## SENATE BILL NO. 2092

- AN ACT TO AMEND SECTION 89-1-23, MISSISSIPPI CODE OF 1972, TO PROVIDE THAT NONRESIDENT ALIENS WHO ARE CITIZENS OF A COUNTRY THAT IS HOSTILE TO THE INTERESTS OF THE UNITED STATES OR A COUNTRY THAT IS A KNOWN VIOLATOR OF HUMAN RIGHTS MAY NOT HOLD LAND, DISPOSE OF IT OR TRANSMIT IT BY DESCENT; AND FOR RELATED PURPOSES.
- 6 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI:
- 7 **SECTION 1.** Section 89-1-23, Mississippi Code of 1972, is
- 8 amended as follows:
- 9 89-1-23. (1) Resident aliens may acquire and hold land, and
- 10 may dispose of it and transmit it by descent, as citizens of the
- 11 state may. Except as otherwise provided in this section,
- 12 nonresident aliens shall not hereafter acquire or hold land, but a
- 13 nonresident alien may have or take a lien on land to secure a
- 14 debt, and at any sale thereof to enforce payment of the debt may
- 15 purchase the same, and thereafter hold it, not longer than twenty
- 16 (20) years, with full power during said time to sell the land, in
- 17 fee, to a citizen; or he may retain it by becoming a citizen
- 18 within that time. All land held or acquired contrary to this
- 19 section shall escheat to the state; but a title to real estate in

- 20 the name of a citizen of the United States, or a person who has
- 21 declared his intention of becoming a citizen, whether resident or
- 22 nonresident, if he be a purchaser or holder, shall not be
- 23 forfeited or escheated by reason of the alienage of any former
- 24 owner or other person.
- 25 (2) Any person who was or is a citizen of the United States
- 26 and became or becomes an alien by reason of marriage to a citizen
- 27 of a foreign country, may hereafter inherit, or if he or she
- 28 heretofore inherited or acquired or hereafter inherits, may hold,
- 29 own, transmit by descent or transfer land free from any escheat to
- 30 the State of Mississippi, if said land has not heretofore
- 31 escheated by final valid order or decree of a court of competent
- 32 jurisdiction.
- 33 (3) Nonresident aliens who are citizens of Syria or the
- 34 Lebanese Republic may inherit property from citizens or residents
- 35 of the State of Mississippi.
- 36 (4) Nonresident aliens may acquire and hold not to exceed
- 37 three hundred twenty (320) acres of land in this state for the
- 38 purpose of industrial development thereon. In addition, any
- 39 nonresident alien may acquire and hold not to exceed five (5)
- 40 acres of land for residential purposes. The nonresident alien may
- 41 dispose of any such land, but if any land acquired for industrial
- 42 development ceases to be used for industrial development while
- 43 owned by a nonresident alien, it shall escheat to the state. The
- 44 limitation set forth in this paragraph shall not apply to

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- 46 owned by nonresident aliens; and title to real estate acquired by,
- 47 and held in the name of, any corporation, limited partnership,
- 48 general partnership, limited liability partnership, limited
- 49 liability company, joint venture, joint stock company or business
- 50 trust organized and existing under the laws of the State of
- 51 Mississippi or of any other state or the federal laws of the
- 52 United States of America for purposes of development thereon of
- one or more projects, as defined in Section 57-75-5(f)(xxxi),
- 54 shall not be forfeited or escheated by reason of the alienage of
- 55 any former owner or other person if said land has not heretofore
- 56 escheated to the State of Mississippi by final valid order or
- 57 decree of a court of competent jurisdiction.
- 58 (5) Notwithstanding any other provision of law, nonresident
- 59 aliens who are citizens of a country that is hostile to the
- 60 interests of the United States or a country that is a known
- 61 violator of human rights may not hold land, dispose of it or
- 62 transmit it by descent.
- 63 **SECTION 2.** This act shall take effect and be in force from
- 64 and after July 1, 2023.
