18	WHEREAS, she has faithfully and honorably served the 172nd
19	Airlift Wing and the State of Mississippi since joining in 2005,

- 20 amassed 997 hours with 68 combat sorties as a C-17 co-pilot and
- 21 183rd Airlift Squadron Executive Officer and courageously clocked
- 22 291.1 combat hours flying strategic airlift operations during
- 23 Operation Iraqi Freedom earning herself two Air Medals and one
- 24 Aerial Achievement Medal for her flying operations; and
- 25 WHEREAS, she spent countless hours executing squadron
- 26 functions and maintaining the health, morale and welfare of
- 27 everyone to whom she was assigned, and during her tenure, the unit
- 28 achieved unprecedented accomplishments in multiple MAJCOM
- 29 inspections, received the ANG AES of the year award twice, and
- 30 deployed hundreds of members globally over numerous domestic and
