HOUSE RESOLUTION NO. 108

1 A RESOLUTION COMMENDING THE DISTINGUISHED CAREER, SELFLESS 2 SERVICE AND ENDURING CONTRIBUTIONS OF MRS. COLLEEN HARTFIELD 3 RENDERED TO HINDS COMMUNITY COLLEGE. 4 WHEREAS, Mrs. Colleen Hartfield, former vice president for Community Relations and Governmental Affairs for Hinds Community 5 College, retired June 30, 2016 with a combined 18 years of service 6 to the institution, and a combined total of 37 years shared 7 between Hinds and Mississippi Gulf Coast Community Colleges; and 8 9 WHEREAS, Mrs. Hartfield, who is described as a passionate, persistent, positive and consummate professional, earned both her 10 11 bachelor's and master's degrees from Southeast Missouri State University, and completed Mississippi State University's Community 12 College Leadership Program and the Education Policy Fellowship 13 14 Program; and WHEREAS, now serving as president of Hartfield Creative and 15 16 Consulting, Mrs. Hartfield spent the first eight years of her career as assistant director of Public Relations for Hinds after 17

her initial hire in 1984 and subsequent promotion to district

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- 19 director of Public Relations in 1985, before departing in 1992 to
- 20 spend the next 14 years at Mississippi Gulf Coast Community
- 21 College, where she rose in the ranks to vice president for
- 22 Institutional Relations; and
- 23 WHEREAS, the ultimate pacesetter, Mrs. Hartfield organized
- 24 the first statewide Community College Month Celebration, and
- 25 became one of the youngest individuals to receive Hinds'
- 26 prestigious 3E Award in acknowledgement of her work with the
- 27 Mississippi Association of Community and Junior Colleges (MACJC)
- 28 on its legislative affairs, a capacity in which she functioned to
- 29 showcase her innate ability to craft communication pieces,
- 30 organize advocacy efforts for the state's 15 community colleges,
- 31 helped secure funding and develop policy that advanced all
- 32 community colleges; and
- 33 WHEREAS, Mrs. Hartfield returned to Hinds in 2006, assuming
- 34 President's Cabinet level responsibilities, and because of her
- 35 visionary leadership skills, her areas of responsibility grew
- 36 until she oversaw marketing, public relations, community
- 37 relations, sports information, student publications, adult
- 38 education, grants management, economic development and
- 39 governmental relations; and
- 40 WHEREAS, while managing internal and external communications
- 41 for the college, Mrs. Hartfield's role expanded as the needs of
- 42 the college and its service district changed, initiating the
- 43 college's first grants office in 2009 and working to bring

- 44 millions of dollars in external funding to Hinds as a staunch
- 45 advocate for adult education and economically disadvantaged
- 46 students who labored to expand Hinds' efforts to serve high school
- 47 dropouts and at-risk students through the Gateway to College,
- 48 Single Stop, MI-BEST and the Minority Male (M2M) Leadership
- 49 Initiative programs; and
- 50 WHEREAS, her integrity, knowledge of the system and her
- 51 ability to bring all community colleges together with a common
- 52 voice were the most valuable assets to her approach to service
- 53 that would benefit not just the student body, but every community
- 54 touched by the college footprint, as evidenced by her
- 55 collaboration with Dr. Chad Stocks, vice president for Workforce
- 56 Development and Career/Technical Education, to help Mississippi
- 57 land the state's largest economic development package, Continental
- 58 Tire, which is located a short drive away from the Raymond campus;
- 59 and
- 60 WHEREAS, after retiring in 2016, Mrs. Hartfield returned to
- 61 Hinds as executive assistant to the president for special
- 62 projects, and continued to serve as a legislative liaison, in
- 63 addition to directing the nation's largest Predominantly Black
- 64 Institution (PBI) federal grant and serving as the Institute for
- 65 Evidence-Based Change's (IEBC) Caring Campus Liaison for the
- 66 college; and
- 67 WHEREAS, upon her second retirement from Hinds, Mrs.
- 68 Hartfield established Hartfield Creative and Consulting to work

69	with	higher	education	institutions	and	other	entities	dedicated	to

- 70 improving the lives of Mississippians; and
- 71 WHEREAS, the 2015 recipient of the Women in Higher Education
- 72 Mississippi Network's Leadership Award, Mrs. Hartfield currently
- 73 serves on the board of directors for 2nd Chance Mississippi, which
- 74 supports adult education students at community colleges, and on
- 75 the Mississippi Balance of State Continuum of Care Governing
- 76 Council, which is devoted to homelessness prevention; and
- 77 WHEREAS, it is the policy of the House of Representatives to
- 78 recognize the selfless dedication and passion of remarkable
- 79 individuals such as Mrs. Hartfield, whose heart for improving the
- 80 outcomes and empowering entire communities is personified through
- 81 her service to the State of Mississippi's community college system
- 82 and beyond, and established as an exemplary benchmark of
- 83 excellence:
- NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE HOUSE OF
- 85 REPRESENTATIVES OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI, That we do hereby
- 86 commend the distinguished career, selfless service and enduring
- 87 contributions of Mrs. Colleen Hartfield rendered to Hinds
- 88 Community College, express grateful appreciation for the strides
- 89 undertaken to advance the state's community college system, and
- 90 extend best wishes for continued success in all her future
- 91 endeavors.
