1 2 3	AN ACT MAKING AN APPROPRIATION FOR THE PURPOSE OF DEFRAYING THE EXPENSES OF THE PUBLIC SERVICE COMMISSION FOR THE FISCAL YEAR 2024 .
4	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI:
5	SECTION 1. The following sum, or so much thereof as may be
6	necessary, is appropriated out of any money in the State General
7	Fund not otherwise appropriated, for the purpose of defraying the
8	expenses of the Mississippi Public Service Commission for the
9	fiscal year beginning July 1, 2023, and ending June 30, 2024
10	\$ 4,872,897.00.
11	SECTION 2. The following sum, or so much thereof as may be
12	necessary, is appropriated out of any money in the special fund in
13	the State Treasury to the credit of the Mississippi Public Service
14	Commission which is comprised of special source funds collected by
15	or otherwise available to the commission, for the purpose of
16	defraying the expenses of the commission for the fiscal year
17	beginning July 1, 2023, and ending June 30, 2024
18	\$ 746,994.00.

20	Section 1 and Section 2, the following positions are authorized:

22	Permanent: 52
23	Time-Limited: 5
24	With the funds herein appropriated, it shall be the agency's
25	responsibility to make certain that funds required for Personal
26	Services for Fiscal Year 2025 do not exceed Fiscal Year 2024 funds
27	appropriated for that purpose unless programs or positions are
28	added to the agency's Fiscal Year 2024 budget by the Mississippi
29	Legislature. The Legislature shall determine the agency's
30	personal services appropriation, which the State Personnel Board
31	shall publish. The agency's personal services appropriation may
32	consist of restricted funds for approved vacancies for Fiscal Year
33	2024 that may not be utilized for active Fiscal Year 2023
34	Headcount. It shall be the agency's responsibility to ensure that

It is the intention of the Legislature that the 123 Public Service Commission shall maintain complete accounting and 124 personnel records related to the expenditure of all funds 125 appropriated under this act and that such records shall be in the 126 same format and level of detail as maintained for Fiscal Year 127 2023. It is further the intention of the Legislature that the 128 agency's budget request for Fiscal Year 2025 shall be submitted to 129 the Joint Legislative Budget Committee in a format and level of detail comparable to the format and level of detail provided 130 131 during the Fiscal Year 2024 budget request process.
 - SECTION 7. Of the funds appropriated under the provisions of Section 2 of this act, the following sum, or so much thereof as may be necessary, is appropriated out of any money in the State Treasury to the credit of the Capital Expense Fund, as created in Section 27-103-303, Mississippi Code of 1972, and allocated in a manner as determined by the State Treasurer. These funds are provided for purchase of a new case tracking system for the Public Service Commission for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 2023, and ending June 30, 2024...............\$ 282,500.
- SECTION 8. It is the intention of the Legislature that
 whenever two (2) or more bids are received by this agency for the
 purchase of commodities or equipment, and whenever all things

144	stated in such received bids are equal with respect to price,
145	quality and service, the Mississippi Industries for the Blind
146	shall be given preference. A similar preference shall be given to
147	the Mississippi Industries for the Blind whenever purchases are
148	made without competitive bids.
149	SECTION 9. It is the intention of the Legislature that the
150	Public Service Commission shall compile the amount of time that is
151	expended on each regulated entity during Fiscal Year 2023. On or
152	before August 1, 2023, the Public Service Commission shall report
153	these findings to the House of Representatives' Public Utilities
154	Committee.
155	SECTION 10. The money herein appropriated shall be paid by
156	the State Treasurer out of any money in the State Treasury to the
157	credit of the proper fund or funds as set forth in this act, upon
158	warrants issued by the State Fiscal Officer; and the State Fiscal
159	Officer shall issue his warrants upon requisitions signed by the
160	proper person, officer or officers, in the manner provided by law.

SECTION 11. This act shall take effect and be in force from

and after July 1, 2023.
