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## SENATE BILL NO. 2402

1 AN ACT TO AMEND SECTION 27-41-1, MISSISSIPPI CODE OF 1972, TO 2 DISALLOW A PROCESSING FEE TO BE CHARGED ON DEBIT CARD PAYMENTS FOR AD VALOREM TAXES; TO AMEND SECTIONS 27-104-33 AND 17-25-1, 3 MISSISSIPPI CODE OF 1972, TO CONFORM; AND FOR RELATED PURPOSES. BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI: 5 SECTION 1. Section 27-41-1, Mississippi Code of 1972, is 6 7 amended as follows: 8 27-41-1. (1) Except as may otherwise be provided in Section 9 27-41-2, all state, county, school, road, levee and other taxing 10 districts and municipal ad valorem taxes, except ad valorem taxes levied for county or district or municipal bonds and other 11 12 evidences of indebtedness for money borrowed, and interest thereon, heretofore or hereafter assessed or levied shall be due, 13 14 payable and collectible by the tax collector and shall be paid on or before the first day of February next succeeding the date of 15 the assessment and levying of such taxes. All taxes levied for 16 17 county and district and municipal bonds and interest thereon, or 18 betterment or improvement assessments, shall be paid by each 19 person assessed therewith on or before the first day of February S. - 20 next succeeding the date of the assessment and levying of the
- 21 same, at the time of payment of the state and county ad valorem
- 22 taxes, except as otherwise hereinafter provided in this chapter.
- 23 The tax collector shall begin to accept payment for such ad
- 24 valorem taxes or assessments not later than December 26 of the
- 25 year prior to the year in which such taxes are required to be
- 26 paid.
- 27 Any county may, by an order spread upon the minutes of the
- 28 board of supervisors, allow the acceptance of partial payments for
- 29 ad valorem taxes. Any municipality wherein municipal taxes are
- 30 not collected by the county may, by an order spread upon the
- minutes of the governing authority of said municipality, allow the 31
- 32 acceptance of partial payments for ad valorem taxes. If said
- partial payments are allowed by the county or municipality, said 33
- 34 partial payments shall be made as follows:
- 35 One-half (1/2) of all ad valorem taxes due shall be
- 36 paid on or before February 1.
- 37 One-fourth (1/4) of all ad valorem taxes, interest (b)
- 38 and penalty due shall be paid on or before May 1.
- 39 One-fourth (1/4) of all ad valorem taxes, interest
- 40 and penalty due shall be paid on or before July 1.
- If any unpaid balance exists on August 1, then the lands 41
- 42 shall be sold at the land sale on the last Monday in August for
- 43 said unpaid balance.

44	All ad valorem taxes, however, assessed against motor
45	vehicles as prescribed by the Motor Vehicle Ad Valorem Tax Law of
46	1958, for any and all purposes and in any and all jurisdictions,
47	shall be paid in full on the date such taxes are due and payable.
48	(2) Ad valorem tax payments may be made by cash, check,
49	credit cards, charge cards, debit cards and other forms of
50	electronic payment in accordance with policies established by the
51	State Auditor, as well as any other payment methods as deemed
52	appropriate by the collecting agency. If the ad valorem tax
53	payment is made using a debit card, the party making the payment
54	shall not be charged an electronic payment processing fee by the
55	collecting agency.
56	SECTION 2. Section 27-104-33, Mississippi Code of 1972, is
57	amended as follows:
58	27-104-33. The State Department of Finance and
59	Administration shall establish policies that allow the payment of
60	various fees and other accounts receivable to state agencies, and
61	the payment for retail merchandise sold by state agencies, by
62	credit cards, charge cards, debit cards and other forms of
63	electronic payment in the discretion of the department. Any fees
64	or charges associated with the use of such electronic payments
65	shall be assessed to the user of the electronic payment as an
66	additional charge for processing the electronic payment, so that

the user will pay the full cost of using the electronic payment.

The processing fee for the electronic payment shall not be charged

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- 69 to parties who are making debit card payments toward their ad
- 70 valorem taxes.
- 71 Agencies, with the approval of the Department of Finance and
- 72 Administration, may bear the full cost of processing such
- 73 electronic payments if the agency can demonstrate to the
- 74 department's satisfaction that they are able to assume these costs
- 75 and provide the related service for the same or lesser cost.
- 76 However, state agencies may bear the full cost of processing such
- 77 electronic payments for retail merchandise sold by state agencies.
- 78 **SECTION 3.** Section 17-25-1, Mississippi Code of 1972, is
- 79 amended as follows:
- 80 17-25-1. The board of supervisors of any county and the
- 81 governing authorities of any municipality may allow the payment of
- 82 various taxes, fees and other accounts receivable to the county or
- 83 municipality, and the payment for retail merchandise sold by the
- 84 county or municipality, by credit cards, charge cards, debit cards
- 85 and other forms of electronic payment, in accordance with policies
- 86 established by the State Auditor. Except as otherwise provided in
- 87 this section, any fees or charges associated with the use of such
- 88 electronic payments shall be assessed to the user of the
- 89 electronic payment as an additional charge for processing the
- 90 electronic payment, so that the user will pay the full cost of
- 91 using the electronic payment. However, the processing fee for the
- 92 electronic payment shall not be charged to parties who are making
- 93 debit card payments toward their ad valorem taxes. A county or

94	municipality	y shall	not	charge	the	user	any	additional	amount	above
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- 95 the processing fee on each transaction. For purposes of this
- 96 section, the term "accounts receivable" includes, but is not
- 97 limited to, judgments, fines, costs and penalties imposed upon
- 98 conviction for criminal and traffic offenses. A county or
- 99 municipality may bear the full cost of processing such electronic
- 100 payments for retail merchandise sold by the county or
- 101 municipality.
- 102 **SECTION 4.** This act shall take effect and be in force from
- 103 and after July 1, 2023.
