SENATE BILL NO. 2368

AN ACT TO AMEND SECTION 37-16-7, MISSISSIPPI CODE OF 1972, TO REQUIRE HIGH SCHOOL GRADUATES TO PASS AT LEAST 60% OF THE CIVICS PORTION OF THE NATURALIZATION TEST USED BY THE IMMIGRATION SERVICES; TO AMEND SECTION 37-35-9, MISSISSIPPI CODE OF 1972, TO REQUIRE HIGH SCHOOL EQUIVALENCY DIPLOMA APPLICANTS TO PASS AT LEAST 60% OF THE CIVICS PORTION OF THE NATURALIZATION TEST USED BY THE IMMIGRATION SERVICES; AND FOR RELATED PURPOSES.

8 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI:

9 SECTION 1. Section 37-16-7, Mississippi Code of 1972, is

10 amended as follows:

11 37-16-7. (1) Each district school board shall establish 12 standards for graduation from its schools which shall include as a 13 minimum:

14 (a) Mastery of minimum academic skills as measured by
15 assessments developed and administered by the State Board of
16 Education.

(b) Completion of a minimum number of academic credits, and all other applicable requirements prescribed by the district school board.

20	(c) (i) Beginning in the 2023-2024 school year,
21	fulfillment of a requirement to correctly answer at least sixty
22	(60) of the one hundred (100) questions listed on a test that is
23	identical to the civics portion of the Naturalization Test used by
24	the United States Citizenship and Immigration Services.
25	(ii) The local school board may determine the
26	method and manner in which to administer a test that is identical
27	to the civics portion of the Naturalization Test used by the
28	United States Citizenship and Immigration Services.
29	(iii) A student who does not obtain a passing
30	score on the test that is identical to the civics portion of the
31	Naturalization Test may retake the test until the student obtains
32	a passing score.
33	(iv) A student who has passed a similar test
34	within the previous three (3) years shall not be required to take
35	the test under this paragraph (c).
36	(v) Provisions of this paragraph (c) shall be
37	subject to the requirements and accommodations of a student's
38	Individualized Education Program.
39	(* * * <u>d</u>) By school, information on high school
40	graduation rates. High schools with graduation rates lower than
41	eighty percent (80%) must submit a detailed plan to the
42	Mississippi Department of Education to restructure the high school
43	experience to improve graduation rates.

44 (2) A student who meets all requirements prescribed in
45 subsection (1) of this section shall be awarded a standard diploma
46 in a form prescribed by the State Board of Education.

47 (3) The State Board of Education may establish student
48 proficiency standards for promotion to grade levels leading to
49 graduation.

50 SECTION 2. Section 37-35-9, Mississippi Code of 1972, is 51 amended as follows:

52 37-35-9. (1) The Mississippi Community College Board is 53 authorized to develop and establish general educational 54 development preparatory classes in secondary schools and 55 community/junior colleges and to provide financial assistance from 56 the state for the specific purpose of preparing persons sixteen 57 (16) years of age and older, not enrolled in school or required to 58 be enrolled in school by the Compulsory School Attendance Law 59 (Section 37-13-91) to successfully write the general educational 60 development test and earn a certificate of equivalency which is equivalent to the high school diploma. 61

62 (2) (a) The Mississippi Community College Board is 63 authorized to administer the High School Equivalency Diploma 64 Testing Program in accordance with the policies and guidelines of 65 the High School Equivalency Diploma Testing Service of the 66 American Council on Education. Such administration shall include 67 the approval of rules and regulations for the administration, 68 scoring, issuing of transcripts and awarding of diplomas for the

The Mississippi 70 Community College Board is hereby authorized to assess a fee in an 71 amount not to exceed Five Dollars (\$5.00) for issuing an 72 additional copy of a High School Equivalency Diploma transcript. 73 (b) (i) Beginning January 1, 2024, the Mississippi 74 Community College Board shall require that a person must correctly 75 answer at least sixty (60) of the one hundred (100) questions 76 listed on a test that is identical to the civics portion of the 77 Naturalization Test used by the United States Citizenship and 78 Immigration Services in order to obtain a High School Equivalency 79 Diploma. 80 (ii) The Mississippi Community College Board may 81 determine the method and manner in which to administer a test that 82 is identical to the civics portion of the Naturalization Test used 83 by the United States Citizenship and Immigration Services. 84 (iii) A person who does not obtain a passing score 85 on the test that is identical to the civics portion of the 86 Naturalization Test may retake the test until the person obtains a 87 passing score. 88 (iv) A person who has passed a similar test within 89 the previous three (3) years shall not be required to take the 90 test under this paragraph (b). This program shall be administered by the Mississippi 91 (3) 92 Community College Board through the secondary schools and

93 community/junior colleges as the local needs indicate and are 94 practical.

95 <u>(4)</u> Full and general supervision over the program by the 96 Mississippi Community College Board shall *** *** <u>ensure</u> that 97 duplication of effort by secondary schools and community/junior 98 colleges will be eliminated; however, nothing in this section 99 shall be construed to prohibit a school district from implementing 100 a program of High School Equivalency Diploma preparatory 101 instruction.

102 <u>(5)</u> Adult students for general educational development 103 preparatory classes may be accepted by schools and junior colleges 104 from any area of the state provided students are bona fide 105 residents of Mississippi.

106 <u>(6)</u> Instructors, counselors and supervisors utilized in the 107 teaching of general educational development preparatory classes 108 shall be licensed in the appropriate area as required by the 109 Mississippi Community College Board.

SECTION 3. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after July 1, 2023.
