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SENATE BILL NO. 2396

AN ACT TO CREATE NEW SECTION 83-9-10, MISSISSIPPI CODE OF 1972, TO CREATE THE HEALTH INSURANCE COVERAGE FOR FERTILITY PRESERVATION SERVICES ACT; TO ENSURE HEALTH INSURANCE COVERAGE FOR STANDARD FERTILITY PRESERVATION SERVICES WHEN MEDICALLY NECESSARY 5 TREATMENT MAY DIRECTLY OR INDIRECTLY CAUSE IATROGENIC INFERTILITY 6 CONSISTENT WITH ESTABLISHED MEDICAL PRACTICE AND PROFESSIONAL 7 GUIDELINES; TO PROVIDE THAT A CARRIER OFFERING HEALTH INSURANCE COVERAGE IN THIS STATE SHALL PROVIDE COVERAGE FOR STANDARD 8 9 FERTILITY PRESERVATION SERVICES FOR ANY COVERED INDIVIDUAL WHO MAY UNDERGO A MEDICALLY NECESSARY TREATMENT THAT MAY DIRECTLY OR 10 INDIRECTLY CAUSE IATROGENIC INFERTILITY; TO PROHIBIT A CARRIER WHO 11 12 OFFERS HEALTH INSURANCE COVERAGE IN THIS STATE FOR STANDARD 13 FERTILITY PRESERVATION SERVICES FROM IMPOSING CERTAIN EXCLUSIONS, LIMITATIONS OR OTHER RESTRICTIONS; AND FOR RELATED PURPOSES. 14 15 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI: SECTION 1. The following shall be codified as Section 16 17 83-9-10, Mississippi Code of 1972: 83-9-10. (1) This section shall be known and may be cited 18 19 as the "Health Insurance Coverage for Fertility Preservation 20 Services Act." (2) For purposes of this section, the following terms shall 21 22 have the meanings ascribed herein: 23 (a) "Covered individual" shall mean a policyholder, subscriber, enrollee, participant or other individual covered by 24 S. B. No. 2396 ~ OFFICIAL ~ G1/2

- 25 an insurance policy, subscription contract or health care plan,
- 26 including minors or dependents.
- 27 (b) "Health insurance coverage" shall mean every health
- 28 insurance issuer offering health coverage in the state that
- 29 provides coverage for hospital, medical, surgical, pharmaceutical
- 30 or drug benefits for individuals covered under a respective plan.
- 31 "Health insurance coverage" shall include, but not be limited to,
- 32 benefits, provided directly, through insurance or reimbursement,
- 33 or otherwise, under any hospital or medical service policy or
- 34 certificate, hospital or medical service plan contract, or HMO
- 35 contracted offered by a health insurance issuer. Health insurance
- 36 coverage includes group health insurance coverage and individual
- 37 health insurance coverage.
- 38 (c) "Medical treatment that may directly or indirectly
- 39 cause iatrogenic infertility" means medical treatment with a
- 40 likely side effect of infertility as established by the American
- 41 Society of Clinical Oncology.
- 42 (d) "Iatrogenic infertility" shall mean an impairment
- 43 of fertility caused directly or indirectly by surgery,
- 44 chemotherapy, radiation or other medical treatment affecting the
- 45 reproductive organs or processes.
- 46 (e) "Professional guidelines" shall mean the most
- 47 recent clinical practice guidelines published by the American
- 48 Society of Clinical Oncology.

49	(f)	"Standard	fertility	preservation	services"	shall
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- 50 mean the procedures to preserve fertility as outlined and
- 51 established according to the professional guidelines published by
- 52 the American Society of Clinical Oncology and shall include the
- 53 full scope of services or treatments, without any exclusions or
- 54 limitations, as defined in the most recent professional guidelines
- 55 established by the American Society of Clinical Oncology.
- 56 "Standard fertility preservation services" shall not include any
- 57 experimental procedure or other procedures for which the published
- 58 medical evidence is not sufficient for the American Society of
- 59 Clinical Oncology as established medical practice.
- 60 (3) The purpose of this act is to ensure health insurance
- 61 coverage for standard fertility preservation services when
- 62 medically necessary treatment may directly or indirectly cause
- 63 iatrogenic infertility consistent with established medical
- 64 practice and professional guidelines published by the American
- 65 Society of Clinical Oncology.
- 66 (4) A carrier offering health insurance coverage in this
- 67 state shall provide coverage for standard fertility preservation
- 68 services for any covered individual who may undergo a medically
- 69 necessary treatment that may directly or indirectly cause
- 70 iatrogenic infertility.
- 71 (5) No carrier offering health insurance coverage in this
- 72 state for standard fertility preservation services shall impose

- 73 any of the following exclusions, limitations or other restrictions
- 74 on coverage:
- 75 (a) A carrier shall not use any prior diagnosis or
- 76 prior fertility treatment as a basis for excluding, limiting or
- 77 otherwise restricting the availability of coverage required by
- 78 this section.
- 79 (b) Any limitations imposed by a carrier shall be used
- 80 on a covered individual's medical history and clinical guidelines
- 81 adopted by the carrier. Any clinical guidelines used by a carrier
- 82 shall not be based on the current guidelines developed by the
- 83 American Society of Clinical Oncology and shall not be deviated
- 84 from the full scope of such guidance.
- 85 (c) A carrier shall not discriminate based on a covered
- 86 individual's expected length of life, present or predicted
- 87 disability, degree of medical dependency, perceived quality of
- 88 life or other health conditions, nor based on personal
- 89 characteristics, including age, sex, sexual orientation, marital
- 90 status or gender identity.
- 91 (6) This act shall apply to all policies, contracts and
- 92 certificates executed, delivered, issued for delivery, continued
- 93 or renewed in the state on or after the effective date of this
- 94 act. For purposes of this act, all contracts are deemed to be
- 95 renewed no later than the next yearly anniversary of the contract
- 96 date.

97 **SECTION 2.** This act shall take effect and be in force from 98 and after July 1, 2023.
