A CONCURRENT RESOLUTION URGING THE CENTERS FOR DISEASE

2 CONTROL AND PREVENTION TO INCLUDE NEW IMMUNIZATION TECHNOLOGIES 3 FOR RESPIRATORY SYNCYTIAL VIRUS IN THE VACCINES FOR CHILDREN PROGRAM. 5 WHEREAS, respiratory syncytial virus (RSV), a highly transmissible, seasonal virus which may have severe and 6 7 unpredictable outcomes for infants, is the leading cause of hospitalization among infants in the United States; and 8 WHEREAS, RSV is the most common cause of bronchiolitis 9 10 (inflammation of the small airways in the lung) and pneumonia 11 (infection of the lungs) in children younger than one year of age 12 in the United States; and WHEREAS, the current RSV season has resulted in significant 13
