HOUSE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION NO. 6

1 A CONCURRENT RESOLUTION TO DECLARE THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI 2 AS A "SECOND AMENDMENT SANCTUARY" STATE. WHEREAS, the Second Amendment of the United States 3 Constitution reads "A well regulated Militia, being necessary to 4 5 the security of a free State, the right of the people to keep and 6 bear Arms, shall not be infringed."; and 7 WHEREAS, the United States Supreme Court in District of Columbia v. Heller, 554 U.S. 570 (2008), affirmed an individual's 8 right to possess firearms, unconnected with service in a militia, 9 10 for traditionally lawful purposes, such as self-defense within the 11 home; and 12 WHEREAS, the United States Supreme Court in McDonald v. 13 Chicago, 561 U.S. 742 (2010), affirmed that the right of an individual to "keep and bear arms," as protected under the Second 14 15 Amendment, is incorporated by the Due Process Clause of the 16 Fourteenth Amendment against the states; and 17 WHEREAS, the United States Supreme Court in United States v. 18 Miller, 307 U.S. 174 (1939), opined that firearms that are part of 6 H. ordinary military equipment, or with use that could contribute to the common defense are protected by the Second Amendment; and WHEREAS, Article 3, Section 12, of the Constitution of the

22 State of Mississippi provides "The right of every citizen to keep 23 and bear arms in defense of his home, person, or property, or in 24 aid of the civil power when thereto legally summoned, shall not be 25 called in question, but the Legislature may regulate or forbid 26 carrying concealed weapons."; and

27 WHEREAS, Article 3, Section 5, of the Constitution of the 28 State of Mississippi reads "That all men are by nature equally 29 free and independent and have certain inherent rights, of which, 30 when they enter into the state of society, they cannot, by any 31 compact, deprive or divest their posterity; namely, the enjoyment 32 of life and liberty, with the means of acquiring and possessing 33 property, and pursuing and obtaining happiness and safety."; and

34 WHEREAS, Article 3, Section 14 of the Constitution of the 35 State of Mississippi reads "No person shall be deprived of life, 36 liberty, or property except by due process of law."; and

37 WHEREAS, certain legislation which has or may be introduced 38 in the United States Congress could have the effect of infringing 39 on the rights of law-abiding citizens to keep and bear arms, as 40 guaranteed by the Second Amendment to the United States 41 Constitution and Article 3, Section 12 of the Constitution of the 42 State of Mississippi; and

H. C. R. No. 6 **~ OFFICIAL ~** 23/HR26/R419 PAGE 2 (MCL\KW) 43 WHEREAS, the Legislature is concerned about the passage of 44 any bill containing language which could be interpreted as 45 infringing the rights of the citizens of the State of Mississippi 46 to keep and bear arms; and

WHEREAS, the Legislature wishes to express its deep commitment to the rights of all citizens of Mississippi to keep and bear arms; and

50 WHEREAS, the Legislature wishes to express opposition to any 51 law that would unconstitutionally restrict the rights of the 52 citizens of Mississippi to keep and bear arms; and

53 WHEREAS, the Legislature wishes to express its intent to stand as a Sanctuary State for Second Amendment rights and to 54 oppose, within the limits of the Constitution of the United States 55 56 and the Constitution of the State of Mississippi, any efforts to 57 unconstitutionally restrict such rights, and to use such legal 58 means at its disposal to protect the rights of the citizens of 59 Mississippi to keep and bear arms, including through legal action, the power to appropriate public funds, the right to petition for 60 61 redress of grievances, and the power to direct the law enforcement 62 and employees of the State of Mississippi to not enforce any 63 unconstitutional law:

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE HOUSE OF
REPRESENTATIVES OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI, THE SENATE CONCURRING
THEREIN, That we do hereby declare the State of Mississippi, as a
"Second Amendment Sanctuary" state.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, That the Legislature hereby expresses its intent that public funds of the state not be used to restrict the Second Amendment rights of the citizens of Mississippi, or to aid federal agencies in the restriction of those rights.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, That the Legislature hereby declares its intent to oppose any infringement on the right of law-abiding citizens to keep and bear arms using such legal means as may be expedient, including, without limitation, court action.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, That copies of this resolution befurnished to members of the Capitol Press Corps.
