## HOUSE BILL NO. 1448

1 AN ACT TO REQUIRE COMMUNITY AND JUNIOR COLLEGES TO WAIVE ALL 2 TUITION AND FEES FOR STUDENTS GRADUATING FROM A MISSISSIPPI HIGH 3 SCHOOL; TO ESTABLISH REQUIREMENTS FOR INITIAL ELIGIBILITY AND 4 RENEWAL OF WAIVERS; TO DEFINE THE TERM "TUITION"; TO REQUIRE THE 5 MISSISSIPPI COMMUNITY COLLEGE BOARD TO PROMULGATE RULES AND 6 REGULATIONS FOR THE TUITION WAIVER PROGRAM; TO CREATE NEW SECTION 7 37-29-307, MISSISSIPPI CODE OF 1972, TO REQUIRE FUNDS SUFFICIENT TO COVER THE COST OF WAIVING THE TUITION FOR PARTICIPATING 8 9 STUDENTS TO BE APPROPRIATED BY LINE ITEM IN THE COMMUNITY AND JUNIOR COLLEGES GENERAL SUPPORT BILL; AND FOR RELATED PURPOSES. 10 11 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI: 12 SECTION 1. (1) Beginning with the 2023-2024 academic year, 13 each public community and junior college in the state shall waive 14 tuition for each qualified student who graduates from a 15 Mississippi high school. (2) In order to qualify for a waiver of tuition under this 16 17 section, a student must: 18 (a) Be a resident of the State of Mississippi; (b) Have graduated from a public or private high school 19 20 or a home instruction program no more than two (2) years before 21 seeking a waiver of tuition;

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22 (C) Be enrolling in college for the first time; however, courses taken through a dual enrollment or dual credit 23 program at a community or junior college or institution of higher 24 learning while a student was enrolled in high school do not 25 26 disqualify the student from eligibility for a waiver of tuition; 27 and

Have met the college's general eligibility 28 (d) 29 requirements and been accepted for enrollment at the community or 30 junior college.

A waiver of tuition under this section may not exceed 31 (3) 32 the actual cost of attendance at the community or junior college 33 at which a student is enrolled or accepted for enrollment. If a student receives other grants, scholarships or tuition assistance, 34 the community or junior college must reduce the amount of the 35 36 waiver by such amount as may be necessary to ensure that the 37 waiver, when combined with other forms of assistance, does not 38 exceed the actual cost of tuition. For purposes of this section, the term "tuition" means the semester or term charges, all 39 40 required fees, on-campus housing and meal-plan costs, and costs 41 for books and materials required for classes; however, the term 42 "tuition" does not include the cost of school supplies and dues or 43 fees for extracurricular activities.

44 (4) Both full-time and part-time students are eligible for a 45 tuition waiver under this section. A waiver granted to a full-time student may not exceed the lesser of two (2) years or 46

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47 the actual time required to complete the associate degree or 48 certificate program in which the student is enrolled. A waiver 49 granted to a part-time student may not exceed the length of time 50 required to complete the associate degree or certificate program 51 in which the student is enrolled.

(5) As a condition for renewal of a waiver of tuition, a
student must make steady academic progress toward an associate
degree or certification, as certified by the college's registrar.
(6) The Mississippi Community College Board shall promulgate
rules and regulations necessary to carry out the provisions of
this section.

58 It is the intent of the Legislature that all students (7)59 eligible for a waiver of tuition under this section be granted a 60 waiver. If funding at a community or junior college is insufficient to waive the tuition for all eligible applicants at 61 62 that college, the tuition must be waived for first-time students 63 on a first-come, first-served basis; however, priority consideration must be given to students previously receiving 64 65 waivers under this section who are making steady academic progress 66 toward completion of an associate degree or certificate program.

67 SECTION 2. The following shall be codified as Section 68 37-29-307, Mississippi Code of 1972:

69 <u>37-29-307.</u> (1) Beginning with the appropriation for the 70 2023-2024 fiscal year, in addition to all other funding provided 71 for the support of the community and junior colleges, the

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Legislature shall appropriate annually, by line item specifically for such purpose in the community and junior colleges general support bill, sufficient funding to defray the amount of funding lost by each community or junior college due to the granting of tuition waivers to eligible students, as required under Section 1 of this act.

In calculating the state funding to be appropriated 78 (2)under subsection (1) for the fiscal year 2023-2024, the most 79 80 current data reflecting the number of students enrolled in the 81 community and junior colleges who would have been eligible for a 82 tuition waiver in the 2022-2023 fiscal year, plus the actual cost that would have been incurred by each community or junior college 83 84 in the 2022-2023 fiscal year if the college had granted waivers to 85 those students, must be utilized to project the necessary funding. In subsequent fiscal years, the most current data reflecting the 86 87 number of students who have been granted tuition waivers and the 88 actual cost incurred by the community and junior colleges in providing tuition waivers to those students must be utilized to 89 90 project the necessary funding for the succeeding fiscal year. 91 During the fiscal year for which funds have been appropriated, the 92 projections used for appropriation purposes must be reconciled 93 with actual enrollment and actual costs, and any necessary adjustments must be made in the allocations to the community and 94 95 junior colleges during that year of operation.
