HOUSE RESOLUTION NO. 65

1 A RESOLUTION HONORING THE LIFE AND LEGACY OF MR. RONALD 2 "RONNIE" LEWIS BUCKLEY, AND EXPRESSING DEEPEST SYMPATHY TO HIS 3 FAMILY AND FRIENDS UPON HIS PASSING.

19 served as head of the journalism department at the University of 20 Southern Mississippi from 1954 until 1963, and as department chair, Dr. Buckley acquired a press for the Student Printz, making 21 22 the university the first in the country to have its own printing 23 operation and allowing students the full experience of newspaper 24 production, and Mr. Buckley followed in his father's footsteps, especially with the printing press, as Buckley Newspapers had one 25 26 of the last locally-owned presses running in Mississippi until two 27 years ago; and

28 WHEREAS, Mr. Buckley and his father started Buckley 29 Newspapers in 1967, and nine years later he came up with the idea 30 to mail a free paper during a time when paid publications were the 31 industry trend, and his idea, called the *Impact*, was later mailed 32 to dozens of zip codes and over 200,000 homes every week, allowing 33 Mr. Buckley to do business with some of the largest companies in 34 the United States; and

35 WHEREAS, Mr. Buckley enjoyed the wonderful things that life 36 had to offer, including fishing, following Southern Miss sports, 37 traveling, and going to church, where he often led the singing, 38 and he was always a ready partner for a good meal, which would be 39 accompanied by a hearty discussion of religion, business, sports, 40 or politics, and he loved conversations about the Bible and his 41 Lord Jesus more than all the other topics; and

42 WHEREAS, devoted to his family, Mr. Buckley could be seen at 43 local games where his grandkids played, still cheering them on
