1 2 3	AN ACT MAKING AN APPROPRIATION FOR THE SUPPORT AND MAINTENANCE OF THE STATE FORESTRY COMMISSION FOR THE FISCAL YEAR 2024.
4	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI:
5	SECTION 1. The following sum, or so much thereof as may be
6	necessary, is appropriated out of any money in the State General
7	Fund not otherwise appropriated, for the support and maintenance
8	of the State Forestry Commission for the fiscal year beginning
9	July 1, 2023, and ending June 30, 2024
10	\$ 15,460,487.00.
11	SECTION 2. The following sum, or so much thereof as may be
12	necessary, is appropriated out of any money in the special fund in
13	the State Treasury to the credit of the State Forestry Commission
14	which is comprised of special source funds collected by or
15	otherwise available to the commission, for the support and

20	Thousand Dollars (\$250,000.00) shall be deposited in a fund
21	created in the State Treasury called the "Forest Improvement
22	Revolving Fund." Money in this fund shall be used by the State
23	Forestry Commission to assist in the reforestation and growth
24	improvement of the forests, woodlands, and publicly owned lands of
25	the state, including sixteenth section lands, Camp Shelby,
26	Columbia Training School and colleges and universities.
27	Landowners who contract with the commission for such work shall
28	pay to the commission its actual cost for conducting such work.
29	Money received for this work by the commission shall be paid into
30	the State Treasury, and the State Treasurer shall deposit such
31	money in the "Forest Improvement Revolving Fund."
32	SECTION 3. Of the funds appropriated under the provisions of

- 68 to the reporting of income paid to contract employees, as
- 69 interpreted by the Office of the State Auditor.
- 70 Funds have been appropriated herein for the purpose of
- 71 funding Project SEC2 minimum salaries for all employees covered
- 72 under the Colonel Guy Groff/Neville Kenning Variable Compensation
- 73 Plan. It shall be the agency's responsibility to ensure that the
- 74 funds are used to increase all employees' salaries up to the
- 75 minimum level as determined by the State Personnel Board.
- 76 **SECTION 4.** It is the intention of the Legislature that the
- 77 State Forestry Commission shall maintain complete accounting and
- 78 personnel records related to the expenditure of all funds
- 79 appropriated under this act and that such records shall be in the
- 80 same format and level of detail as maintained for Fiscal Year
- 81 2023. It is further the intention of the Legislature that the
- 82 agency's budget request for Fiscal Year 2025 shall be submitted to
- 83 the Joint Legislative Budget Committee in a format and level of
- 84 detail comparable to the format and level of detail provided
- 85 during the Fiscal Year 2024 budget request process.
- 86 **SECTION 5.** In compliance with the "Mississippi Performance
- 87 Budget and Strategic Planning Act of 1994," it is the intent of
- 88 the Legislature that the funds provided herein shall be utilized
- 89 in the most efficient and effective manner possible to achieve the
- 90 intended mission of this agency. Based on the funding authorized,
- 91 this agency shall make every effort to attain the targeted

127	The Volunteer Fire Department Equipment Conversion Revolving

The Volunteer Fire Department Equipment Conversion Revolving Fund shall be funded by monies received from charges for work and services performed for volunteer fire departments by the State Forestry Commission. Monies collected from such charges shall be deposited into the Volunteer Fire Department Equipment Conversion Revolving Fund. The State Treasurer shall make disbursements therefrom for payment of materials, supplies and labor upon requisition of the Forestry Commission and upon the issuance of warrants therefor by the Department of Finance and Administration.

The amount of monies deposited into the Volunteer Fire

Department Equipment Conversion Fund through this work shall not

exceed Fifty Thousand Dollars (\$50,000.00). Funds in excess of

Fifty Thousand Dollars (\$50,000.00) shall be placed in the State

Forestry Commission's regular appropriated special funds. Monies

in this revolving fund are to be considered special funds and

shall be carried forward from one fiscal year to the next.

143	SECTION 7. There is created in the State Treasury a fund
144	designated as the Camden State Forest Revolving Fund to be used by
145	the State Forestry Commission to direct forest management
146	activities on the Camden State Forest in Madison County,
147	Mississippi. The forest management activities will include, but
148	not be limited to, maintenance of property, timber sale activities
149	and regeneration work.
150	The Camden State Forest Revolving Fund shall be funded by
151	monies received from timber sales, leases, and any other source.
152	Monies collected from these income sources shall be deposited into
153	the Camden State Forest Revolving Fund. The State Treasurer shall
154	make disbursements therefrom for payments of materials, supplies
155	and labor upon requisition of the State Forestry Commission and
156	upon the issuance of warrants therefor by the Department of
157	Finance and Administration.
158	It is the intention of the Legislature that any revolving
159	funds in excess of the budgeted amount needed for the necessary
160	operation and maintenance of all properties under the direct
161	supervision and management of the State Forestry Commission shall
162	remain in the Camden State Forest Revolving Fund for use in future
163	vears

SECTION 8. Of the funds appropriated in Section 2, it is the

intention of the Legislature that Two Hundred Thousand Dollars

(\$200,000.00) shall be transferred to the Department of

- 169 SECTION 9. Any funds in the Salary, Wages and Fringe 170 Benefits major object of expenditure may be used to purchase

accumulated compensatory time within the funds available.

It is the intention of the Legislature that whenever two (2) or more bids are received by this agency for the 173 174 purchase of commodities or equipment, and whenever all things 175 stated in such received bids are equal with respect to price, 176 quality and service, the Mississippi Industries for the Blind 177 shall be given preference. A similar preference shall be given to
- 180 SECTION 11. Any person who was an employee of the Forestry Commission who was laid off during Fiscal Year 2006 shall be given 181 182 first priority in any new employment by the commission.

It is the intention of the Legislature that the funds herein appropriated shall be expended in compliance with 184 185 Section 27-104-25, Mississippi Code of 1972, that no state agency 186 shall incur obligations or indebtedness in excess of their 187 appropriation and that the responsible officers, either personally 188 or upon their official bonds, shall be held responsible for 189 actions contrary to this provision.
