HOUSE BILL NO. 1212

AN ACT TO AMEND SECTION 43-1-2, MISSISSIPPI CODE OF 1972, TO CREATE A BOARD OF DIRECTORS FOR THE DEPARTMENT OF HUMAN SERVICES; TO PROVIDE THE MAKEUP OF THE BOARD; TO PROVIDE THAT THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS SHALL ASSIST AND OVERSEE THE EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR IN 5 GOVERNING THE DEPARTMENT; TO REQUIRE THE EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR MEET 6 WITH THE JOINT OVERSIGHT COMMITTEE OF THE DEPARTMENT AT ALL OF ITS 7 MEETINGS AND PROVIDE SUCH INFORMATION AS REQUESTED AND ANSWER SUCH QUESTIONS AS PRESENTED BY THE COMMITTEE ABOUT THE DEPARTMENT; TO 8 9 EXTEND THE DATE OF THE REPEALER ON THIS SECTION; AND FOR RELATED 10 PURPOSES.

- BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI:
- 12 **SECTION 1.** Section 43-1-2, Mississippi Code of 1972, is
- 13 amended as follows:
- 14 43-1-2. (1) There is created the Mississippi Department of
- 15 Human Services, whose offices shall be located in Jackson,
- 16 Mississippi, and which shall be under the policy direction of the
- 17 Governor.
- 18 (2) The chief administrative officer of the department shall
- 19 be the Executive Director of Human Services. The Governor shall
- 20 appoint the Executive Director of Human Services with the advice
- 21 and consent of the Senate, and he or she shall serve at the will
- 22 and pleasure of the Governor, and until his or her successor is

- 23 appointed and qualified. The Executive Director of Human Services
- 24 shall possess the following qualifications:
- 25 (a) A bachelor's degree from an accredited institution
- 26 of higher learning and ten (10) years' experience in management,
- 27 public administration, finance or accounting; or
- 28 (b) A master's or doctoral degree from an accredited
- 29 institution of higher learning and five (5) years' experience in
- 30 management, public administration, finance or accounting.
- 31 Those qualifications shall be certified by the State
- 32 Personnel Board.
- 33 (3) (a) There shall be a Joint Oversight Committee of the
- 34 Department of Human Services composed of the respective Chairmen
- 35 of the Senate Public Health and Welfare Committee, the Senate
- 36 Appropriations Committee, the House Public Health and Human
- 37 Services Committee and the House Appropriations Committee, three
- 38 (3) members of the Senate appointed by the Lieutenant Governor to
- 39 serve at the will and pleasure of the Lieutenant Governor, and
- 40 three (3) members of the House of Representatives appointed by the
- 41 Speaker of the House to serve at the will and pleasure of the
- 42 Speaker. The chairmanship of the committee shall alternate for
- 43 twelve-month periods between the Senate members and the House
- 44 members, on May 1 of each year, with the Chairman of the Senate
- 45 Public Health and Welfare Committee serving as chairman beginning
- 46 in even-numbered years, and the Chairman of the House Public

- Health and Human Services Committee serving as chairman beginning in odd-numbered years.
- 49 (b) The committee shall meet once each quarter, * * *
- 50 <u>and</u> upon the call of the chairman at such <u>additional</u> times as he
- or she deems necessary or advisable * * *. At all such meetings,
- 52 the Executive Director of Human Services shall meet with the
- 53 committee and provide such information as requested and answer
- 54 such questions as presented by the committee about the operation
- of the department, the programs of the department, the budget of
- 56 the department, and the expenditures of the department. The
- 57 committee may make recommendations to the Legislature pertaining
- 58 to any matter within the jurisdiction of the * * * Department of
- 59 Human Services. The appointing authorities may designate an
- 60 alternate member from their respective houses to serve when the
- 61 regular designee is unable to attend such meetings of the
- 62 oversight committee.
- 63 (c) For attending meetings of the oversight committee,
- 64 such legislators shall receive per diem and expenses which shall
- 65 be paid from the contingent expense funds of their respective
- 66 houses in the same amounts as provided for committee meetings when
- 67 the Legislature is not in session; however, no per diem and
- 68 expenses for attending meetings of the committee will be paid
- 69 while the Legislature is in session. No per diem and expenses
- 70 will be paid except for attending meetings of the oversight

- 71 committee without prior approval of the proper committee in their 72 respective houses.
- 73 (4) (a) From and after July 1, 2023, there is created the
- 74 board of directors of the Department of Human Services, which
- 75 shall consist of four (4) persons appointed by the Governor, and
- 76 three (3) persons appointed by the Lieutenant Governor, each with
- 77 the advice and consent of the Senate, and each of whom shall be a
- 78 qualified elector of the State of Mississippi. Notwithstanding
- 79 any other provision of law to the contrary, the board of directors
- 80 of the Department of Human Services shall assist and oversee the
- 81 Executive Director of Human Services in governing the department,
- 82 and the executive director shall consult with the board of
- 83 directors before making any major decisions affecting any program
- 84 of the department or any policy of the department.
- (b) Initial appointments shall be made by August 1,
- 86 2023. The Governor shall make initial appointments of two (2)
- 87 members for two (2) years, one (1) member for three (3) years, and
- 88 one (1) member for four (4) years to be designated at the time of
- 89 appointment. The Lieutenant Governor shall make initial
- 90 appointments of one (1) member for two (2) years, one (1) member
- 91 for three (3) years, and one (1) member for four (4) years to be
- 92 designated at the time of appointment. Thereafter, the terms of
- 93 the members shall be for four (4) years and until their successors
- 94 are appointed and qualified. In the event of a vacancy during the

95	term of office of an incumbent, the appointing authority shall
96	fill such vacancy for the unexpired portion of the term.
97	(c) The board of directors shall organize by selecting
98	annually from its members a chair and a vice chair, and may do all
99	things as necessary for carrying out the provisions of this
100	chapter and the powers and duties of the department under the
101	provisions of law. Each member of the board shall receive a per
102	diem as provided in Section 25-3-69, plus travel and reasonable
103	and necessary expenses incidental to the attendance at each
104	meeting as provided in Section 25-3-41, including mileage.
105	(* * \star 5) The Department of Human Services shall provide the
106	services authorized by law to every individual determined to be
107	eligible therefor, and in carrying out the purposes of the
108	department, the executive director is authorized:
109	(a) To formulate the policy of the department regarding
110	human services within the jurisdiction of the department;
111	(b) To adopt, modify, repeal and promulgate, after due
112	notice and hearing, and where not otherwise prohibited by federal
113	or state law, to make exceptions to and grant exemptions and
114	variances from, and to enforce rules and regulations implementing
115	or effectuating the powers and duties of the department under any

and all statutes within the department's jurisdiction, all of

which shall be binding upon the county departments of human

services;

119	(c) To apply for, receive and expend any federal or
120	state funds or contributions, gifts, devises, bequests or funds
121	from any other source;
122	(d) Except as limited by Section 43-1-3, to enter into
123	and execute contracts, grants and cooperative agreements with any
124	federal or state agency or subdivision thereof, or any public or
125	private institution located inside or outside the State of
126	Mississippi, or any person, corporation or association in
127	connection with carrying out the programs of the department; and
128	(e) To discharge such other duties, responsibilities
129	and powers as are necessary to implement the programs of the
130	department.
131	(* * \star <u>6</u>) The executive director shall establish the
132	organizational structure of the Mississippi Department of Human
133	Services, which shall include the creation of any units necessary
134	to implement the duties assigned to the department and consistent
135	with specific requirements of law, including, but not limited to:
136	(a) * * * Office of Youth Services;
137	(* * * <u>b</u>) Office of Economic Assistance;
138	(* * \star <u>c</u>) Office of Child Support Enforcement; or
139	(* * $\star\underline{d}$) Office of Field Operations to administer any
140	state or county level programs under the purview of the
141	Mississippi Department of Human Services, with the exception of
142	programs * * * that fall under * * * paragraph (a) * * * of this

subsection.

144	(* * $\frac{*}{2}$) The Executive Director of Human Services shall
145	appoint heads of offices, bureaus and divisions, as defined in
146	Section 7-17-11, who shall serve at the pleasure of the executive
147	director. The salary and compensation of such office, bureau and
148	division heads shall be subject to the rules and regulations
149	adopted and promulgated by the State Personnel Board as created
150	under Section 25-9-101 et seq. The executive director shall have
151	the authority to organize offices as deemed appropriate to carry
152	out the responsibilities of the department. The organization
153	charts of the department shall be presented annually with the
154	budget request of the Governor for review by the Legislature.
155	(* * \star \star 8) This section shall stand repealed on July 1, * \star *
156	<u>2026</u> .
157	SECTION 2. This act shall take effect and be in force from

and after July 1, 2023.
