## SENATE BILL NO. 2317

1 AN ACT TO AMEND SECTION 37-19-7, MISSISSIPPI CODE OF 1972, TO 2 INCLUDE BOARD CERTIFIED OCCUPATIONAL THERAPISTS WHO ARE EMPLOYED 3 BY A LOCAL SCHOOL BOARD OR BY A STATE AGENCY UNDER THE STATE 4 PERSONNEL BOARD AS ELIGIBLE EMPLOYEES FOR ANNUAL SALARY 5 SUPPLEMENT; AND FOR RELATED PURPOSES. 6 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI: 7 SECTION 1. Section 37-19-7, Mississippi Code of 1972, is amended as follows: 8 9 37-19-7. (1) The allowance in the Mississippi Adequate 10 Education Program for teachers' salaries in each public school district shall be determined and paid in accordance with the scale 11 12 for teachers' salaries as provided in this subsection. For teachers holding the following types of licenses or the equivalent 13 14 as determined by the State Board of Education, and the following 15 number of years of teaching experience, the scale shall be as 16 follows: 17 2022-2023 AND SUBSEQUENT SCHOOL YEARS MINIMUM SALARY SCHEDULE 18 Exp. It is the intent of the Legislature that any state funds made available for salaries of licensed personnel in excess of the funds paid for such salaries for the 1986-1987 school year shall be paid to licensed personnel pursuant to a personnel appraisal and compensation system implemented by the State Board of Education. The State Board of Education shall have the authority to adopt and amend rules and regulations as are necessary to establish, administer and maintain the system.

All teachers employed on a full-time basis shall be paid a minimum salary in accordance with the above scale. However, no school district shall receive any funds under this section for any school year during which the local supplement paid to any individual teacher shall have been reduced to a sum less than that paid to that individual teacher for performing the same duties

- 71 year. The amount actually spent for the purposes of group health
- 72 and/or life insurance shall be considered as a part of the
- 73 aggregate amount of local supplement but shall not be considered a
- 74 part of the amount of individual local supplement.
- 75 The level of professional training of each teacher to be used
- 76 in establishing the salary allotment for the teachers for each
- 77 year shall be determined by the type of valid teacher's license
- 78 issued to those teachers on or before October 1 of the current
- 79 school year. However, school districts are authorized, in their
- 80 discretion, to negotiate the salary levels applicable to licensed
- 81 employees who are receiving retirement benefits from the
- 82 retirement system of another state, and the annual experience
- 83 increment provided above in Section 37-19-7 shall not be
- 84 applicable to any such retired certificated employee.
- 85 (2) (a) The following employees shall receive an annual
- 86 salary supplement in the amount of Six Thousand Dollars
- 87 (\$6,000.00), plus fringe benefits, in addition to any other
- 88 compensation to which the employee may be entitled:
- 89 (i) Any licensed teacher who has met the
- 90 requirements and acquired a Master Teacher certificate from the
- 91 National Board for Professional Teaching Standards and who is
- 92 employed by a local school board or the State Board of Education
- 93 as a teacher and not as an administrator. Such teacher shall
- 94 submit documentation to the State Department of Education that the

- 95 certificate was received prior to October 15 in order to be
- 96 eligible for the full salary supplement in the current school
- 97 year, or the teacher shall submit such documentation to the State
- 98 Department of Education prior to February 15 in order to be
- 99 eligible for a prorated salary supplement beginning with the
- 100 second term of the school year.
- 101 (ii) A licensed nurse who has met the requirements
- 102 and acquired a certificate from the National Board for
- 103 Certification of School Nurses, Inc., and who is employed by a
- 104 local school board or the State Board of Education as a school
- 105 nurse and not as an administrator. The licensed school nurse
- 106 shall submit documentation to the State Department of Education
- 107 that the certificate was received before October 15 in order to be
- 108 eligible for the full salary supplement in the current school
- 109 year, or the licensed school nurse shall submit the documentation
- 110 to the State Department of Education before February 15 in order
- 111 to be eligible for a prorated salary supplement beginning with the
- 112 second term of the school year.
- 113 (iii) Any licensed school counselor who has met
- 114 the requirements and acquired a National Certified School
- 115 Counselor (NCSC) endorsement from the National Board of Certified
- 116 Counselors and who is employed by a local school board or the
- 117 State Board of Education as a counselor and not as an
- 118 administrator. Such licensed school counselor shall submit
- 119 documentation to the State Department of Education that the

120	endorsement was received prior to October 15 in order to be
121	eligible for the full salary supplement in the current school
122	year, or the licensed school counselor shall submit such
123	documentation to the State Department of Education prior to
124	February 15 in order to be eligible for a prorated salary
125	supplement beginning with the second term of the school year.
126	However, any school counselor who started the National Board for
127	Professional Teaching Standards process for school counselors
128	between June 1, 2003, and June 30, 2004, and completes the
129	requirements and acquires the Master Teacher certificate shall be
130	entitled to the master teacher supplement, and those counselors
131	who complete the process shall be entitled to a one-time
132	reimbursement for the actual cost of the process as outlined in
133	paragraph (b) of this subsection.
134	(iv) Any licensed speech-language pathologist and
135	audiologist who has met the requirements and acquired a
136	Certificate of Clinical Competence from the American
137	Speech-Language-Hearing Association and any certified academic
138	language therapist (CALT) who has met the certification
139	requirements of the Academic Language Therapy Association and who
140	is employed by a local school board. The licensed speech-language
141	pathologist and audiologist and certified academic language
142	therapist shall submit documentation to the State Department of
143	Education that the certificate or endorsement was received before
144	October 15 in order to be eligible for the full salary supplement

145	in the current school year, or the licensed speech-language
146	pathologist and audiologist and certified academic language
147	therapist shall submit the documentation to the State Department
148	of Education before February 15 in order to be eligible for a
149	prorated salary supplement beginning with the second term of the
150	school year.
151	(v) Any licensed athletic trainer who has met the
152	requirements and acquired Board Certification for the Athletic
153	Trainer from the Board of Certification, Inc., and who is employed
154	by a local school board or the State Board of Education as an
155	athletic trainer and not as an administrator. The licensed
156	athletic trainer shall submit documentation to the State
157	Department of Education that the certificate was received before
158	October 15 in order to be eligible for the full salary supplement
159	in the current school year, or the licensed athletic trainer shall
160	submit the documentation to the State Department of Education
161	before February 15 in order to be eligible for a prorated salary
162	supplement beginning with the second term of the school year.
163	(vi) Any occupational therapist who has met the
164	requirements and acquired a certificate from the National Board
165	Certification of Occupational Therapy and who is employed by a
166	local school board or a state agency under the State Personnel
167	Board. The licensed occupational therapist shall submit
168	documentation to the State Department of Education that the
169	certificate or endorsement was received before October 15 of each

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170	year in order to be eligible for the full salary supplement in the
171	current school year, or the occupational therapist shall submit
172	the documentation to the State Department of Education before
173	February 15 of each year in order to be eligible for a prorated
174	salary supplement beginning with the second term of the school
175	<pre>year.</pre>
176	(b) An employee shall be reimbursed for the actual cost
177	of completing each component of acquiring the certificate or
178	endorsement, excluding any costs incurred for postgraduate
179	courses, not to exceed Five Hundred Dollars (\$500.00) for each

courses, not to exceed Five Hundred Dollars (\$500.00) for each component, not to exceed four (4) components, for a teacher, school counselor or speech-language pathologist and audiologist, regardless of whether or not the process resulted in the award of the certificate or endorsement. A local school district or any private individual or entity may pay the cost of completing the process of acquiring the certificate or endorsement for any employee of the school district described under paragraph (a), and the State Department of Education shall reimburse the school district for such cost, regardless of whether or not the process resulted in the award of the certificate or endorsement. If a private individual or entity has paid the cost of completing the process of acquiring the certificate or endorsement for an employee, the local school district may agree to directly reimburse the individual or entity for such cost on behalf of the employee.

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195	(c) All salary supplements, fringe benefits and process
196	reimbursement authorized under this subsection shall be paid
197	directly by the State Department of Education to the local school
198	district and shall be in addition to its adequate education
199	program allotments and not a part thereof in accordance with
200	regulations promulgated by the State Board of Education. Local
201	school districts shall not reduce the local supplement paid to any
202	employee receiving such salary supplement, and the employee shall
203	receive any local supplement to which employees with similar
204	training and experience otherwise are entitled. However, an
205	educational employee shall receive the salary supplement in the
206	amount of Six Thousand Dollars (\$6,000.00) for only one (1) of the
207	qualifying certifications authorized under paragraph (a) of this
208	subsection. No school district shall provide more than one (1)
209	annual salary supplement under the provisions of this subsection
210	to any one (1) individual employee holding multiple qualifying
211	national certifications.

(d) If an employee for whom such cost has been paid, in full or in part, by a local school district or private individual or entity fails to complete the certification or endorsement process, the employee shall be liable to the school district or individual or entity for all amounts paid by the school district or or individual or entity on behalf of that employee toward his or her certificate or endorsement.

219	(3) The following employees shall receive an annual salary
220	supplement in the amount of Four Thousand Dollars (\$4,000.00),
221	plus fringe benefits, in addition to any other compensation to
222	which the employee may be entitled:
223	Effective July 1, 2016, if funds are available for that

224 purpose, any licensed teacher who has met the requirements and 225 acquired a Master Teacher Certificate from the National Board for 226 Professional Teaching Standards and who is employed in a public 227 school district located in one (1) of the following counties: Claiborne, Adams, Jefferson, Wilkinson, Amite, Bolivar, Coahoma, 228 229 Leflore, Quitman, Sharkey, Issaquena, Sunflower, Washington, 230 Holmes, Yazoo and Tallahatchie. The salary supplement awarded 231 under the provisions of this subsection (3) shall be in addition 232 to the salary supplement awarded under the provisions of 233 subsection (2) of this section.

Teachers who meet the qualifications for a salary supplement under this subsection (3) who are assigned for less than one (1) full year or less than full time for the school year shall receive the salary supplement in a prorated manner, with the portion of the teacher's assignment to the critical geographic area to be determined as of June 15th of the school year.

(4) (a) This section shall be known and may be cited as the "Mississippi Performance-Based Pay (MPBP)" plan. In addition to the minimum base pay described in this section, only after full funding of MAEP and if funds are available for that purpose, the

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244 State of Mississippi may provide monies from state funds to school

245 districts for the purposes of rewarding licensed teachers,

246 administrators and nonlicensed personnel at individual schools

showing improvement in student test scores. The MPBP plan shall 247

248 be developed by the State Department of Education based on the

249 following criteria:

250 It is the express intent of this legislation (i)

251 that the MPBP plan shall utilize only existing standards of

252 accreditation and assessment as established by the State Board of

253 Education.

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254 To ensure that all of Mississippi's teachers,

administrators and nonlicensed personnel at all schools have equal

access to the monies set aside in this section, the MPBP program

257 shall be designed to calculate each school's performance as

258 determined by the school's increase in scores from the prior

259 school year. The MPBP program shall be based on a standardized

260 scores rating where all levels of schools can be judged in a

261 statistically fair and reasonable way upon implementation. At the

end of each year, after all student achievement scores have been

263 standardized, the State Department of Education shall implement

264 the MPBP plan.

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265 To ensure all teachers cooperate in the (iii)

266 spirit of teamwork, individual schools shall submit a plan to the

267 local school district to be approved before the beginning of each

school year beginning July 1, 2008. The plan shall include, but 268

- 269 not be limited to, how all teachers, regardless of subject area, 270 and administrators will be responsible for improving student 271 achievement for their individual school.
- 272 (b) The State Board of Education shall develop the 273 processes and procedures for designating schools eligible to 274 participate in the MPBP. State assessment results, growth in 275 student achievement at individual schools and other measures 276 deemed appropriate in designating successful student achievement 277 shall be used in establishing MPBP criteria.
- 278 (5) (a) If funds are available for that purpose, each 279 school in Mississippi shall have mentor teachers, as defined by 280 Sections 37-9-201 through 37-9-213, who shall receive additional 281 base compensation provided for by the State Legislature in the 282 amount of One Thousand Dollars (\$1,000.00) per each beginning 283 teacher that is being mentored. The additional state compensation 284 shall be limited to those mentor teachers that provide mentoring 285 services to beginning teachers. For the purposes of such funding, 286 a beginning teacher shall be defined as any teacher in any school 287 in Mississippi that has less than one (1) year of classroom 288 experience teaching in a public school. For the purposes of such 289 funding, no full-time academic teacher shall mentor more than two 290 (2) beginning teachers.
- 291 To be eligible for this state funding, the (b) 292 individual school must have a classroom management program 293 approved by the local school board.

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294	(6) Effective with the 2014-2015 school year, the school
295	districts participating in the Pilot Performance-Based
296	Compensation System pursuant to Section 37-19-9 may award
297	additional teacher and administrator pay based thereon.
298	SECTION 2. This act shall take effect and be in force from
299	and after July 1, 2023.
