AN ACT TO AMEND SECTION 77-13-3, MISSISSIPPI CODE OF 1972, TO DEFINE THE TERM "IMPENDING EMERGENCY"; TO AMEND SECTION 77-13-5, MISSISSIPPI CODE OF 1972, TO EXTEND THE PRE-EXCAVATION ADVANCE NOTIFICATION PERIOD FROM TWO WORKING DAYS TO THREE WORKING DAYS; 5 TO REQUIRE EXCAVATORS TO PROVIDE ADVANCE NOTICE OF THE COMMENCEMENT, EXTENT, LOCATION AND DURATION OF THE EXCAVATION WORK 7 TO MISSISSIPPI 811, INCORPORATED FOR EXCAVATIONS REQUIRED DUE TO AN IMPENDING EMERGENCY, THAT INCLUDES AN EXCAVATION START TIME AT 8 9 LEAST TWELVE HOURS PRIOR TO EXCAVATION; TO REQUIRE EXCAVATORS TO PROVIDE CONTACT INFORMATION FOR A PERSON READILY AVAILABLE TO 10 11 DISCUSS THE IMPENDING EMERGENCY EXCAVATION WITH OPERATORS; TO 12 INCREASE THE DAYS THAT THE PERSON RESPONSIBLE FOR THE EXCAVATION PROJECT IS REQUIRED TO RENEW NOTIFICATION WITH MISSISSIPPI 811, INCORPORATED, FROM AT LEAST TWO DAYS AND NOT MORE THAN THREE DAYS, 14 1.5 TO AT LEAST THREE DAYS AND NOT MORE THAN FOUR DAYS PRIOR TO THE 16 NOTIFICATION EXPIRATION DATE; TO AMEND SECTION 77-13-9, 17 MISSISSIPPI CODE OF 1972, TO INCREASE THE DAYS FROM TWO DAYS TO 18 THREE DAYS THAT A PERSON OWNING OR OPERATING UNDERGROUND UTILITY 19 LINES OR UNDERGROUND FACILITIES SHALL MAKE AN INVESTIGATION AND 20 REPORT THROUGH THE USE OF THE PRIS THE STATUS OF THE WORK 21 PERFORMED FROM THE TIME NOTICE IS PROVIDED TO MISSISSIPPI 811; TO 22 DECREASE THE HOURS FROM FOUR HOURS TO TWO HOURS THAT OPERATORS 23 MUST CONTACT THE EXCAVATOR TO INFORM HIM OR HER OF ANY KNOWN 24 UNDERGROUND FACILITIES AT THE SITE OF THE EXCAVATION; TO REQUIRE 25 THAT A PERSON OWNING OR OPERATING UNDERGROUND UTILITY LINES OR 26 UNDERGROUND FACILITIES SHALL, UPON RECEIVING ADVANCE NOTICE OF THE 27 COMMENCEMENT OF IMPENDING EMERGENCY EXCAVATION MAKE AN 28 INVESTIGATION AND REPORT THROUGH PRIS THE STATUS OF THE WORK 29 PERFORMED, PRIOR TO THE NOTICED TIME OF EXCAVATION PROVIDED TO 30 MISSISSIPPI 811, INCORPORATED, AND EITHER MARK THE APPROXIMATE 31 LOCATION OF UNDERGROUND UTILITY LINES AND UNDERGROUND FACILITIES 32 IN OR NEAR THE AREA OF THE EXCAVATION, OR ADVISE THROUGH PRIS THAT 33 IT HAS NO UNDERGROUND UTILITY LINES OR UNDERGROUND FACILITIES IN 34 THE EXCAVATION AREA; TO AMEND SECTION 77-13-11, MISSISSIPPI CODE

- 35 OF 1972, TO PROVIDE THAT ANY MISREPRESENTATION OF AN EMERGENCY
- 36 EXCAVATION OR OF AN IMPENDING EMERGENCY CONSTITUTES A VIOLATION OF
- 37 THIS ACT; TO BRING FORWARD SECTION 77-13-7, MISSISSIPPI CODE OF
- 38 1972, WHICH RELATES TO DAMAGE TO UNDERGROUND UTILITY LINES, FOR
- 39 PURPOSES OF POSSIBLE AMENDMENT; AND FOR RELATED PURPOSES.
- 40 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI:
- 41 **SECTION 1.** Section 77-13-3, Mississippi Code of 1972, is
- 42 amended as follows:
- 43 77-13-3. The words defined in this section shall have the
- 44 following meanings when found in this chapter:
- 45 (a) "Abandoned facility" means any underground utility
- 46 line or underground utility facilities no longer used in the
- 47 conduct of the owner/operator's business and are not intended to
- 48 be used in the future.
- 49 (b) "Approximate location of underground utility lines
- 50 or underground facilities" means information about an operator's
- 51 underground utility lines or underground facilities which is
- 52 provided to a person by an operator and must be accurate within
- 53 eighteen (18) inches measured horizontally from the outside edge
- 54 of each side of such operator's facility, or a strip of land
- 55 eighteen (18) inches either side of the operator's field mark, or
- 56 the marked width of the facility or line plus eighteen (18) inches
- 57 on each side of the marked width of the facility or line.

- 58 (c) "Board" means the Underground Facilities Damage
- 59 Prevention Board, created by Section 77-13-29.
- (d) "Calendar day" means a twenty-four-hour period.
- 61 (e) "Commission" means the Mississippi Public Service
- 62 Commission.

- 63 "Damage" means the substantial weakening of 64 structural or lateral support of underground utility lines and underground facilities, penetration or destruction of any 65 protective coating, housing or other protective devices of an 66 67 underground utility line or underground facility, and the partial 68 or complete severance of any underground utility line or 69 underground facility, but does not include any operator's 70 abandoned facility.
- 71 "Design Information Request" means a notification (a) 72 made to Mississippi 811, Incorporated, by a person providing 73 professional services and making a request in preparation for 74 bidding, preconstruction engineering, or other advance planning 75 efforts that do not involve excavation. A design information 76 services request may not be used for excavation purposes.
- 77 "Emergency excavation" means excavation at times of 78 emergency involving imminent danger to life, health or property or 79 a customer service outage.
- "Excavate or excavation" means any operation in 80 (i) 81 which earth, rock or other material or mass of material on or 82 below the ground is moved or otherwise displaced by any means, 83 (i) the tilling of the soil less than twenty-four (24) 84 inches in depth for agricultural purposes; or (ii) an operation in 85 which earth, rock or other material or mass of material on or below the ground is moved or otherwise displaced to a depth of 86 87 less than twelve (12) inches on private property by the property

88	owner without the use of mechanical excavating equipment; or (iii)
89	an operation in which earth, rock or other material or mass of
90	material on or below the ground is moved or otherwise displaced
91	without the use of mechanical excavating equipment to a depth of
92	less than twelve (12) inches on private property by an excavator
93	who is not the property owner, except when such excavation is in a
94	clearly marked underground facility right-of-way; or (iv) routine
95	railroad maintenance activities conducted within the track
96	structure, drainage ditches, or within the railroad right-of-way a
97	distance not to exceed thirty (30) feet from the outside rail of
98	the outermost track or tracks, provided this work is performed by
99	railroad employees or railroad contractors and is carried out with
100	reasonable care so as to protect any underground facilities
101	properly installed in the railroad right-of-way by agreement with
102	the railroad; or (v) routine activities of a cemetery, provided
103	that for any cemetery that begins or expands after July 1, 2015,
104	such activities occur only after initial notice is provided to
105	Mississippi 811, Incorporated, and all affected operators have
106	advised that there are no underground facilities within the
107	boundaries of the subject cemetery; or (vi) routine maintenance
108	activities carried out by or for those responsible for publicly
109	maintained roadways and rights-of-way, provided that the
110	activities occur entirely within the public right-of-way and do
111	not penetrate the earth to a depth of more than twelve (12) inches
112	and are carried out with reasonable care so as to protect any

113 underground facilities placed in the right-of-way. Routine 114 maintenance activities shall be more specifically described in the rules and regulations adopted by the board; or (vii) the driving 115 of wooden stakes by use of hand tools which do not penetrate the 116 117 earth to a depth of not more than six (6) inches. The term 118 "excavate" shall include, but not be limited to, the operations of demolition, blasting, grading, land leveling, trenching, digging, 119 120 ditching, drilling, augering, tunneling, scraping, cable or pipe plowing, driving, jacking, wrecking, razing, rending, moving or 121 122 removing any structure or other material or mass of material on or 123 below the ground.

- 124 (j) "Excavator" means any person who engages directly
  125 in excavation.
- 126 "Mark" means the use of stakes, paint or other (k) 127 clearly identifiable materials to show the field location of 128 underground facilities in accordance with the current color code 129 standard of the American Public Works Association, or the uncovering or exposing of underground facilities so that the 130 131 excavator may readily see the location of same, or the pointing 132 out to the excavator of certain aboveground facilities such as, 133 but not limited to, manhole covers, valve boxes and pipe and cable 134 risers, which indicate the location of underground facilities.
- (1) "Mechanical excavating equipment" means all
  equipment powered by any motor, engine, or hydraulic or pneumatic
  device used for excavating and shall include, but not be limited

- 138 to, trenchers, bulldozers, backhoes, power shovels, scrapers,
- 139 draglines, clam shells, augers, drills, cable and pipe plows and
- 140 other plowing-in or pulling-in equipment.
- 141 (m) "Mississippi 811, Incorporated" means a nonprofit
- 142 corporation organized under the laws of the State of Mississippi
- 143 that provides a service through which a person shall notify the
- 144 operator(s) of underground facilities of plans to excavate and
- 145 request marking of facilities.
- 146 (n) "Mississippi One-Call System, Incorporated" means
- 147 "Mississippi 811, Incorporated" Whenever the term "Mississippi
- 148 One-Call System, Incorporated" appears in this chapter, the term
- 149 shall mean "Mississippi 811, Incorporated"
- 150 (o) "Operator" means any person who owns or operates a
- 151 utility. However, the term "operator" shall not include any
- 152 railroad or the Mississippi Department of Transportation.
- 153 (p) "Person" means any individual, firm, partnership,
- 154 association, trustee, receiver, assignee, corporation, entity,
- 155 limited liability company, utility, joint venture, municipality,
- 156 state governmental unit, subdivision or instrumentality of the
- 157 state, or any legal representative thereof.
- 158 (q) "Pipeline Safety Division" means the Pipeline
- 159 Safety Division of the Public Service Commission.
- 160 (r) "Positive Response Information System" or "PRIS"
- 161 means an automated information system operated and maintained by
- 162 Mississippi 811, Incorporated, that allows excavators, locators,

- 163 facility owners or operators, and other affected parties to enter 164 and/or determine the status of a locate request.
- 165 (s) "Underground facility" means any underground
  166 utility lines and other items which shall be buried or placed
- 167 below ground or submerged for use in connection with underground
- 168 utility lines and including, but not be limited to, pipes, sewers,
- 169 conduits, cables, valves, lines, wires, manholes, vaults,
- 170 attachments and those portions of poles below the ground.
- 171 (t) "Underground utility lines" means underground or
- 172 buried cable, conduit pipes and related facilities for
- 173 transportation and delivery of electricity, telecommunications
- 174 (including fiber optics), water, sewage, gas, mixtures of gases,
- 175 petroleum, petroleum products or hazardous, flammable, toxic or
- 176 corrosive liquids.
- 177 (u) "Utility" means any person who supplies,
- 178 distributes or transports by means of underground utility lines or
- 179 underground facilities any of the following materials or services:
- 180 gas, mixture of gases, petroleum, petroleum products or hazardous,
- 181 toxic, flammable or corrosive liquids, electricity,
- 182 telecommunications (including fiber optics), sewage, drainage,
- 183 water, steam or other substances.
- 184 (v) "Working day" means a twenty-four-hour period
- 185 commencing from the time the locate request is processed or
- 186 entered into the system by Mississippi 811, Incorporated, in

187	accordance	with	this	chapter,	excluding	Saturdays,	Sundays	and
188	legal holid	days.

"Impending Emergency" means circumstances potentially

- 194 **SECTION 2.** Section 77-13-5, Mississippi Code of 1972, is 195 amended as follows:
- 77-13-5. (1) In addition to complying with all other
  applicable regulations and requirements of federal, state, county
  and municipal authorities, no person shall engage in excavation of
  any kind, before meeting the notification requirements of this
  chapter. Under this chapter the excavator shall:
- 201 (a) Inform himself/herself of the presence and location 202 of any underground utility lines and underground facilities in or 203 near the area where excavation is to be conducted;
- 204 Plan and conduct the excavation to avoid or (b) 205 minimize interference with or damage to underground utility lines 206 and underground facilities in or near the excavation area; 207 maintain a clearance between any underground utility line or 208 underground facility and the cutting edge or point of any mechanical excavating equipment, taking into account the known 209 210 limit of control of such cutting edge or point, as may be 211 reasonably necessary to avoid damage to such facility; and provide

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212	such support for underground utility lines or underground
213	facilities in and near the excavation area, including during any
214	backfilling operations, as may be reasonably necessary for the
215	protection of such facilities.
216	(c) Except as provided in Section 77-13-11, before
217	beginning any excavation, other than an impending emergency as
218	defined in Section 77-13-3, provide not less than * * * three (3)
219	and not more than ten (10) working days' advance written,
220	electronic or telephonic notice of the commencement, extent,
221	location and duration of the excavation work to Mississippi 811,
222	Incorporated, so that Mississippi 811, Incorporated, operator(s)
223	may locate and mark the location of underground utility lines and
224	underground facilities in the excavation area.
225	The written, electronic or telephonic notice required by this
226	paragraph (c) shall contain the name, address and telephone number
227	of the person filing the notice of intent, the person responsible
228	for the excavation, the starting date, anticipated duration, type
229	of excavation to be conducted, the location of the proposed
230	excavation and whether or not explosives are to be used.
231	(d) Provide advance written, electronic or telephonic
232	notice of the commencement, extent, location and duration of the
233	excavation work to Mississippi 811, Incorporated, for excavations

excavation start time that is not less than twelve (12) hours from

the time of notices provided between 8:00 p.m. and 11:59 a.m., and

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- 238 provided between 12:00 p.m. and 7:59 p.m., so that Mississippi
- 239 811, Incorporated, operators may locate and mark the location of
- 240 underground utility lines and underground facilities in the
- 241 excavation area.
- In addition to the written, electronic or telephonic notice
- 243 information required in subsection (1)(c), the excavator shall
- 244 also provide contact information for a person readily available to
- 245 discuss the impending emergency excavation with operators.
- 246 (2) The markings provided by operators and the locate
- 247 request number shall only be valid for a period of fourteen (14)
- 248 calendar days from the date and time the locate request ticket is
- 249 processed or entered into the system by Mississippi 811,
- 250 Incorporated The person responsible for the excavation project
- 251 shall renew the notification with Mississippi 811, Incorporated,
- 252 at least \* \* \* three (3) and not more than \* \* \* four (4) working
- 253 days prior to this expiration date and shall continue to renew
- 254 such notification in the same manner throughout the duration of
- 255 the excavation. Such renewal notice shall be valid for a period
- 256 of fourteen (14) calendar days from the date and time the renewal
- 257 locate request is processed or entered into the system by
- 258 Mississippi 811, Incorporated.
- 259 (3) Compliance with the notice requirements of this section
- 260 shall not be required of: (a) persons plowing less than
- 261 twenty-four (24) inches in depth for agricultural purposes; (b)

- 262 persons who are moving or otherwise displacing, by hand, earth, 263 rock or other material or mass of material on or below the ground 264 at a depth of less than twelve (12) inches on property they own; 265 and (c) persons, other than the property owner, who are moving or 266 otherwise displacing, by hand, earth, rock or other material or 267 mass of material on or below the ground at a depth of less than 268 twelve (12) inches, except when such excavation is in a clearly 269 marked underground facility right-of-way.
- 270 A person may make a written, electronic or telephonic 271 design information request to Mississippi 811, Incorporated, so 272 that owners and operators of utilities may locate underground 273 utility lines and underground facilities in the design information 274 The design information request shall contain the name, 275 address, and telephone number of the person making the request, 276 the type of project planned, and a description of the area to be 277 located with sufficient particularity to enable the utility owner 278 or operator to ascertain the precise tract or parcel of land 279 involved.
- 280 **SECTION 3.** Section 77-13-9, Mississippi Code of 1972, is amended as follows:
- 77-13-9. (1) Every person owning or operating underground utility lines or underground facilities shall, upon receiving advance notice of the commencement of excavation, in accordance with Section 77-13-5, make an investigation, and shall report through the use of the PRIS the status of the work performed,

287 within \* \* \* three (3) working days from the time notice is 288 provided in accordance with this chapter to Mississippi 811, 289 Incorporated, to determine the approximate location of its 290 underground utility lines or underground facilities in the area of the proposed excavation, and shall either: (a) mark the 291 292 approximate location of underground utility lines and underground 293 facilities in or near the area of the excavation, so as to enable 294 the person engaged in excavation work to locate the lines and 295 facilities in advance of and during the excavation work and notify 296 the excavator through the PRIS that the facilities have been 297 marked; (b) advise through the PRIS that it has no underground 298 utility lines or underground facilities in the excavation area; or 299 (c) advise through the PRIS that it can locate its underground 300 utility lines or underground facilities in the excavation area 301 only by excavation. If an operator can locate its underground 302 utility lines or underground facilities in the excavation area 303 only by excavation and has given proper notice of such, that 304 operator shall be allowed a reasonable amount of additional time, 305 not to exceed four (4) working days from the day the original 306 notice was provided in accordance with this chapter, to mark the 307 approximate location of the underground utility lines or 308 underground facilities.

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In lieu of such marking, the operator may request to be

present at the site upon commencement of the excavation, so long

311	as the operator complies within two (2)	working days of the
312	receipt of the notice.	
313	(3) When an excavator, upon arriv	ing at an excavation site,
314	sees evidence of unmarked underground u	tility lines or underground
315	facilities or encounters an unmarked un	derground utility line or
316	underground facility on an excavation s	ite after excavation has
317	commenced where notice of intent has be	en made in accordance with
318	the provisions of this chapter, that ex	cavator must immediately
319	contact Mississippi 811, Incorporated.	All operator(s) thus
320	notified must contact the excavator wit	hin * * * <u>two (2)</u> hours and
321	inform the excavator of any of their kn	own underground facilities,
322	active or abandoned, at the site of the	excavation.
323	(4) When marking the approximate	location of the facilities,

367	authorized person to inspect or copy the drawings or other records
368	for all underground utility lines and utility facilities in the
369	area.
370	(8) Every person owning or operating underground utility
371	lines or underground facilities shall, upon receiving advance
372	notice of the commencement of impending emergency excavation,
373	make an investigation, and report through the use of the PRIS the
374	status of the work performed, prior to the noticed time of
375	excavation provided to Mississippi 811, Incorporated, to determine
376	the approximate location of its underground utility lines or
377	underground facilities in the area of the proposed excavation, and
378	<pre>shall either:</pre>
379	(a) Mark the approximate location of underground
380	utility lines and underground facilities in or near the area of
381	the excavation, so as to enable the person engaged in excavation
382	work to locate the lines and facilities in advance of and during
383	the excavation work, and notify the excavator through the PRIS
384	that the facilities have been marked; or

385	(b) Advise through the PRIS that it has no underground
386	utility lines or underground facilities in the excavation area.
387	SECTION 4. Section 77-13-11, Mississippi Code of 1972, is
388	amended as follows:
389	77-13-11. (1) The advance notice provisions of this chapter
390	shall not apply to any person making an <a href="mailto:emergency">emergency</a> excavation at
391	times of emergency involving an imminent danger to life, health or
392	property or a customer service outage. However, every person who
393	shall engage in such emergency excavation shall take all necessary
394	and reasonable precautions to avoid or minimize interference with
395	or damage to existing underground utility lines and underground
396	facilities in and near the excavation area, and shall notify
397	Mississippi 811, Incorporated, of the specifically designated
398	<pre>emergency excavation as promptly as reasonably possible * * * so</pre>
399	that operators may locate and mark the location of underground
400	utility lines and underground facilities in the specifically
401	designated emergency excavation area. In the event of damage to
402	or dislocation of any underground utility lines or underground
403	facilities caused by any such emergency excavation work, the
404	person responsible for the excavation shall immediately notify the
405	operator of the damaged or dislocated underground facilities of
406	the damage or dislocation.
407	(2) An imminent danger to life, health, property or customer

service exists whenever there is a substantial likelihood that

injury, loss of life, health or customer services, or substantial

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410	property loss could result before the person responsible for the
411	excavation or demolition can fully comply with the notification
412	and response procedures required in Sections 77-13-7 and 77-13-17.

- 413 (3) Any misrepresentation of either an emergency excavation
  414 or an impending emergency as defined in Section 77-13-3, shall
  415 constitute a violation of this act.
- SECTION 5. Section 77-13-7, Mississippi Code of 1972, is brought forward as follows:
  - 77-13-7. (1) Each person responsible for any excavation that results in damage to an underground utility line or underground facility, immediately upon discovery of such damage, shall notify Mississippi 811, Inc., and notify all operators of such damaged line or facility of the location of the damage and shall allow the operator reasonable time to accomplish any necessary repairs before completing the excavation in the immediate area of the damage to such line or facility.
- 426 Each person responsible for any excavation that results in damage to an underground pipeline or underground facility 427 428 permitting the escape of any hazardous, flammable, toxic or corrosive gas or liquid shall, immediately upon discovery of such 429 damage, call 911 and then notify Mississippi 811, Inc., and the 430 431 operator and take other action as may reasonably be necessary to 432 protect persons and property and to minimize the hazards, until arrival of the operator's personnel and the police or fire 433 434 departments.

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435	(3) Except where the excavator has fully complied with the
436	provisions of Section $77-13-5$ and subsections (1) and (2) of this
437	section, each person responsible for excavation that results in
438	damage to an underground line or underground facility, except the
439	property owner, unless the property owner is the excavator, shall
440	be responsible for any and all costs and expenses incurred by the
441	operator in restoring, correcting, repairing or replacing the
442	damaged line or facility.
