COMMITTEE SUBSTITUTE FOR HOUSE BILL NO. 1207

AN ACT TO CREATE THE PARAMEDICS RECRUITMENT AND RETENTION SCHOLARSHIP GRANT PROGRAM; TO PROVIDE THAT THE PROGRAM SHALL BE USED BY THE OFFICE OF WORKFORCE DEVELOPMENT, WITH THE MISSISSIPPI DEPARTMENT OF EMPLOYMENT SECURITY ACTING AS THE FISCAL AGENT, FOR 5 THE PURPOSE OF PROVIDING FUNDING FOR GRANTS TO COVER THE FULL COST 6 OF TUITION, FEES, BOOKS AND ANY REQUIRED UNIFORMS FOR QUALIFIED 7 APPLICANTS TO ATTEND AN ACCREDITED PARAMEDIC PROGRAM AND TO 8 REIMBURSE THE COST OF A QUALIFIED APPLICANT'S FEE FOR THE 9 SUCCESSFUL COMPLETION OF THE NATIONAL REGISTRY PARAMEDIC COGNITIVE 10 AND PSYCHOMOTOR EXAMINATIONS; TO PROVIDE HOW AN APPLICANT MAY 11 QUALIFY FOR A GRANT; TO PROVIDE THAT THE RECIPIENT OF A GRANT 12 SHALL COMMIT TO SERVING AS A PARAMEDIC FOR THREE CONTINUOUS YEARS 13 IN THE STATE; TO PROVIDE THE REPORTING REQUIREMENTS; AND FOR 14 RELATED PURPOSES. 15 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI: SECTION 1. This act shall be known and cited as the 16 17 "Paramedics Recruitment and Retention Scholarship Grant Program Act." 18 19 **SECTION 2.** (1) The Legislature finds the following: 20 (a) The public health crisis related to COVID-19 21 resulted in a general disruption in the Mississippi economy and

workforce, particularly in the healthcare industry.

23	(b)	COVID-19	and	the	closing	of	or	reduction	in

- 24 services at rural hospitals created an unprecedented demand on
- 25 emergency medical response providers.
- 26 (c) Consequently, the number of paramedics decreased in
- 27 the State of Mississippi by approximately nineteen percent (19%).
- 28 (d) The lack of paramedics directly impacts all
- 29 Mississippians ability to rely on quality emergency care.
- 30 (2) Therefore, the intent of the Legislature is:
- 31 (a) To provide funding to the Office of Workforce
- 32 Development to establish a grant program for the purposes outlined
- 33 herein.
- 34 (b) To provide funding for grants to cover the full
- 35 cost of tuition, fees, books and any required uniforms for
- 36 qualified applicants to attend an accredited paramedic program.
- 37 (c) To provide funding for grants to reimburse the cost
- 38 of a qualified applicant's fee for the successful completion of
- 39 the National Registry Paramedic cognitive and psychomotor
- 40 examinations.
- 41 (d) To gauge the effectiveness of this program by
- 42 gathering data related to the participation and employment
- 43 outcomes in order to replicate successful efforts in future
- 44 workforce development programs.
- 45 **SECTION 3.** (1) There is established the Paramedics
- 46 Recruitment and Retention Scholarship Grant Program ("the
- 47 program"). The grant program shall be used by the Office of

- 48 Workforce Development, with the Mississippi Department of
- 49 Employment Security acting as the fiscal agent, for the purpose of
- 50 providing funding for grants to cover the full cost of tuition,
- 51 fees, books and any required uniforms for qualified applicants to
- 52 attend an accredited paramedic program and to reimburse the cost
- of a qualified applicant's fee for the successful completion of
- 54 the National Registry Paramedic cognitive and psychomotor
- 55 examinations. The grant program shall be funded from monies
- 56 appropriated by the Legislature for that purpose.
- 57 (2) For the purposes of this act, a "paramedic" means a
- 58 certified healthcare professional who specializes in providing
- 59 emergency medical treatment to people who are injured or ill,
- 60 typically in a setting outside of a hospital.
- 61 (3) The Office of Workforce Development shall prescribe the
- 62 terms and conditions of grants awarded under the program. To
- 63 qualify for a grant under this program, an applicant must:
- 64 (a) Be a certified Emergency Medical Technician (EMT);
- (b) Have the necessary requisites for an accredited
- 66 paramedic program;
- 67 (c) Commit to locate in the State of Mississippi for a
- 68 minimum of three (3) years; and
- 69 (d) Meet any other conditions for receipt as prescribed
- 70 by the Office of Workforce Development.

71	(4)	The	Office	of	Workforce	Development	may	use	а	maximum	of

72 five percent (5%) of funds appropriated for the program for the

73 administration of the program.

74 **SECTION 4.** The office shall enter into a grant contract

75 agreement with each recipient of a grant under the program that

76 incorporates the following obligations and conditions:

77 (a) The recipient of a grant shall commit to serving as

a paramedic for three (3) continuous years in the State of

79 Mississippi;

80 (b) If any recipient of a grant under the program does

81 not engage in serving as a paramedic in accordance with the terms

of this act, the recipient shall be obligated to repay the grant

83 amounts received, together with interest thereon at the maximum

84 rate allowed by Mississippi law or the federal discount rate plus

85 five percent (5%) per year, whichever is less, the interest to

86 accrue from the date that each payment of funds was received by

87 the recipient;

88 (c) No interest shall accrue and there shall be no

obligation to repay the principal sums accrued during any one (1)

period of time that the recipient involuntarily serves on active

91 duty in the United States Armed Forces; and

92 (d) Repayment of the principal with interest shall be

93 due and payable in full immediately on the occurrence of either of

94 the following events:

95	(i) Failure to remain in the State of Mississippi
96	for three (3) continuous years for any reason other than temporary
97	personal illness; or
98	(ii) Failure to serve as a paramedic on a
99	regularly sustained basis as provided in the eligibility
100	requirements of Section 3 of this act.
101	SECTION 5. The Office of Workforce Development shall submit
102	an annual report on the grant program to the Governor, the
103	Lieutenant Governor, the Speaker of the House of Representatives,
104	the Chair of the House Workforce Development Committee and the
105	Chair of the Senate Economic and Workforce Development Committee.
106	The report shall contain a detailed explanation of how the funds
107	appropriated for the program were awarded and how many paramedics
108	have participated in the grant program and their employment
109	outcomes.
110	SECTION 6. This act shall take effect and be in force from
111	and after July 1, 2023, and shall stand repealed on June 30, 2023.
