HOUSE BILL NO. 1598 (As Sent to Governor)

1 2 3	AN ACT MAKING AN APPROPRIATION FROM SPECIAL FUNDS IN THE STATE TREASURY FOR THE PURPOSE OF DEFRAYING THE EXPENSES OF THE STATE BOARD OF MEDICAL LICENSURE FOR THE FISCAL YEAR 2024.
4	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI:
5	SECTION 1. The following sum, or so much thereof as may be
6	necessary, is appropriated out of any money in the special fund in
7	the State Treasury to the credit of the State Board of Medical
8	Licensure, for the purpose of defraying the expenses of the board
9	for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 2023, and ending
10	June 30, 2024\$ 4,047,338.00.
11	SECTION 2. Of the funds appropriated under the provisions of
12	Section 1, the following positions are authorized:
13	AUTHORIZED HEADCOUNT:
14	Permanent: 30
15	Time-Limited: 0
16	With the funds herein appropriated, it shall be the agency's
17	responsibility to make certain that funds required for Personal
18	Services for Fiscal Year 2025 do not exceed Fiscal Year 2024 funds

- 19 appropriated for that purpose unless programs or positions are
- 20 added to the agency's Fiscal Year 2024 budget by the Mississippi
- 21 Legislature. The Legislature shall determine the agency's
- 22 personal services appropriation, which the State Personnel Board
- 23 shall publish. The agency's personal services appropriation may
- 24 consist of restricted funds for approved vacancies for Fiscal Year
- 25 2024 that may not be utilized for active Fiscal Year 2023
- 26 Headcount. It shall be the agency's responsibility to ensure that
- 27 the funds provided for vacancies are used to increase headcount
- 28 and not for promotions, title changes, in-range salary adjustments
- 29 or any other mechanism for increasing salaries for current
- 30 employees. It is the Legislature's intention that no employee
- 31 salary falls below the minimum salary established by the
- 32 Mississippi State Personnel Board.
- 33 Additionally, the State Personnel Board shall determine and
- 34 publish the projected annualized payroll costs based on current
- 35 employees. It shall be the responsibility of the agency head to
- 36 ensure that actual personnel expenditures for Fiscal Year 2024 do
- 37 not exceed the data provided by the Legislative Budget Office. If
- 38 the agency's Fiscal Year 2024 projected cost exceeds the
- 39 annualized costs, no salary actions shall be processed by the
- 40 State Personnel Board except for new hires determined to be
- 41 essential for the agency.
- 42 Any transfers or escalations shall be made in accordance with
- 43 the terms, conditions, and procedures established by law or

45	Personnel Board shall not escalate positions without written
46	approval from the Department of Finance and Administration. The
47	Department of Finance and Administration shall not provide written
48	approval to escalate any funds for salaries and/or positions
49	without proof of availability of new or additional funds above the
50	appropriated level.
51	No general funds authorized to be expended herein shall be
52	used to replace federal funds and/or other special funds used for
53	salaries authorized under the provisions of this act and which are
54	withdrawn and no longer available.
55	None of the funds herein appropriated shall be used in
56	violation of the Internal Revenue Service's Publication 15-A
57	relating to the reporting of income paid to contract employees, as
58	interpreted by the Office of the State Auditor.
59	SECTION 3. In compliance with the "Mississippi Performance
60	Budget and Strategic Planning Act of 1994," it is the intent of
61	the Legislature that the funds provided herein shall be utilized
62	in the most efficient and effective manner possible to achieve the
63	intended mission of this agency. Based on the funding authorized,
64	this agency shall make every effort to attain the targeted
65	performance measures provided below:

80	agency's budget request submitted to the Joint Legislative Budget
81	Committee for Fiscal Year 2025.
82	SECTION 4. It is the intention of the Legislature that the
83	State Board of Medical Licensure shall maintain complete
84	accounting and personnel records related to the expenditure of all
85	funds appropriated under this act and that such records shall be
86	in the same format and level of detail as maintained for Fiscal
87	Year 2023. It is further the intention of the Legislature that
88	the agency's budget request for Fiscal Year 2025 shall be
89	submitted to the Joint Legislative Budget Committee in a format
90	and level of detail comparable to the format and level of detail
91	provided during the Fiscal Year 2024 budget request process.
92	SECTION 5. It is the intention of the Legislature that
93	whenever two (2) or more bids are received by this agency for the

- 94 purchase of commodities or equipment, and whenever all things
- 95 stated in such received bids are equal with respect to price,
- 96 quality and service, the Mississippi Industries for the Blind
- 97 shall be given preference. A similar preference shall be given to
- 98 the Mississippi Industries for the Blind whenever purchases are
- 99 made without competitive bids.
- 100 **SECTION 6.** Of the funds provided under the provisions of
- 101 this act, and as approved by the Mississippi State Board of
- 102 Medical Licensure (the Board), at the direction of the Board the
- 103 Executive Director may negotiate and enter into a grant agreement
- 104 to provide funding in an amount not to exceed Six Hundred Thousand
- 105 Dollars (\$600,000) for the Mississippi Physician Health Program.
- 106 **SECTION 7.** Of the funds provided under the provisions of
- 107 this act, an amount not to exceed One Hundred Thirty Thousand
- 108 Dollars (\$130,000.00) may be allocated to the Mississippi Board of
- 109 Pharmacy to defray the expense of the Mississippi Prescription
- 110 Monitoring Program.
- 111 SECTION 8. It is the intention of the Legislature that the
- 112 funds are appropriated here in accordance with a signed Memorandum
- 113 of Understanding with the Mississippi Department of Health to
- 114 assist with the implementation of the Medical Cannabis Act for
- 115 registering and monitoring compliance with the rules and
- 116 regulations of the Act.
- 117 **SECTION 9.** It is further the intention of the Legislature
- 118 that, for Fiscal Year 2024, the board shall be allowed to recover

119	all costs from a holder of a license who has been found by the
120	board in violation of statute after notice and a hearing as
121	provided by law. The expenses must be direct costs associated
122	with the investigation and conduct of a proceeding for licensure
123	revocation, suspension or restriction.
124	SECTION 10. It is the intention of the Legislature that the
125	funds herein appropriated shall be expended in compliance with
126	Section 27-104-25, Mississippi Code of 1972, that no state agency
127	shall incur obligations or indebtedness in excess of their
128	appropriation and that the responsible officers, either personally
129	or upon their official bonds, shall be held responsible for
130	actions contrary to this provision.
131	SECTION 11. The money herein appropriated shall be paid by
132	the State Treasurer out of any money in the State Treasury to the
133	credit of the proper fund or funds as set forth in this act, upon
134	warrants issued by the State Fiscal Officer; and the State Fiscal
135	Officer shall issue his warrants upon requisitions signed by the
136	proper person, officer or officers, in the manner provided by law.
137	SECTION 12. This act shall take effect and be in force from

and after July 1, 2023.

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
