- AN ACT TO ENACT THE "SERVICE CANINE PROTECTION ACT OF 2022";
 TO DEFINE TERMS; TO REQUIRE EACH CANINE UNIT TO EQUIP ITS CANINE
 VEHICLES WITH A HEAT ALARM SYSTEM; TO REQUIRE EACH CANINE UNIT TO
 ADOPT A WRITTEN PROTOCOL; AND FOR RELATED PURPOSES.
- 5 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI:
- 6 **SECTION 1.** This act shall be known and may be cited as the
- 7 "Service Canine Protection Act of 2022."
- 8 **SECTION 2.** For purposes of this act, the following words
- 9 shall have the meanings ascribed herein unless the context
- 10 otherwise requires:
- 11 (a) "Canine unit" means a canine handler who is a law
- 12 enforcement officer or firefighter, a service canine trained to
- 13 assist a law enforcement officer or firefighter in the performance
- 14 of the officer or firefighter's official duties, and any law
- 15 enforcement officer or firefighter who is not a canine handler but
- 16 is assigned to the canine unit.
- 17 (b) "Canine vehicle" means a vehicle assigned to a
- 18 canine unit for the transport of service canines in the
- 19 performance of the service canine's official duties.

- 22 fire or other emergencies, who is assigned to firefighting
- 23 activity by the state or a political subdivision, and is required
- 24 to respond to alarms and perform emergency actions at the location
- 25 of a fire, hazardous materials or other emergency incident. The
- 26 term "firefighter" includes an individual who is a member of a
- 27 volunteer fire department that is a political subdivision.
- 28 (d) "Heat alarm system" means a temperature monitoring
- 29 system for a canine vehicle.
- 30 (e) "Law enforcement officer" shall have the same
- 31 meaning as defined in Section 45-6-3 (c).
- 32 (f) "Service canine" means a canine trained to assist
- 33 in search and rescue or law enforcement activities.
- 34 **SECTION 3.** (1) Each canine unit shall equip its canine
- 35 vehicles with a heat alarm system. At a minimum, the heat alarm
- 36 system shall:
- 37 (a) Monitor vital components of the canine vehicle,
- 38 including cabin temperature and vehicle battery voltage;
- 39 (b) Activate the canine vehicle's sirens, horn and
- 40 light bar if an alarm condition is detected; and
- 41 (c) Open at least one of the canine vehicle's windows
- 42 if an alarm condition is detected.
- 43 (2) Each canine unit shall adopt a written protocol that
- 44 requires:

45	(a)	Daily checks that the heat alarm system is engaged				
46	and functioning properly;					
47	(b)	Regular maintenance of the heat alarm system; and				
48	(c)	End-of-shift or end-of-day procedures to ensure				
49	that no service canine is left in a canine vehicle at the end of a					
50	shift or the end of the day.
