HOUSE BILL NO. 1446

1 AN ACT TO AMEND SECTION 37-19-7, MISSISSIPPI CODE OF 1972, TO 2 REQUIRE THE STATE DEPARTMENT OF EDUCATION TO PAY A SALARY 3 SUPPLEMENT TO PERSONS EMPLOYED AS A LICENSED TEACHER IN A CRITICAL 4 SHORTAGE SUBJECT AREA BY A SCHOOL DISTRICT ASSIGNED AN ACCOUNTABILITY RATING OF "D" OR "F"; AND FOR RELATED PURPOSES. 5 6 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI: 7 SECTION 1. Section 37-19-7, Mississippi Code of 1972, is amended as follows: 8 9 37-19-7. (1) The allowance in the Mississippi Adequate 10 Education Program for teachers' salaries in each public school district shall be determined and paid in accordance with the scale 11 12 for teachers' salaries as provided in this subsection. For teachers holding the following types of licenses or the equivalent 13 14 as determined by the State Board of Education, and the following 15 number of years of teaching experience, the scale shall be as 16 follows: 17 2022-2023 AND SUBSEQUENT SCHOOL YEARS MINIMUM SALARY SCHEDULE 18 Exp. 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56 It is the intent of the Legislature that any state funds made available for salaries of licensed personnel in excess of the 57 58 funds paid for such salaries for the 1986-1987 school year shall 59 be paid to licensed personnel pursuant to a personnel appraisal 60 and compensation system implemented by the State Board of 61 Education. The State Board of Education shall have the authority 62 to adopt and amend rules and regulations as are necessary to 63 establish, administer and maintain the system.

All teachers employed on a full-time basis shall be paid a minimum salary in accordance with the above scale. However, no school district shall receive any funds under this section for any school year during which the local supplement paid to any individual teacher shall have been reduced to a sum less than that paid to that individual teacher for performing the same duties

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from local supplement during the immediately preceding school year. The amount actually spent for the purposes of group health and/or life insurance shall be considered as a part of the aggregate amount of local supplement but shall not be considered a part of the amount of individual local supplement.

75 The level of professional training of each teacher to be used 76 in establishing the salary allotment for the teachers for each 77 year shall be determined by the type of valid teacher's license 78 issued to those teachers on or before October 1 of the current 79 school year. However, school districts are authorized, in their 80 discretion, to negotiate the salary levels applicable to licensed employees who are receiving retirement benefits from the 81 retirement system of another state, and the annual experience 82 83 increment provided \* \* \* in \* \* \* this subsection shall not be applicable to any such retired \* \* \* licensed employee. 84

(2) (a) The following employees shall receive an annual
salary supplement in the amount of Six Thousand Dollars
(\$6,000.00), plus fringe benefits, in addition to any other
compensation to which the employee may be entitled:

(i) Any licensed teacher who has met the
requirements and acquired a Master Teacher certificate from the
National Board for Professional Teaching Standards and who is
employed by a local school board or the State Board of Education
as a teacher and not as an administrator. Such teacher shall
submit documentation to the State Department of Education that the

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101 (ii) A licensed nurse who has met the requirements 102 and acquired a certificate from the National Board for 103 Certification of School Nurses, Inc., and who is employed by a 104 local school board or the State Board of Education as a school nurse and not as an administrator. The licensed school nurse 105 106 shall submit documentation to the State Department of Education 107 that the certificate was received before October 15 in order to be 108 eligible for the full salary supplement in the current school 109 year, or the licensed school nurse shall submit the documentation 110 to the State Department of Education before February 15 in order 111 to be eligible for a prorated salary supplement beginning with the 112 second term of the school year.

(iii) Any licensed school counselor who has met the requirements and acquired a National Certified School Counselor (NCSC) endorsement from the National Board of Certified Counselors and who is employed by a local school board or the State Board of Education as a counselor and not as an administrator. Such licensed school counselor shall submit documentation to the State Department of Education that the

The licensed 156 athletic trainer shall submit documentation to the State 157 Department of Education that the certificate was received before 158 October 15 in order to be eligible for the full salary supplement 159 in the current school year, or the licensed athletic trainer shall 160 submit the documentation to the State Department of Education 161 before February 15 in order to be eligible for a prorated salary 162 supplement beginning with the second term of the school year.

(b) An employee shall be reimbursed for the actual cost
of completing each component of acquiring the certificate or

school counselor or speech-language pathologist and audiologist,

A local school district or any 171 private individual or entity may pay the cost of completing the 172 process of acquiring the certificate or endorsement for any employee of the school district described under paragraph (a), and 173 174 the State Department of Education shall reimburse the school 175 district for such cost, regardless of whether or not the process 176 resulted in the award of the certificate or endorsement. If a 177 private individual or entity has paid the cost of completing the 178 process of acquiring the certificate or endorsement for an employee, the local school district may agree to directly 179 180 reimburse the individual or entity for such cost on behalf of the 181 employee.

182 All salary supplements, fringe benefits and process (C) 183 reimbursement authorized under this subsection shall be paid 184 directly by the State Department of Education to the local school 185 district and shall be in addition to its adequate education 186 program allotments and not a part thereof in accordance with 187 regulations promulgated by the State Board of Education. Local 188 school districts shall not reduce the local supplement paid to any 189 employee receiving such salary supplement, and the employee shall 190 receive any local supplement to which employees with similar 191 training and experience otherwise are entitled. However, an 192 educational employee shall receive the salary supplement in the 193 amount of Six Thousand Dollars (\$6,000.00) for only one (1) of the qualifying certifications authorized under paragraph (a) of this 194

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195 subsection. No school district shall provide more than one (1) 196 annual salary supplement under the provisions of this subsection 197 to any one (1) individual employee holding multiple qualifying 198 national certifications.

(d) If an employee for whom such cost has been paid, in full or in part, by a local school district or private individual or entity fails to complete the certification or endorsement process, the employee shall be liable to the school district or individual or entity for all amounts paid by the school district or individual or entity on behalf of that employee toward his or her certificate or endorsement.

(3) (a) The following employees shall receive an annual
salary supplement in the amount of Four Thousand Dollars
(\$4,000.00), plus fringe benefits, in addition to any other
compensation to which the employee may be entitled:

210 Effective July 1, 2016, if funds are available for that 211 purpose, any licensed teacher who has met the requirements and 212 acquired a Master Teacher Certificate from the National Board for 213 Professional Teaching Standards and who is employed in a public school district located in one (1) of the following counties: 214 215 Claiborne, Adams, Jefferson, Wilkinson, Amite, Bolivar, Coahoma, 216 Leflore, Quitman, Sharkey, Issaquena, Sunflower, Washington, 217 Holmes, Yazoo and Tallahatchie. The salary supplement awarded 218 under the provisions of this subsection (3)(a) shall be in

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219 addition to the salary supplement awarded under the provisions of 220 subsection (2) of this section.

Teachers who meet the qualifications for a salary supplement under this subsection (3) who are assigned for less than one (1) full year or less than full time for the school year shall receive the salary supplement in a prorated manner, with the portion of the teacher's assignment to the critical geographic area to be determined as of June 15th of the school year.

227 (b) Beginning in the 2023-2024 school year, a licensed 228 teacher employed in a teaching position in a subject area in which 229 there exists a critical shortage of teachers, as determined by the 230 State Department of Education, by a school district that has been assigned an accountability rating of "D" or "F" is eligible for an 231 232 annual salary supplement in an amount determined by the local 233 school district, not to exceed Fifteen Thousand Dollars 234 (\$15,000.00). The amount of a salary supplement under this 235 subsection (3) (b) for a qualified teacher must be established by 236 the employer school district, with consideration given to the 237 teacher's number of years experience in the critical needs subject 238 area, educational attainment, and professional certifications, 239 including a Master Teacher certificate from the National Board for 240 Professional Teaching Standards. The State Department of 241 Education shall pay directly to the local school district all 242 salary supplements awarded under this subsection (3)(b), which is 243 in addition to the district's allotments under the adequate

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244 <u>education program. A local school district may not reduce the</u>
245 <u>local supplement paid to any teacher receiving this salary</u>
246 <u>supplement, and the employee must receive any local supplement to</u>
247 <u>which employees with similar training and experience otherwise are</u>
248 <u>entitled.</u>
249 A salary supplement awarded to a teacher under this

250 <u>subsection (3)(b) is in addition to any other compensation to</u> 251 <u>which the employee may be entitled, including a salary supplement</u> 252 awarded under subsection (2) of this section.

253 (4) (a) This section shall be known and may be cited as the "Mississippi Performance-Based Pay (MPBP)" plan. In addition to 254 255 the minimum base pay described in this section, only after full 256 funding of MAEP and if funds are available for that purpose, the 257 State of Mississippi may provide monies from state funds to school 258 districts for the purposes of rewarding licensed teachers, 259 administrators and nonlicensed personnel at individual schools 260 showing improvement in student test scores. The MPBP plan shall 261 be developed by the State Department of Education based on the 262 following criteria:

(i) It is the express intent of this legislation that the MPBP plan shall utilize only existing standards of accreditation and assessment as established by the State Board of Education.

267 (ii) To ensure that all of Mississippi's teachers,268 administrators and nonlicensed personnel at all schools have equal

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(iii) To ensure all teachers cooperate in the spirit of teamwork, individual schools shall submit a plan to the local school district to be approved before the beginning of each school year beginning July 1, 2008. The plan shall include, but not be limited to, how all teachers, regardless of subject area, and administrators will be responsible for improving student achievement for their individual school.

(b) The State Board of Education shall develop the processes and procedures for designating schools eligible to participate in the MPBP. State assessment results, growth in student achievement at individual schools and other measures deemed appropriate in designating successful student achievement shall be used in establishing MPBP criteria.

(5) (a) If funds are available for that purpose, each
school in Mississippi shall have mentor teachers, as defined by
Sections 37-9-201 through 37-9-213, who shall receive additional

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294 base compensation provided for by the State Legislature in the 295 amount of One Thousand Dollars (\$1,000.00) per each beginning 296 teacher that is being mentored. The additional state compensation 297 shall be limited to those mentor teachers that provide mentoring 298 services to beginning teachers. For the purposes of such funding, 299 a beginning teacher shall be defined as any teacher in any school 300 in Mississippi that has less than one (1) year of classroom 301 experience teaching in a public school. For the purposes of such 302 funding, no full-time academic teacher shall mentor more than two 303 (2) beginning teachers.

304 (b) To be eligible for this state funding, the 305 individual school must have a classroom management program 306 approved by the local school board.

307 (6) Effective with the 2014-2015 school year, the school
308 districts participating in the Pilot Performance-Based
309 Compensation System pursuant to Section 37-19-9 may award
310 additional teacher and administrator pay based thereon.

311 **SECTION 2.** This act shall take effect and be in force from 312 and after July 1, 2023.
