HOUSE BILL NO. 1461

1 AN ACT TO CREATE THE "FORMER COLLEGIATE ATHLETE SCHOLARSHIP 2 PROGRAM"; TO AUTHORIZE SCHOLARSHIPS FOR FORMER COLLEGIATE ATHLETES 3 WHO DID NOT COMPLETE A BACCALAUREATE DEGREE WHO PURSUE A DEGREE IN EDUCATION OR ANOTHER DEGREE PROGRAM THAT ENABLES THE INDIVIDUAL TO 5 BE LICENSED AS A TEACHER THROUGH AN ALTERNATIVE ROUTE; TO AUTHORIZE SCHOLARSHIP AWARDS FOR UP TO THREE YEARS; TO REQUIRE A SCHOLARSHIP RECIPIENT TO RENDER SERVICE AS A PUBLIC SCHOOL TEACHER 7 IN EXCHANGE FOR THE SCHOLARSHIP; TO REQUIRE THE BOARD OF TRUSTEES 8 9 OF STATE INSTITUTIONS OF HIGHER LEARNING TO BE THE ADMINISTERING 10 AGENCY OF THE SCHOLARSHIP PROGRAM; AND FOR RELATED PURPOSES. BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI: 11 12 SECTION 1. (1) There is established the "Former Collegiate Athlete Scholarship Program," the purpose of which is to attract 13 former collegiate athletes who did not complete a baccalaureate 14 15 degree to become licensed teachers by awarding full scholarships to those persons declaring an intention to serve in the teaching 16 17 field who actually render service to the state while possessing an appropriate teaching license. 18 (2) An individual who has completed at least two (2) 19 semesters of study as a student athlete in an institution of 20

higher learning who subsequently is enrolled in or accepted for

enrollment at a teacher education program approved by the State

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- 23 Board of Education or other program at a baccalaureate
- 24 degree-granting institution of higher learning which will qualify
- 25 the person to pursue an alternate route teaching license in the
- 26 State of Mississippi is eligible for a financial scholarship to be
- 27 applied toward the costs of the individual's college education.
- 28 To be eligible, a student must express in writing an intention to
- 29 teach in a public school in the state upon graduation. The annual
- 30 amount of the award must be equal to the total cost for tuition,
- 31 room and meals, books, materials and fees at the college or
- 32 university in which the student is enrolled, not to exceed an
- 33 amount equal to the highest total cost of tuition, room and meals,
- 34 books, materials and fees assessed by a state institution of
- 35 higher learning during that school year.
- 36 (3) Awards granted under the Former Collegiate Athlete
- 37 Scholarship Program are available to both full-time and part-time
- 38 students. Students enrolling on a full-time basis may receive a
- 39 maximum of three (3) annual awards. The maximum number of awards
- 40 that may be made to students attending school on a part-time
- 41 basis, and the maximum time period for part-time students to
- 42 complete the number of academic hours necessary to obtain a
- 43 baccalaureate degree in education, shall be established by rules
- 44 and regulations jointly promulgated by the Board of Trustees of
- 45 State Institutions of Higher Learning and the State Board of
- 46 Education. Former Collegiate Athlete Scholarships may not be
- 47 based upon an applicant's eligibility for financial aid.

- 48 (4) Except in those cases where employment positions may not
- 49 be available upon completion of licensure requirements, at the
- 50 beginning of the first school year in which a recipient of a
- 51 Former Collegiate Athlete Scholarship is eligible for employment
- 52 as a licensed teacher or a nontraditional teacher intern pursuant
- 53 to Section 37-3-2(6)(b), that person shall begin to render service
- 54 as a licensed teacher or nontraditional teacher intern in a public
- 55 school district, as approved by the State Board of Education.
- 56 Persons who received annual awards must render service as follows:
- 57 (a) A person who received three (3) or fewer annual
- 58 awards, but more than two (2) annual awards, must render five (5)
- 59 year's service as a licensed teacher in a public school in
- 60 Mississippi.
- 61 (b) A person who received two (2) or fewer annual
- 62 awards, but more than one (1) annual award, must render three (3)
- 63 year's service as a licensed teacher in a public school in
- 64 Mississippi.
- 65 (c) A person who received one (1) or fewer annual
- 66 awards must render one (1) year's service as a licensed teacher in
- 67 a public school in Mississippi.
- 68 (5) A person failing to complete a program of study that
- 69 will enable the person to become a licensed teacher or
- 70 nontraditional teacher intern under Section 37-3-2(6)(b), as the
- 71 case may be, is liable immediately to the Board of Trustees of
- 72 State Institutions of Higher Learning for the sum of all Former

- 73 Collegiate Athlete Scholarship awards made to that person, plus 74 interest accruing at the current Stafford Loan rate at the time 75 the person abrogates participation in the program. A person 76 failing to complete his teaching obligation, as required under 77 subsection (4) of this section, is liable immediately to the board 78 for the sum of all scholarship awards made to that person less the corresponding amount of any awards for which service has been 79 80 rendered, plus interest accruing at the current Stafford Loan rate 81 at the time the person discontinues service, except in the case of 82 a deferral of debt for cause by the State Board of Education when 83 there is no employment position immediately available upon a teacher's completion of licensure requirements. After the period 84 85 of deferral, the person must begin or resume teaching duties as required under subsection (4) or become liable to the board under 86 87 this subsection. If a claim for payment under this subsection is 88 placed in the hands of an attorney for collection, the obligor is 89 liable for an additional amount equal to a reasonable attorney's 90 fee.
- 91 (6) The Board of Trustees of State Institutions of Higher 92 Learning and the State Board of Education, acting jointly, shall 93 promulgate rules and regulations necessary for the proper 94 administration of the Former Collegiate Athlete Scholarship The Board of Trustees of State Institutions of Higher 95 96 Learning is the administering agency of the program.

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97	(7) If insufficient funds are available to fully fund
98	scholarship awards to all eligible students, the Board of Trustees
99	of State Institutions of Higher Learning shall make the awards to
100	first-time students on a first-come, first-served basis; however,
101	priority consideration must be given to persons previously
102	receiving awards under the Former Collegiate Athlete Scholarship
103	Program.
104	SECTION 2. This act shall take effect and be in force from

and after July 1, 2023.

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
