HOUSE RESOLUTION NO. 185

1 A RESOLUTION COMMENDING THE MOST HONORABLE AND DISTINGUISHED 2 GENTLEMAN FROM CHICKASAW, REPRESENTATIVE DE'KEITHER A. STAMPS, FOR 3 HIS ESTEEMED AND LAUDABLE LEGISLATIVE CAREER AND PUBLIC SERVICE 4 UPON THE OCCASION OF HIS DEPARTURE FROM THE MISSISSIPPI HOUSE OF 5 REPRESENTATIVES.

6 WHEREAS, the honorable and distinguished Gentleman from 7 Chickasaw, Representative De'Keither A. Stamps, has announced his plans not to seek reelection to the Mississippi House of 8 Representatives at the conclusion of the 2020-2024 term of the 9 10 Legislature, as he has qualified to seek the office of Mississippi Public Service Commission, after tirelessly working on behalf of 11 12 the citizens of Mississippi and House District 66, of Hinds County, marking an end to two and one-half years of legislative 13 14 service in the hallowed halls of the Mississippi State Capitol; 15 and

16 WHEREAS, before assuming his seat as the member of the House 17 of Representatives from District 66, Representative Stamps, a 18 graduate of Crystal Springs High School, immediately answered the 19 call to patriotic duty to defend Lady Liberty against all domestic

and foreign threats to the preservation of democracy by enlisting in the United States Marine Corps, where he spent three years on Presidential Security for President Clinton before concluding his career as a Devil Dog in 2002 after completing a three-year overseas assignment for the State Department in Africa, Switzerland and the United Kingdom; and

26 WHEREAS, upon his election to the House of Representatives in 27 the 2020 special election to fill the seat vacated by former 28 Representative Jarvis Dortch, De'Keither A.
