HOUSE RESOLUTION NO. 112

A RESOLUTION MOURNING THE LOSS AND COMMEMORATING THE LIFE AND LEGACY OF FORMER REPRESENTATIVE LEONARD HENDERSON AND EXPRESSING DEEPEST SYMPATHY TO HIS FAMILY AND FRIENDS UPON HIS PASSING.

- 4 WHEREAS, it is written in II Corinthians 4:17-18, "For our
- 5 light affliction, which is but for a moment, worketh for us a far
- 6 more exceeding and eternal weight of glory," and as such, the
- 7 immaculate author and finisher of our soul's destiny summoned the
- 8 mortal presence of former Representative Leonard Henderson to rest
- 9 eternally, on Saturday, March 4, 2023; and
- 10 WHEREAS, the Clarksdale Community of Coahoma County,
- 11 Mississippi, lost a devoted public servant, revered educator,
- 12 community activist and friend with the passing of Representative
- 13 Henderson, born on September 15, 1944, in Clarksdale, to the late
- 14 Ms. Bessie Henderson and Mr. Leonard Price, and raised by his late
- 15 grandparents, Mrs. Georgia Hall-Coleman and Mr. Floyd Coleman, and
- 16 there is now a hush in our hearts as we come together to pay our
- 17 respects to the memory of one who has been called to join that
- 18 innumerable heavenly caravan; and

19	WHEREAS, reared on the important tenets of educational
20	success, spiritual fellowship and service to mankind,
21	Representative Henderson received his formal education at W.A.
22	Higgins High School, graduating with the class of 1963, and
23	subsequently matriculating through his postsecondary education
24	curricula at: Coahoma Community College, earning an associate of
25	arts degree in health education in 1965; Jackson State University,
26	earning a bachelor of science degree in physical education in
27	1967; Tennessee State University, earning a masters of education
28	degree in health in 1972; and completing his postgraduate studies
29	at Jackson State University, earning an education specialist
30	degree in educational administration and supervision in 1980; and
31	WHEREAS, in fulfillment of the principles of service innately
32	embedded in his lineal fabric, Representative Henderson's
33	inaugural immersion into public service entailed his 1967
34	assumption of the role of athletic director and head basketball
35	coach at Coahoma Agricultural High School, wherein during his
36	three-year tenure, he amassed a 60-10 record before transitioning
37	to recreation director for the City of Nashville's Metro Parks and
38	Recreation Department in 1970, while simultaneously serving as a
39	graduate assistant during his master's program at Tennessee State
40	University until 1971; and
41	WHEREAS, Representative Henderson returned to his beloved
42	Clarksdale in 1971 to once again serve Coahoma Agricultural High
43	School, but this time as assistant principal and head basketball

- 44 coach until 1974, building upon his proven record of athletic
- 45 success with an additional 49-15 record before sharing his
- 46 instructional and coaching acumen at the postsecondary educational
- 47 level as assistant head basketball coach and assistant professor
- 48 of physical education at Mississippi Valley State University until
- 49 1979, where his collegiate coaching statistics consisted of a
- 50 75-56 record over the course of five seasons; and
- 51 WHEREAS, before making a 14-year return to elementary and
- 52 secondary education as principal of Clarksdale's Riverton
- 53 Elementary School in 1982, Representative Henderson undertook
- 54 several intermittent assignments at the postsecondary level,
- 55 including serving as a graduate assistant and media specialist for
- 56 the Crossover Project in the Office of Continuing Education at
- 57 Jackson State University, and as director of special services at
- 58 East Central Junior College; and
- 59 WHEREAS, fate would lend itself to being built in accordance
- 60 with the blueprint divinely designed for the pattern of his life
- 61 by the Great Deity and grand architect of our lives' destiny, when
- 62 his love, chivalry and affection pierced the heart of the former
- 63 Miss Cal Couthern, and the duo became bone of one another's bone
- 64 and flesh of one another's flesh after exchanging the nuptials of
- 65 holy matrimony, building a lifetime of memories, and blessed with
- 66 the fruitful addition of a son and daughter, into whose lineal
- 67 fabric the embedded moral tenets of love, honor, integrity and the
- 68 bountiful blessings of God's amazing grace and tender mercies,

- 71 WHEREAS, in 1995, Representative Henderson, sought to expand
- 72 his reach of public service by engaging in the rigorous process of
- 73 seeking political office, which proved to be a timely and seamless
- 74 transition upon the conclusion of his educational career with his
- 75 successful bid for election to the Mississippi House of
- 76 Representatives as State Representative of District 26,
- 77 encompassing Coahoma County, and wherein he served for one term
- 78 from 1996 through 2000, lending his intrepid leadership,
- 79 analytical voice and methodical approach to state service on the
- 80 House Committees on Agriculture, Education and Interstate
- 81 Cooperation, while also managing the responsibilities as the City
- 82 of Clarksdale's Director of Personnel/Safety from 1998 through
- 83 2000; and
- WHEREAS, upon the conclusion of his brief yet effective
- 85 career as an elected state official, Representative Henderson
- 86 would conclude his career of public service in 2006 as a security
- 87 specialist with the Department of Homeland Security before
- 88 officially entering into retirement; and
- 89 WHEREAS, a God-fearing Christian before all other roles he
- 90 assumed, Representative Henderson followed very closely in the
- 91 fulfillment of his responsibilities as a loving husband and doting
- 92 father, the standard-bearer of generosity, whose banner of
- 93 excellence was attached to modesty and humble humility, was the

- 94 living embodiment of a man who lived his life seeking the very
- 95 heart of God by being of service to mankind as a member of Chapel
- 96 Hill Missionary Baptist Church; and
- 97 WHEREAS, deeply entrenched in his commitment to activism
- 98 through political, social and civic engagement, Representative
- 99 Henderson's professional and civic affiliations include: the
- 100 Mississippi Legislative Black Caucus; National Black Caucus of
- 101 State Legislators; Mississippi Association of School
- 102 Administrators; National Education Association, Clarksdale
- 103 Association of Education; Commander of American Legion Post #203;
- 104 Master Mason of M.W. Stringer Grand Lodge, Elks Lodge 556
- 105 I.P.B.O.E.W. of Clarksdale; board of trustees for Northwest
- 106 Mississippi Regional Medical Center; vice president of the Coahoma
- 107 County Chapter and member of the Board of Directors of the Jackson
- 108 State University National Alumni Association; and president of the
- 109 Greenville Chapter of Kappa Alpha Psi Fraternity, Inc., Alumni
- 110 Association; and
- 111 WHEREAS, though he has traversed life's river to reunite in
- 112 glorious fanfare with his parents and grandparents, who
- 113 transitioned to eternity before him, the legacy of Representative
- 114 Henderson's indelible imprint will continue to refresh fond
- 115 memories of his beloved survivors: devoted and loving wife, Cal
- 116 Couthern Henderson; children, Brian James and Leonette Henderson;
- 117 grandchildren, Khari Owens, Jessica James, Brianna James and
