local school district may agree to directly reimburse the individual or entity for such cost on behalf of the employee.

(c) All salary supplements, fringe benefits and process reimbursement authorized under this subsection shall be paid directly by the State Department of Education to the local school district and shall be in addition to its adequate education program allotments and not a part thereof in accordance with regulations promulgated by the State Board of Education. Local school districts shall not reduce the local supplement paid to any employee receiving such salary supplement, and the employee shall receive any local supplement to which employees with similar training and experience otherwise are entitled. However, an educational employee shall receive the salary supplement in the amount of Six Thousand Dollars (\$6,000.00) for only one (1) of the qualifying certifications authorized under paragraph (a) of this

- 223 annual salary supplement under the provisions of this subsection
- 224 to any one (1) individual employee holding multiple qualifying
- 225 national certifications.
- 226 (d) If an employee for whom such cost has been paid, in
- 227 full or in part, by a local school district or private individual
- 228 or entity fails to complete the certification or endorsement
- 229 process, the employee shall be liable to the school district or
- 230 individual or entity for all amounts paid by the school district
- 231 or individual or entity on behalf of that employee toward his or
- 232 her certificate or endorsement.
- 233 (3) The following employees shall receive an annual salary
- 234 supplement in the amount of Four Thousand Dollars (\$4,000.00),
- 235 plus fringe benefits, in addition to any other compensation to
- 236 which the employee may be entitled:
- 237 Effective July 1, 2016, if funds are available for that
- 238 purpose, any licensed teacher who has met the requirements and
- 239 acquired a Master Teacher Certificate from the National Board for
- 240 Professional Teaching Standards and who is employed in a public
- 241 school district located in one (1) of the following counties:
- 242 Claiborne, Adams, Jefferson, Wilkinson, Amite, Bolivar, Coahoma,
- 243 Leflore, Quitman, Sharkey, Issaquena, Sunflower, Washington,
- 244 Holmes, Yazoo and Tallahatchie. The salary supplement awarded
- 245 under the provisions of this subsection (3) shall be in addition

to the salary supplement awarded under the provisions of subsection (2) of this section.

Teachers who meet the qualifications for a salary supplement under this subsection (3) who are assigned for less than one (1) full year or less than full time for the school year shall receive the salary supplement in a prorated manner, with the portion of the teacher's assignment to the critical geographic area to be determined as of June 15th of the school year.

- (4) (a) This section shall be known and may be cited as the "Mississippi Performance-Based Pay (MPBP)" plan. In addition to the minimum base pay described in this section, only after full funding of MAEP and if funds are available for that purpose, the State of Mississippi may provide monies from state funds to school districts for the purposes of rewarding licensed teachers, administrators and nonlicensed personnel at individual schools showing improvement in student test scores. The MPBP plan shall be developed by the State Department of Education based on the following criteria:
- (i) It is the express intent of this legislation
  that the MPBP plan shall utilize only existing standards of
  accreditation and assessment as established by the State Board of
  Education.
- 268 (ii) To ensure that all of Mississippi's teachers,
  269 administrators and nonlicensed personnel at all schools have equal
  270 access to the monies set aside in this section, the MPBP program

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271 shall be designed to calculate each school's performance as 272 determined by the school's increase in scores from the prior 273 school year. The MPBP program shall be based on a standardized 274 scores rating where all levels of schools can be judged in a 275 statistically fair and reasonable way upon implementation. At the 276 end of each year, after all student achievement scores have been 277 standardized, the State Department of Education shall implement 278 the MPBP plan.

(iii) To ensure all teachers cooperate in the spirit of teamwork, individual schools shall submit a plan to the local school district to be approved before the beginning of each school year beginning July 1, 2008. The plan shall include, but not be limited to, how all teachers, regardless of subject area, and administrators will be responsible for improving student achievement for their individual school.

- (b) The State Board of Education shall develop the processes and procedures for designating schools eligible to participate in the MPBP. State assessment results, growth in student achievement at individual schools and other measures deemed appropriate in designating successful student achievement shall be used in establishing MPBP criteria.
- 292 (5) (a) If funds are available for that purpose, each
  293 school in Mississippi shall have mentor teachers, as defined by
  294 Sections 37-9-201 through 37-9-213, who shall receive additional
  295 base compensation provided for by the State Legislature in the

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296	amount of One Thousand Dollars (\$1,000.00) per each beginning
297	teacher that is being mentored. The additional state compensation
298	shall be limited to those mentor teachers that provide mentoring
299	services to beginning teachers. For the purposes of such funding,
300	a beginning teacher shall be defined as any teacher in any school
301	in Mississippi that has less than one (1) year of classroom
302	experience teaching in a public school. For the purposes of such
303	funding, no full-time academic teacher shall mentor more than two
304	(2) beginning teachers.

- 305 (b) To be eligible for this state funding, the 306 individual school must have a classroom management program 307 approved by the local school board.
- 308 (6) Effective with the 2014-2015 school year, the school 309 districts participating in the Pilot Performance-Based 310 Compensation System pursuant to Section 37-19-9 may award 311 additional teacher and administrator pay based thereon.
- 312 **SECTION 2.** This act shall take effect and be in force from and after July 1, 2023.
