1 A RESOLUTION RECOGNIZING AND COMMENDING HEAD COACH T.C. 2 TAYLOR FOR BEING NAMED HEAD COACH FOR THE JACKSON STATE UNIVERSITY 3 FOOTBALL TEAM. 4 WHEREAS, Head Coach T.C. Taylor, one of the greatest Jackson State University (JSU) Tigers to ever don the Blue and White, has 5 ascended to the position of head coach at his alma mater; and 6 WHEREAS, Coach Taylor has been named the 22nd head coach for 7 JSU football, and he officially took the reins of the program 8 9 following the conclusion of the Celebration Bowl; and WHEREAS, the former JSU quarterback and wide receiver has 10 11 been a part of the Jackson State football staff since 2019, 12 coaching tight ends and wide receivers, and has played a key role 13 in a historic run over the past two seasons of Tiger football; and 14 WHEREAS, JSU posted a 23-3 record over the past two seasons, 15 winning back-to-back Southwestern Athletic Conference (SWAC) 16 championships and posting consecutive undefeated conference

27	Taylor's experience working with JSU's student-athletes, along

31	WHEREAS, as an assistant coach at JSU, Coach Taylor has
32	helped develop some of the best receivers in the SWAC, and prior

35	WHEREAS, a native of McComb, Mississippi, Coach Taylor played
36	quarterback and wide receiver at JSU from 1998 through 2001,
37	starting off as a signal caller for two-and-a-half seasons before
38	switching to wide receiver, and in just nineteen games as a
39	receiver, he amassed 188 catches for 1,793 yards; and
10	WHEREAS, as a senior, Coach Taylor broke the JSU
11	single-season record with 84 receptions for 1,234 yards, and
12	eleven touchdowns, earning NCAA Division I-AA Third-Team

- 45 Network, and he was also the runner-up for the 2001 Conerly
- 46 Trophy, presented to Mississippi's top college football player,

- WHEREAS, prior to returning to JSU as assistant coach in
- 49 2019, Coach Taylor coached at North Carolina Central University
- 50 (NCCU) from 2014 through 2018, where he coached quarterbacks and
- 51 served as offensive coordinator; and
- 52 WHEREAS, at NCCU, Coach Taylor helped guide the Eagles to
- 53 three MEAC championships in 2014, 2015 and 2016, and in 2016, the
- 54 team went unbeaten in conference play and qualified for the Air
- 55 Force Reserve Celebration Bowl; and
- 56 WHEREAS, under Coach Taylor's quidance, in 2016, NCCU set a
- 57 record for total offense in a single season, and in 2014, Coach
- 58 Taylor's unit set a program record for passes completed in a
- 59 season, and from 2014 through 2018, he coached 28 All-MEAC
- 60 offensive players and five All-Americans; and
- 61 WHEREAS, Coach Taylor spent the prior two seasons, 2012
- 62 through 2013, at Texas Southern University as the wide receivers'
- 63 coach and recruiting coordinator; and
- 64 WHEREAS, from 2005 through 2011, Coach Taylor coached at
- 65 Coahoma Community College in Clarksdale, Mississippi, starting as
- 66 the quarterbacks' and wide receivers' coach, and spending the
- 67 final six years as offensive coordinator, and his offenses ranked

74 WHEREAS, dedicated to academic excellence, Coach Taylor
75 graduated from Jackson State with a bachelor's degree in health,
76 physical education and recreation in 2005, and outside of his
77 outstanding coaching career, he is married to Dawn, and they have
78 two sons, Tre and Tylan; and

WHEREAS, it is the policy of the House of Representatives to recognize and commend exceptional Mississippians, especially those such as Coach Taylor, whose dedication and excellence on and off the field brings honor to Jackson State University and to the State of Mississippi:

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI, That we do hereby recognize and commend Head Coach T.C. Taylor for being named head coach for the Jackson State University Football Team, and express best wishes for continued success in all his future endeavors.
