HOUSE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION NO. 38

1 A CONCURRENT RESOLUTION COMMENDING THE DISTINGUISHED AND 2 LAUDABLE LEGISLATIVE CAREER OF FORMER REPRESENTATIVE, THE 3 HONORABLE DEBRA HENDRICKS GIBBS AND CONGRATULATING HER UPON BEING 4 ELECTED TO THE BENCH AS CIRCUIT COURT JUDGE OF DISTRICT 7, PLACE 2, HINDS COUNTY, MISSISSIPPI. 5 6 WHEREAS, in the November 29, 2022, runoff election, the 7 citizens of Hinds County returned to the polls to elect former 8 State Representative and daughter of the late Mrs. Ann Augusta 9 Hendricks Page, the Honorable Debra Hendricks Gibbs, to the post 10 of Circuit Court Judge of District 7, Place 2, Hinds County, 11 Mississippi, while simultaneously relaying bittersweet 12 confirmation of an official changing of the guard in the post held for the last six years by a visionary leader, friend, lawmaker and 13 14 respected jurist; and 15 WHEREAS, the distinguished Gentle Lady from Hinds County, 16 Mississippi, an honored and cherished member of the Mississippi 17 House of Representatives, revered for her legal expertise and credible passion for public service, Representative Debra 18 Hendricks Gibbs's election to the bench brings a climactic end to 19

25 WHEREAS, a native of Gulfport, Mississippi, Representative 26 Gibbs has made the fulfillment of public service the extent of her 27 life's work and professional career, serving both the public and 28 private sectors, after earning her baccalaureate degree in 29 business administration from the University of Southern 30 Mississippi and M.B.A. from Mississippi College; and

31 WHEREAS, before embarking upon her journey of jurisprudence, 32 Representative Gibbs initially commenced her professional career as an accountant with Mississippi Power and Light (now Entergy) 33 before transferring to the realm of collegiate academia as 34 35 instructor and founding Director of Center for Professional 36 Development for Jackson State University, and subsequent thereto, accepting a position as Director of Accounting and Finance for the 37 38 Mississippi Department of Human Services, where she formulated 39 policies and regulations to ensure agency compliance with state 40 and federal objections; and

WHEREAS, it was during her tenure at MDHS as the agency's guardian of compliance that Representative Gibbs was compelled to make a return to the classroom, not in an instructor's capacity, but once again assuming the role of an eager and ambitious student

WHEREAS, now equipped with an adept understanding of the 51 52 letter and analysis of the law, Representative Gibbs returned to 53 an immersive experience in the tapestry of public service as a law 54 clerk at the Mississippi Supreme Court, familiarizing herself with 55 a keen awareness of court etiquette that quided her path as a 56 litigious arbiter of the law as she prepared to take flight as a 57 solo practitioner, wherein such capacity, her objectivity and fairness positioned her for appointment as commissioner of the 58 59 Mississippi Workers Compensation Commission; and

60 WHEREAS, after concluding her appointment as commissioner, 61 and having effectively served in the executive and judicial branches of government, Representative Gibbs was poised to 62 63 successfully fulfill her legislative role at the time of her 64 election and vowed to be a conduit of innovative and progressive 65 collaboration between all three branches of government, as well as 66 local elected officials, while successfully balancing dual roles 67 as an officer of the court and state policymaker to ensure a 68 better quality of life for all, by forging a trail of consensus and relationship building which has manifested itself in the 69

72 WHEREAS, gaining stature as a prominent yet formidable 73 politician, the Lady from Hinds' abilities and talent were 74 immediately recognized by her colleagues, and when combined with 75 her strong work ethic, she quickly rose from freshman lawmaker and 76 Vice Chairman of the House Tourism Committee, which oversees 77 policy that governs the state's fourth largest stream of commerce, 78 which generated more than \$677 Million in revenue for the State 79 General Fund in 2021, to an influential purveyor of equity, who 80 remained true to her promise of accountability through implementation of her townhall constituent-based accessibility 81 82 with the District 72 Day; and

83 WHEREAS, over the course of her storied legislative career, Representative Gibbs's diligence and devotion to the office to 84 85 which she was elected have been fueled by the desire to make the 86 quality of life better for her immediate constituency base and the entire citizenry of the Hospitality State, as she has endeavored 87 88 with feverish propensity through her vocal participation on the 89 House committees to which she was assigned, including: Banking 90 and Financial Services, Education, Ethics, Judiciary A, Judiciary 91 B, Judiciary En Banc, Medicaid, Municipalities and Tourism; and 92 WHEREAS, Representative Gibbs's love and deeply felt respect 93 for the Legislature as a hallowed institution has led her to fight

WHEREAS, during her tenure in the House, Representative Gibbs maintained a strong role in every meaningful initiative addressed by the Mississippi Legislature, including economic development, fiscal affairs, education, gaming, public health, transportation, agriculture, and election reform initiatives and programs; and

106 WHEREAS, a rare leader who was able to lead effectively and 107 serve with humility while demonstrating fair and even-handed 108 stewardship of the office to which she was elected, Representative Gibbs is equally committed to the fulfillment of her social and 109 110 civic obligations, as made evident through her community activism 111 and professional associations, including: New Hope Baptist Church; The LeFleur's Bluff (MS) Chapter of the Links, Inc.; Jack 112 113 and Jill of America, Inc. (Life Member); Alpha Kappa Alpha 114 Sorority, Inc. (Life Member); Mississippi Bar Association; 115 Magnolia Bar Association; Mississippi Women Lawyers Association; 116 Women for Progress of Mississippi, Inc.; Metro Jackson Black Women 117 Lawyers Association; and the Capital Area Bar Association; and 118 WHEREAS, because of her steadfast allegiance to the legal

WHEREAS, admired for her ability for building consensus in the Legislature regardless of the issues at hand, it is with the same deference that her ascent to the bench is both essential and most appropriate to carry forward the service to the citizens of Hinds County, who avail themselves of the judicial system; and
