HOUSE BILL NO. 1805

- AN ACT TO AUTHORIZE THE BOARD OF SUPERVISORS OF JACKSON
 COUNTY, MISSISSIPPI, AS OWNERS OF SINGING RIVER HEALTH SYSTEM, TO
 BENTER INTO A MEMORANDUM OF UNDERSTANDING WITH THE MISSISSIPPI
 DEPARTMENT OF FINANCE AND ADMINISTRATION FOR THE DEVELOPMENT OF
 THE SINGING RIVER HEALTHCARE WORKFORCE ACADEMY; TO AUTHORIZE THE
 BOARD OF SUPERVISORS TO LEASE THE SINGING RIVER HEALTHCARE
 WORKFORCE ACADEMY TO THE PURCHASER OF SINGING RIVER HEALTH SYSTEM
 OR OTHER PERSONS; AND FOR RELATED PURPOSES.
- 9 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI:
- 10 **SECTION 1.** As used in this act:
- 11 (a) "Board of supervisors" and "board" means the Board of
 12 Supervisors of Jackson County, Mississippi.
- 13 (b) "County" means Jackson County, Mississippi.
- 14 (c) "DFA" means the Mississippi Department of Finance and
- 15 Administration, an agency of the State of Mississippi.
- 16 (d) "Health System" means the Singing River Health
- 17 System.
- 18 (e) "Healthcare workforce academy" and "project" means
- 19 the Singing River Healthcare Workforce Academy specified in
- 20 Section 29(b) of Senate Bill 3045, 2022 Regular Legislative
- 21 Session, Laws of 2022.

- (f) "Operator of the healthcare workforce academy" means
- 23 Singing River Health System, or its successor(s), purchaser(s),
- 24 manager(s), or other entity(ies) that the county approves to
- 25 purchase, lease, manage, or otherwise control Singing River Health
- 26 System or the healthcare workforce academy.
- 27 **SECTION 2.** When the board of supervisors finds and
- 28 determines that the public convenience and necessity require the
- 29 same, as evidenced by a resolution duly adopted and entered on the
- 30 official minutes of such board, the board of supervisors, in its
- 31 discretion, may assume all rights, responsibilities, and
- 32 obligations of the Health System under that certain memorandum of
- 33 understanding entered into between the Health System and DFA,
- 34 effective on or about March 3, 2022, for the purpose of
- 35 establishing the agreed upon conditions under which DFA may
- 36 disburse funds to assist the Health System in paying costs
- 37 associated with the healthcare workforce academy project specified
- 38 in Section 29(b) of Senate Bill 3045, 2022 Regular Legislative
- 39 Session, Laws of 2022.
- 40 **SECTION 3.** (1) The board of supervisors is hereby expressly
- 41 authorized and empowered to acquire by gift, purchase or
- 42 otherwise, and to own, hold, maintain, control and develop real
- 43 estate and personal property situated within the county, either
- 44 within or without the corporate limits of a municipality, for
- 45 development, use and operation as a healthcare workforce academy
- 46 and is further authorized and empowered to engage in works of

- 47 internal improvement therefor, including, but not limited to,
- 48 construction or contracting for the construction of streets,
- 49 roads, site improvements, and water, sewerage, drainage, pollution
- 50 and other related facilities necessary or required for the
- 51 development of said healthcare workforce academy, and to acquire,
- 52 purchase, install, lease, finance, construct, own, hold, equip,
- 53 control, maintain, use, operate and repair structures and
- 54 facilities necessary and convenient for the planning, development,
- 55 use, operation and maintenance of such healthcare workforce
- 56 academy. If the board takes by gift or otherwise any land,
- 57 buildings or other tangible assets from Singing River Health
- 58 System or any other persons, corporations, public or private for
- 59 the benefit, use or purpose of the healthcare workforce academy,
- 60 the board may assume all or any part of the liabilities resulting
- from such acceptance under such terms and conditions as will be in
- 62 the best interest of the citizens of the county.
- 63 (2) The board of supervisors is authorized and empowered to
- 64 sell, lease, trade, exchange or otherwise dispose of sites,
- 65 buildings, equipment and facilities to individuals, firms or
- 66 corporations, public or private, for all types of healthcare
- 67 workforce academy uses upon such terms and conditions, for such
- 68 consideration, and with such safeguards as will best promote and
- 69 protect the public interest, convenience and necessity, and to
- 70 execute options, deeds, leases, contracts, easements and other
- 71 legal instruments necessary or convenient therefor. The board may

- also contribute funds and/or resources directly to the development and cost of operation of the healthcare workforce academy.
- 74 (3) The board of supervisors is authorized and empowered to
 75 fix and prescribe fees, charges and rates, if any, for the use of
 76 any water, sewage, or other facilities constructed and operated in
 77 connection with the healthcare workforce academy and to collect
 78 the same from persons, firms and corporations using the same.
- 79 The board of supervisors is authorized and empowered to 80 employ engineers, attorneys, accountants, consultants and such executive and administrative personnel and other employees or 81 82 independent contractors as shall be reasonably necessary to carry 83 out the duties and authority authorized by this act, to determine 84 their qualifications and duties and to establish compensation and 85 other employment benefits as may be advisable to attract and retain proficient personnel. The board, in addition to all other 86 87 powers, is authorized and empowered to purchase, lease, sell and 88 trade office equipment, to purchase necessary office supplies, to purchase or lease any equipment and vehicles the board deems 89 90 necessary for the healthcare workforce academy to carry out the 91 purposes of this act. The board is authorized, in addition to all 92 other powers, to buy, lease, sell, convey and do all other 93 necessary business transactions for carrying out the purpose of 94 and administering the healthcare workforce academy and to do all 95 acts necessary and convenient to operate and carry out the duties of the board in relation to the project. 96

97	(5) The enumeration of any specific rights and powers
98	contained herein, and elsewhere in this act, where followed by
99	general powers, shall not be construed in a restrictive sense, but
100	rather in a broad and comprehensive sense as possible to
101	effectuate the purposes of this act. Nothing in this act should
102	be construed to limit, restrict, or otherwise alter the duties,
103	responsibilities and authority of the board of supervisors as
104	provided under the Mississippi Constitution of 1890 and the laws
105	of the State of Mississippi.

Any purchase agreement or lease pertaining to the healthcare workforce academy and to carry out the purposes of this act may be executed upon such terms and conditions, which shall be binding on any successor boards, and for such monetary rental or other consideration as may be found adequate or approved by the board in orders or resolutions authorizing the same. covenants and obligations of the purchaser or lessee to make expenditures in determined amounts, and within such time or times, for improvements to be erected on the land by such purchaser or lessee and to conduct thereon healthcare workforce academy operations in such aggregate payroll amounts and for such period of time or times as may be determined and defined in such purchase agreement or lease, or to give preference in employment where practicable to qualified residents of the county in which the project is situated, shall, if included in such purchase agreement or lease, constitute and be deemed sufficient consideration for

- the execution of any such purchase agreement or lease in the absence of a monetary rental or other consideration.
- 124 In addition to any other authority prescribed by law, 125 the board of supervisors, in its discretion, may issue bonds for 126 construction, improvement, operation and maintenance of the 127 healthcare workforce academy pursuant to the requirements and procedures of Sections 19-9-1 et seq., Mississippi Code of 1972, 128 129 and such bonds may be secured by the general obligation of the 130 county, any revenues generated by the project, or as otherwise provided by law. Any such indebtedness issued for the purposes of 131 132 this act shall not be subject to the debt limitations prescribed
 - (8) Not less than sixty (60) days prior to the end of its fiscal year, the operator of the healthcare workforce academy shall file with the board of supervisors a budget of projected revenues, expenses and other financial activities for the coming fiscal year for the project in a form satisfactory to the board of supervisors and, in addition thereto, as soon after the end of each fiscal year as practicable, the operator of the healthcare workforce academy shall file with the board of supervisors a copy of its certified audit and financial statement for the immediate past fiscal year of the project.
- SECTION 4. The board of supervisors is authorized and
 empowered to take all actions and expend any such funds as shall
 be necessary or determined to be in the public interest for the

- 147 promotion of the healthcare workforce academy in the county,
- 148 including, but not limited to expending such funds of the county
- as shall be necessary or determined in the public interest to 149
- 150 develop and promote the county's healthcare workforce, promote
- 151 available healthcare jobs within the county, and to develop and
- 152 promote such training programs for the same.
- 153 SECTION 5. The carrying out of the purposes of the
- 154 healthcare workforce academy is in all respects for the benefit of
- 155 the people of the county and is a public purpose, and the county
- 156 will be performing an essential governmental function in the
- 157 exercise of the powers conferred upon it by this act. Hence, any
- 158 property owned or held by the county or under its jurisdiction
- 159 under the provisions of this act shall be exempt from all taxation
- 160 in the State of Mississippi.
- 161 The notes specifically authorized by this act SECTION 6.
- 162 shall be exempt from all income taxation in the state and shall
- 163 not be included in any debt limit calculation.
- 164 SECTION 7. In addition to rights, duties and powers now or
- 165 hereafter conferred upon the board of supervisors, the board of
- 166 supervisors, is authorized and empowered, in its discretion, to
- 167 make available to the operator of the healthcare workforce academy
- 168 any revenue in the general fund of the county which is otherwise
- 169 unappropriated, for the purposes provided for in this act.
- 170 SECTION 8. The board of supervisors, in addition to the
- 171 monies which may be received by it from the sale of bonds, notes

and from the collection of revenues, rents and earnings derived under the provisions of this act, shall have the authority to accept from any public or private agency, or from any individual, grants for or in aid of the construction of the project, or for the payment of bonds, and to receive and accept contributions from any source of money or property or other things of value to be held, used and applied only for the purposes for which such grants or contributions may be made.

SECTION 9. (1) Notwithstanding any provision of this act to the contrary, the board of supervisors and the governing authorities of any municipality located within the county, may enter into a contract providing for the delivery of healthcare workforce development services to the municipality and contribution of funds by the municipality to the county for purposes of the project.

(2) The board of supervisors may enter into a contract or agreement with the governing body of any other local or regional economic or industrial development foundation, private economic development group, or other public entity or alliance for the purposes of promoting, attracting and locating healthcare workforce participants within the county.

SECTION 10. The board of supervisors is authorized to apply
194 for and accept grants and loans on behalf of the county for
195 promotion of the healthcare workforce academy in the county and
196 any contracting municipality from the State of Mississippi or the

197	United States or any agency thereof, and to contract with any
198	agency of the State of Mississippi and the United States for the
199	development of the healthcare workforce academy.

- section 11. This act shall be deemed to be full and complete authority for the exercise of the powers herein granted, but this act shall not be deemed to repeal or to be in derogation of any existing law of this state wherein projects of the character herein defined may be constructed or financed.
- SECTION 12. The board of supervisors is authorized and
 empowered to adopt any and all lawful resolutions, orders and/or
 ordinances, to execute such documents, contracts, leases,
 certificates and indentures, and to do and perform any and all
 acts and things necessary and requisite to carry out the purposes
 of this act.
- 211 **SECTION 13.** This act shall take effect and be in force from 212 and after its passage.
