COMMITTEE SUBSTITUTE FOR SENATE BILL NO. 2372

1 AN ACT TO ESTABLISH THE MISSISSIPPI HOSPITAL SUSTAINABILITY 2 GRANT PROGRAM FOR THE PURPOSE OF IMPROVING AND PRESERVING ACCESS 3 TO HOSPITAL CARE FOR ALL MISSISSIPPIANS AND IN RECOGNITION OF THE 4 CHALLENGES INCURRED BY HOSPITALS AS A RESULT OF THE COVID-19 5 PANDEMIC; TO REQUIRE THE DEPARTMENT OF HEALTH TO ADMINISTER THE PROGRAM; TO PROVIDE THAT THE FUNDS SHALL BE DISTRIBUTED TO EACH 6 7 HOSPITAL LICENSED BY THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI EXCEPT FOR HOSPITALS 8 OPERATED BY THE UNITED STATES DEPARTMENT OF VETERANS AFFAIRS AND 9 STATE-OPERATED FACILITIES THAT PROVIDE ONLY INPATIENT AND 10 OUTPATIENT PSYCHIATRIC SERVICES; TO PROVIDE FOR THE ELIGIBILITY 11 FOR SPECIFIC HOSPITALS AND THEIR CORRESPONDING GRANT PAYMENT 12 AMOUNTS; TO SET THE FUND DISTRIBUTION FORMULA THE DEPARTMENT OF 13 HEALTH SHALL USE FOR ALLOCATING REMAINING FUNDS APPROPRIATED FOR 14 THE GRANT PROGRAM; TO SET CERTAIN REQUIREMENTS FOR RECEIVING A 15 GRANT PAYMENT UNDER THE ACT; TO REQUIRE EACH HOSPITAL RECEIVING 16 FUNDS FROM THE GRANT PROGRAM TO SUBMIT A REPORT DESCRIBING ITS 17 OVERALL PATIENT CENSUS; TO REQUIRE THE DEPARTMENT OF HEALTH TO 18 COMPILE SUCH REPORTS AND SUBMIT THE REPORTS TO THE LIEUTENANT 19 GOVERNOR AND THE SPEAKER OF THE HOUSE BY DECEMBER 1, 2023; AND FOR 20 RELATED PURPOSES.

21 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI:

22 SECTION 1. (1) There is hereby established the Mississippi

Hospital Sustainability Grant Program. 23

24 (2) In order to measure, improve and preserve access to

25 Mississippi hospital care for all Mississippians and in

- 26 recognition of the challenges incurred by Mississippi hospitals as
- a result of the COVID-19 pandemic, funds from the Mississippi 27

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Hospital Sustainability Grant Program shall be distributed to each hospital licensed by the State of Mississippi except for hospitals operated by the United States Department of Veterans Affairs and state-operated facilities that provide only inpatient and outpatient psychiatric services.

33 (3) Grant funds shall be distributed based upon the 34 following formula:

(a) Each Mississippi-licensed rural hospital that has
less than one hundred (100) licensed beds and that is not
classified as a critical access hospital that operates an
emergency department shall receive Five Hundred Thousand Dollars
(\$500,000.00) to defray the costs of providing emergency
department services.

(b) Each Mississippi-licensed rural hospital that has less than one hundred (100) licensed beds and that is classified as a critical access hospital that operates an emergency department shall receive Three Hundred Fifty Thousand Dollars (\$350,000.00) to defray the costs of providing emergency department services.

47 (c) Each Mississippi-licensed hospital that operates an
48 emergency department and that has greater than one hundred (100)
49 licensed beds shall receive One Million Dollars (\$1,000,000.00).

50 (d) Each Mississippi-licensed hospital with less than 51 one hundred (100) licensed beds with the majority of such beds 52 being dedicated to providing freestanding long term acute care,

55 In addition to the funds distributed above, any (4)56 remaining funds appropriated for the purposes of this grant 57 program shall be distributed on a pro-rata amount by dividing the 58 remaining funds by the number of licensed beds attributable to all 59 Mississippi licensed hospital eligible to receive funds under this 60 program and determining a dollar amount for each bed and then 61 multiplying that dollar amount by the licensed bed count for each 62 hospital and distributing that amount to each respective hospital. 63 In addition to the above, in order to receive a grant payment 64 under this section, each hospital must submit a report describing 65 its overall patient census, its number of licensed beds and the 66 medical services offered to its community (e.g., labor and delivery, intensive care units, emergency department, psychiatric, 67 68 chemical dependency, surgery, neurology, orthopedic, etc.).

69 (5) The grant program described herein shall be administered by the Mississippi Department of Health. In promulgating rules 70 71 for this grant, the Department shall not place additional 72 qualification requirements on hospitals other than the minimum 73 requirements required under this act. The Department shall 74 compile the reports provided by the hospitals receiving funds 75 under this program and submit the report to the Lieutenant Governor and the Speaker of the House by December 1, 2023. 76
