SENATE BILL NO. 2123

1 AN ACT TO AMEND SECTION 97-41-23, MISSISSIPPI CODE OF 1972, 2 TO INCREASE THE PENALTIES FOR HARMING PUBLIC SERVICE ANIMALS; AND 3 FOR RELATED PURPOSES. BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI: 4 SECTION 1. Section 97-41-23, Mississippi Code of 1972, is 5 amended as follows: 6 97-41-23. (1) It is unlawful for any person to willfully 7 and maliciously taunt, torment, tease, beat, strike, or to 8 9 administer, expose or inject any desensitizing drugs, chemicals or substance to any public service animal. Any person who violates 10 11 this section is guilty of a misdemeanor, and upon conviction 12 thereof shall be fined not more than * * * Five Hundred Dollars (\$500.00) and be imprisoned not more than * * * sixty (60) days, 13 14 or both. Any person who, without just cause, purposely kills or 15 (2) 16 injures any public service animal is quilty of a felony and upon

17 conviction shall be fined not more than Five Thousand Dollars

18 (\$5,000.00) and be imprisoned not more than $* * * \frac{\text{fifteen (15)}}{19}$ 19 years, or both.

20 (3) For purposes of this section, the term "public service 21 animal" means any animal trained and used to assist a law 22 enforcement agency, public safety entity or search and rescue 23 agency.

(4) A conviction and imposition of a sentence under this
section does not prevent a conviction and imposition of a sentence
under Section 97-41-16 pertaining to the offenses of simple or
aggravated cruelty to a dog or cat, or under any other applicable
provision of law.

(5) Any person guilty of violating subsection (2) of this
section shall also be required to make restitution to the law
enforcement agency or owner aggrieved thereby.

32 (6) The provisions of this section shall not apply to the33 lawful practice of veterinary medicine.

34 SECTION 2. This act shall take effect and be in force from 35 and after July 1, 2023.
