## HOUSE BILL NO. 1615

1 2 3	AN ACT MAKING AN APPROPRIATION FOR THE SUPPORT AND MAINTENANCE OF THE MISSISSIPPI LIBRARY COMMISSION FOR THE FISCAL YEAR 2024.
4	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI:
5	SECTION 1. The following sum, or so much thereof as may be
6	necessary, is appropriated out of any money in the State General
7	Fund not otherwise appropriated, for the support and maintenance
8	of the Mississippi Library Commission and for carrying out the
9	provisions of Section 39-3-107, Mississippi Code of 1972, for the
10	fiscal year beginning July 1, 2023, and ending June 30, 2024
11	\$ 10,452,758.00.
12	SECTION 2. The following sum, or so much thereof as may be
13	necessary, is appropriated out of any money in the special fund in
14	the State Treasury to the credit of the Mississippi Library
15	Commission which is comprised of special source funds collected by
16	or otherwise available to the commission, for the purpose of
17	defraying the expenses of the commission for the fiscal year
18	beginning July 1, 2023, and ending June 30, 2024

19	\$ 3,100,948.00.
20	SECTION 3. Of the funds appropriated under the provisions of
21	this act, the following positions are authorized:
22	AUTHORIZED HEADCOUNT:
23	Permanent: 45
24	Time-Limited: 0
25	With the funds herein appropriated, it shall be the agency's
26	responsibility to make certain that funds required for Personal
27	Services for Fiscal Year 2025 do not exceed Fiscal Year 2024 funds
28	appropriated for that purpose unless programs or positions are
29	added to the agency's Fiscal Year 2024 budget by the Mississippi
30	Legislature. The Legislature shall determine the agency's
31	personal services appropriation, which shall be published by the
32	State Personnel Board. Additionally, the State Personnel Board
33	shall determine and publish the projected annualized payroll costs
34	based on current employees. It shall be the responsibility of the
35	agency head to ensure that actual personnel expenditures for
36	Fiscal Year 2024 do not exceed the data provided by the
37	Legislative Budget Office. If the agency's Fiscal Year 2024
38	projected cost exceeds the annualized costs, no salary actions
39	shall be processed by the State Personnel Board with the exception
40	of new hires that are determined to be essential for the agency.
41	Any transfers or escalations shall be made in accordance with
42	the terms, conditions and procedures established by law or
43	allowable under the terms set forth within this act. The State

- 44 Personnel Board shall not escalate positions without written
- 45 approval from the Department of Finance and Administration. The
- 46 Department of Finance and Administration shall not provide written
- 47 approval to escalate any funds for salaries and/or positions
- 48 without proof of availability of new or additional funds above the
- 49 appropriated level.
- No general funds authorized to be expended herein shall be
- 51 used to replace federal funds and/or other special funds which are
- 52 being used for salaries authorized under the provisions of this
- 53 act and which are withdrawn and no longer available.
- None of the funds herein appropriated shall be used in
- 55 violation of Internal Revenue Service's Publication 15-A relating
- 56 to the reporting of income paid to contract employees, as
- 57 interpreted by the Office of the State Auditor.
- Funds have been appropriated herein for the purpose of
- 59 funding Project SEC2 minimum salaries for all employees covered
- 60 under the Colonel Guy Groff/Neville Kenning Variable Compensation
- 61 Plan. It shall be the agency's responsibility to ensure that the
- 62 funds are used to increase all employees' salaries up to the
- 63 minimum level as determined by the State Personnel Board.
- 64 **SECTION 4.** Funds to be distributed to eliqible public
- 65 library systems under the Personnel Incentive Grants Program shall
- 66 be paid quarterly in advance on or before September 30, December
- 67 31, March 31 and June 30.

68	SECTION 5. It is the intention of the Legislature that the
69	Mississippi Library Commission shall maintain complete accounting
70	and personnel records related to the expenditure of all funds
71	appropriated under this act and that such records shall be in the
72	same format and level of detail as maintained for Fiscal Year
73	2023. It is further the intention of the Legislature that the
74	agency's budget request for Fiscal Year 2025 shall be submitted to
75	the Joint Legislative Budget Committee in a format and level of
76	detail comparable to the format and level of detail provided
77	during the Fiscal Year 2024 budget request process.
78	SECTION 6. Of the funds appropriated under the provisions of
79	Section 2, Four Hundred Ninety-three Thousand Eight Hundred
80	Forty-seven Dollars (\$493,847.00) shall be derived from the
81	Education Enhancement Fund deposited pursuant to Sections 27-65-75
82	and 27-67-31, Mississippi Code of 1972.
83	SECTION 7. In compliance with the "Mississippi Performance
84	Budget and Strategic Planning Act of 1994," it is the intent of
85	the Legislature that the funds provided herein shall be utilized
86	in the most efficient and effective manner possible to achieve the
87	intended mission of this agency. Based on the funding authorized,
88	this agency shall make every effort to attain the targeted
89	performance measures provided below:

L17	SECTION 8. It is the intention of the Legislature that no
L18	less than One Million Three Hundred Fifty Thousand Dollars
L19	(\$1,350,000.00) shall be expended for the Magnolia Database.
L20	SECTION 9. Of the funds appropriated in Section 2, the
L21	following sum, or so much thereof as may be necessary, are derived
L22	from the Education Enhancement Fund pursuant to Sections 27-65-75
L23	and 27-67-31, Mississippi Code of 1972, for MAGNOLIA
L24	\$ 350,000.00.
L25	SECTION 10. Of the funds appropriated herein, Four Million
L26	Three Hundred Seventy-five Thousand One Hundred Thirty-nine
L27	Dollars (\$4,375,139.00) is provided for the cost of health
L28	insurance for all full-time library staff members in each public
L29	library in Mississippi.
L30	SECTION 11. It is the intention of the Legislature that
L31	whenever two (2) or more bids are received by this agency for the
L32	purchase of commodities or equipment, and whenever all things
L33	stated in such received bids are equal with respect to price,
L34	quality and service, the Mississippi Industries for the Blind
L35	shall be given preference. A similar preference shall be given to
L36	the Mississippi Industries for the Blind whenever purchases are
L37	made without competitive bids.
L38	SECTION 12. It is the intention of the Legislature that the
L39	funds herein appropriated shall be expended in compliance with
L40	Section 27-104-25, Mississippi Code of 1972, that no state agency
L41	shall incur obligations or indebtedness in excess of their

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142	appropriation and that the responsible officers, either personally
143	or upon their official bonds, shall be held responsible for
144	actions contrary to this provision.
145	SECTION 13. The money herein appropriated shall be paid by
146	the State Treasurer out of any money in the State Treasury to the
147	credit of the proper fund or funds as set forth in this act, upon
148	warrants issued by the State Fiscal Officer; and the State Fiscal
149	Officer shall issue his warrants upon requisitions signed by the
150	proper person, officer or officers, in the manner provided by law.
151	SECTION 14. This act shall take effect and be in force from

and after July 1, 2023, and shall stand repealed June 30, 2023.

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
