HOUSE BILL NO. 1445

1 AN ACT TO AMEND SECTION 37-21-7, MISSISSIPPI CODE OF 1972, TO 2 PROVIDE AN ANNUAL SALARY SUPPLEMENT TO ASSISTANT TEACHERS EMPLOYED 3 BY SCHOOL DISTRICTS RATED "C," "D" OR "F" UNDER THE ACCOUNTABILITY 4 SYSTEM; AND FOR RELATED PURPOSES.

5 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI: 6 SECTION 1. Section 37-21-7, Mississippi Code of 1972, is 7 amended as follows:

37-21-7. (1) This section shall be referred to as the 8 9 "Mississippi Elementary Schools Assistant Teacher Program," the 10 purpose of which shall be to provide an early childhood education program that assists in the instruction of basic skills. 11 The 12 State Board of Education is authorized, empowered and directed to implement a statewide system of assistant teachers in kindergarten 13 14 classes and in the first, second and third grades. The assistant teacher shall assist pupils in actual instruction under the strict 15 supervision of a licensed teacher. 16

(2) (a) Except as otherwise authorized under subsection
(7), each school district shall employ the total number of
assistant teachers funded under subsection (6) of this section.

No. 1445 G1/2 23/HR26/R375 PAGE 1 (DJ\KW) The superintendent of each district shall assign the assistant teachers to the kindergarten, first-, second- and third-grade classes in the district in a manner that will promote the maximum efficiency, as determined by the superintendent, in the instruction of skills such as verbal and linguistic skills, logical and mathematical skills, and social skills.

26 If a licensed teacher to whom an assistant teacher (b) 27 has been assigned is required to be absent from the classroom, the 28 assistant teacher may assume responsibility for the classroom in 29 lieu of a substitute teacher. However, no assistant teacher shall 30 assume sole responsibility of the classroom for more than three (3) consecutive school days. Further, in no event shall any 31 32 assistant teacher be assigned to serve as a substitute teacher for any teacher other than the licensed teacher to whom that assistant 33 34 teacher has been assigned.

(3) Assistant teachers shall have, at a minimum, a high
school diploma or a High School Equivalency Diploma equivalent,
and shall show demonstratable proficiency in reading and writing
skills. The State Department of Education shall develop a testing
procedure for assistant teacher applicants to be used in all
school districts in the state.

44 reading improvement program to the State Department of Education;

47 and assessment of performance, including pretests and posttests,
48 for reading in Grades 1 through 6.

Additionally, each school district shall: 49 (b) 50 Provide annually a mandatory preservice (i) 51 orientation session, using an existing in-school service day, for administrators and teachers on the effective use of assistant 52 53 teachers as part of a team in the classroom setting and on the 54 role of assistant teachers, with emphasis on program goals; 55 Hold periodic workshops for administrators (ii) 56 and teachers on the effective use and supervision of assistant 57 teachers; 58 (iii) Provide training annually on specific

instructional skills for assistant teachers; (iv) Annually evaluate their program in accordance with their educational accountability and assessment of performance plan; and (v) Designate the necessary personnel to supervise and report on their program.

65 (5) The State Department of Education shall:

66 (a) Develop and assist in the implementation of a
67 statewide uniform training module, subject to the availability of

68 funds specifically appropriated therefor by the Legislature, which 69 shall be used in all school districts for training administrators, 70 teachers and assistant teachers. The module shall provide for the 71 consolidated training of each assistant teacher and teacher to 72 whom the assistant teacher is assigned, working together as a 73 team, and shall require further periodic training for 74 administrators, teachers and assistant teachers regarding the role 75 of assistant teachers;

76 (b) Annually evaluate the program on the district and 77 state level. Subject to the availability of funds specifically 78 appropriated therefor by the Legislature, the department shall 79 (i) uniform evaluation reports, to be performed by the develop: 80 principal or assistant principal, to collect data for the annual overall program evaluation conducted by the department; or (ii) a 81 program evaluation model that, at a minimum, addresses process 82 83 evaluation; and

84 Promulgate rules, regulations and such other (C) standards deemed necessary to effectuate the purposes of this 85 86 section. Noncompliance with the provisions of this section and 87 any rules, regulations or standards adopted by the department may 88 result in a violation of compulsory accreditation standards as 89 established by the State Board of Education and the Commission on 90 School Accreditation.

91 (6) <u>(a)</u> In addition to other funds allotted under the 92 Minimum Education or Adequate Education Program, each school

93 district shall be allotted sufficient funding for the purpose of 94 employing assistant teachers. No assistant teacher shall be paid less than the amount he or she received in the prior school year. 95 No school district shall receive any funds under this section for 96 97 any school year during which the aggregate amount of the local 98 contribution to the salaries of assistant teachers by the district shall have been reduced below such amount for the previous year. 99 100 (b) (i) For assistant teachers, the minimum annual

101 salary shall be as follows: 102 2022-2023 and Subsequent Years Minimum Salary.....\$17,000.00

104 In each school district that is assigned a (ii) 105 "C," "D" or "F" rating under the accountability system, the 106 minimum annual salary prescribed in subparagraph (i) of this 107 paragraph will be increased by an amount equal to One Thousand 108 Five Hundred Dollars (\$1,500.00) for each assistant teacher 109 employed by the district. If the school district subsequently is 110 assigned an accountability rating higher than "C", the salary 111 supplement required under this subparagraph will continue to be provided to assistant teachers, notwithstanding the improved 112 113 accountability rating.

114 (c) The assistant teachers shall not be restricted to 115 working only in the grades for which the funds were allotted, but 116 may be assigned to other classes as provided in subsection (2)(a) 117 of this section.

118 (7)(a) As an alternative to employing assistant teachers, 119 any school district may use the allotment provided under 120 subsection (6) of this section for the purpose of employing 121 licensed teachers for kindergarten, first-, second- and third-grade classes; however, no school district shall be 122 123 authorized to use the allotment for assistant teachers for the purpose of employing licensed teachers unless the district has 124 125 established that the employment of licensed teachers using such 126 funds will reduce the teacher:student ratio in the kindergarten, first-, second- and third-grade classes. All state funds for 127 128 assistant teachers shall be applied to reducing teacher:student ratio in Grades K-3. 129

130 It is the intent of the Legislature that no school district 131 shall dismiss any assistant teacher for the purpose of using the 132 assistant teacher allotment to employ licensed teachers. School 133 districts may rely only upon normal attrition to reduce the number 134 of assistant teachers employed in that district.

(b) Districts meeting the highest levels of
accreditation standards, as defined by the State Board of
Education, shall be exempted from the provisions of subsection (4)
of this section.

139 SECTION 2. This act shall take effect and be in force from 140 and after July 1, 2023.
