HOUSE BILL NO. 1628 (As Sent to Governor)

1 2 3	AN ACT MAKING AN APPROPRIATION FOR THE SUPPORT AND MAINTENANCE OF THE STATE FORESTRY COMMISSION FOR THE FISCAL YEAR $2024.$
4	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI:
5	SECTION 1. The following sum, or so much thereof as may be
6	necessary, is appropriated out of any money in the State General
7	Fund not otherwise appropriated, for the support and maintenance
8	of the State Forestry Commission for the fiscal year beginning
9	July 1, 2023, and ending June 30, 2024
10	\$ 15,732,212.00.
11	SECTION 2. The following sum, or so much thereof as may be
12	necessary, is appropriated out of any money in the special fund in
13	the State Treasury to the credit of the State Forestry Commission
14	which is comprised of special source funds collected by or
15	otherwise available to the commission, for the support and
16	maintenance of the commission for the fiscal year beginning
17	July 1, 2023, and ending June 30, 2024
18	\$ 13,600,367.00.

20	Thousand Dollars (\$250,000.00) shall be deposited in a fund
21	created in the State Treasury called the "Forest Improvement
22	Revolving Fund." Money in this fund shall be used by the State
23	Forestry Commission to assist in the reforestation and growth
24	improvement of the forests, woodlands, and publicly owned lands of
25	the state, including sixteenth section lands, Camp Shelby,
26	Columbia Training School and colleges and universities.
27	Landowners who contract with the commission for such work shall
28	pay to the commission its actual cost for conducting such work.
29	Money received for this work by the commission shall be paid into
30	the State Treasury, and the State Treasurer shall deposit such
31	money in the "Forest Improvement Revolving Fund."
32	SECTION 3. Of the funds appropriated under the provisions of
33	this act, the following positions are authorized:
34	AUTHORIZED HEADCOUNT:
35	Permanent: 343
36	Time-Limited: 7
37	With the funds herein appropriated, it shall be the agency's
38	responsibility to make certain that funds required for Personal
39	Services for Fiscal Year 2025 do not exceed Fiscal Year 2024 funds
40	appropriated for that purpose unless programs or positions are
41	added to the agency's Fiscal Year 2024 budget by the Mississippi
42	Legislature. The Legislature shall determine the agency's

personal services appropriation, which the State Personnel Board

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- 44 shall publish. The agency's personal services appropriation may
- 45 consist of restricted funds for approved vacancies for Fiscal Year
- 46 2024 that may not be utilized for active Fiscal Year 2023
- 47 Headcount. It shall be the agency's responsibility to ensure that
- 48 the funds provided for vacancies are used to increase headcount
- 49 and not for promotions, title changes, in-range salary adjustments
- 50 or any other mechanism for increasing salaries for current
- 51 employees. It is the Legislature's intention that no employee
- 52 salary falls below the minimum salary established by the
- 53 Mississippi State Personnel Board.
- Additionally, the State Personnel Board shall determine and
- 55 publish the projected annualized payroll costs based on current
- 56 employees. It shall be the responsibility of the agency head to
- 57 ensure that actual personnel expenditures for Fiscal Year 2024 do
- 58 not exceed the data provided by the Legislative Budget Office. If
- 59 the agency's Fiscal Year 2024 projected cost exceeds the
- 60 annualized costs, no salary actions shall be processed by the
- 61 State Personnel Board except for new hires determined to be
- 62 essential for the agency.
- Any transfers or escalations shall be made in accordance with
- 64 the terms, conditions, and procedures established by law or
- 65 allowable under the terms set forth within this act. The State
- 66 Personnel Board shall not escalate positions without written
- 67 approval from the Department of Finance and Administration. The
- 68 Department of Finance and Administration shall not provide written

- 69 approval to escalate any funds for salaries and/or positions
- 70 without proof of availability of new or additional funds above the
- 71 appropriated level.
- No general funds authorized to be expended herein shall be
- 73 used to replace federal funds and/or other special funds used for
- 74 salaries authorized under the provisions of this act and which are
- 75 withdrawn and no longer available.
- None of the funds herein appropriated shall be used in
- 77 violation of the Internal Revenue Service's Publication 15-A
- 78 relating to the reporting of income paid to contract employees, as
- 79 interpreted by the Office of the State Auditor.
- SECTION 4. It is the intention of the Legislature that the
- 81 State Forestry Commission shall maintain complete accounting and
- 82 personnel records related to the expenditure of all funds
- 83 appropriated under this act and that such records shall be in the
- 84 same format and level of detail as maintained for Fiscal Year
- 85 2023. It is further the intention of the Legislature that the
- 86 agency's budget request for Fiscal Year 2025 shall be submitted to
- 87 the Joint Legislative Budget Committee in a format and level of
- 88 detail comparable to the format and level of detail provided
- 89 during the Fiscal Year 2024 budget request process.
- 90 **SECTION 5.** In compliance with the "Mississippi Performance
- 91 Budget and Strategic Planning Act of 1994," it is the intent of
- 92 the Legislature that the funds provided herein shall be utilized
- 93 in the most efficient and effective manner possible to achieve the

94	intended mission of this agency. Based on the funding authorized,
95	this agency shall make every effort to attain the targeted
96	performance measures provided below:

114	A reporting of the degree to which the performance targets
115	set above have been or are being achieved shall be provided in the
116	agency's budget request submitted to the Joint Legislative Budget
117	Committee for Fiscal Year 2025.

118	SECTION 6. There is created in the State Treasury a fund
119	designated as the Volunteer Fire Department Equipment Conversion
120	Revolving Fund to be used by the State Forestry Commission to
121	assist in the conversion of vehicles acquired by the State
122	Forestry Commission through the Federal Excess Personal Property
123	Program or by volunteer fire departments through other means to
124	adapt them for use in the suppression of wildland fires. This
125	assistance shall be in the form of fabrication of water tanks or
126	other accessories necessary for the operation of fire suppression
127	units, installation of piping and valves, painting or other
128	similar or associated component work necessary to place fire
129	suppression equipment into service. It is not for general vehicle
130	maintenance or repair.
131	The Volunteer Fire Department Equipment Conversion Revolving
132	Fund shall be funded by monies received from charges for work and
133	services performed for volunteer fire departments by the State
134	Forestry Commission. Monies collected from such charges shall be
135	deposited into the Volunteer Fire Department Equipment Conversion
136	Revolving Fund. The State Treasurer shall make disbursements
137	therefrom for payment of materials, supplies and labor upon
138	requisition of the Forestry Commission and upon the issuance of
139	warrants therefor by the Department of Finance and Administration.
140	The amount of monies deposited into the Volunteer Fire
141	Department Equipment Conversion Fund through this work shall not
142	exceed Fifty Thousand Dollars (\$50,000.00). Funds in excess of

143	Fifty Thousand Dollars (\$50,000.00) shall be placed in the State
144	Forestry Commission's regular appropriated special funds. Monies
145	in this revolving fund are to be considered special funds and
146	shall be carried forward from one fiscal year to the next.
147	SECTION 7. There is created in the State Treasury a fund
148	designated as the Camden State Forest Revolving Fund to be used by
149	the State Forestry Commission to direct forest management
150	activities on the Camden State Forest in Madison County,
151	Mississippi. The forest management activities will include, but
152	not be limited to, maintenance of property, timber sale activities
153	and regeneration work.
154	The Camden State Forest Revolving Fund shall be funded by
155	monies received from timber sales, leases, and any other source.
156	Monies collected from these income sources shall be deposited into
157	the Camden State Forest Revolving Fund. The State Treasurer shall
158	make disbursements therefrom for payments of materials, supplies
159	and labor upon requisition of the State Forestry Commission and
160	upon the issuance of warrants therefor by the Department of
161	Finance and Administration.
162	It is the intention of the Legislature that any revolving
163	funds in excess of the budgeted amount needed for the necessary
164	operation and maintenance of all properties under the direct
165	supervision and management of the State Forestry Commission shall

remain in the Camden State Forest Revolving Fund for use in future

years.

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- 168 SECTION 8. Of the funds appropriated in Section 2, it is the
- 169 intention of the Legislature that Two Hundred Thousand Dollars
- 170 (\$200,000.00) shall be transferred to the Department of
- Agriculture and Commerce for the Beaver Control or Eradication 171
- 172 Program during the Fiscal Year 2024.
- 173 SECTION 9. Any funds in the Salary, Wages and Fringe
- 174 Benefits major object of expenditure may be used to purchase
- 175 accumulated compensatory time within the funds available.
- 176 SECTION 10. It is the intention of the Legislature that
- 177 whenever two (2) or more bids are received by this agency for the
- 178 purchase of commodities or equipment, and whenever all things
- 179 stated in such received bids are equal with respect to price,
- 180 quality and service, the Mississippi Industries for the Blind
- 181 shall be given preference. A similar preference shall be given to
- 182 the Mississippi Industries for the Blind whenever purchases are
- 183 made without competitive bids.
- 184 SECTION 11. It is the intention of the Legislature that the
- funds herein appropriated shall be expended in compliance with 185
- 186 Section 27-104-25, Mississippi Code of 1972, that no state agency
- 187 shall incur obligations or indebtedness in excess of their
- 188 appropriation and that the responsible officers, either personally
- 189 or upon their official bonds, shall be held responsible for
- 190 actions contrary to this provision.
- 191 SECTION 12. The money herein appropriated shall be paid by
- the State Treasurer out of any money in the State Treasury to the 192

193	credit of the proper fund or funds as set forth in this act, upon
194	warrants issued by the State Fiscal Officer; and the State Fiscal
195	Officer shall issue his warrants upon requisitions signed by the
196	proper person, officer or officers, in the manner provided by law
197	SECTION 13. This act shall take effect and be in force from
198	and after July 1, 2023.
