SENATE BILL NO. 2416

AN ACT TO AMEND SECTION 45-2-1, MISSISSIPPI CODE OF 1972, TO PROVIDE THAT UPON A FEDERAL LINE-OF-DUTY DEATH BENEFIT THAT IS AWARDED TO THE COVERED INDIVIDUAL, THE LINE-OF-DUTY BENEFIT FROM MISSISSIPPI SHALL BE AUTOMATIC; TO REQUIRE THE DEPARTMENT OF 5 PUBLIC SAFETY TO REQUEST A DEFICIT APPROPRIATION AT THE NEXT LEGISLATIVE SESSION TO REPLENISH THE LAW ENFORCEMENT OFFICERS AND 7 FIRE FIGHTERS DEATH BENEFITS TRUST FUND IN THE EVENT THE FUND IS DEPLETED; TO REMOVE THE AUTHORITY OF THE DEPARTMENT OF PUBLIC 8 9 SAFETY TO ADOPT RULES AND REGULATIONS TO ADMINISTER THE FUND; AND 10 FOR RELATED PURPOSES. BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI:

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- 12 **SECTION 1.** Section 45-2-1, Mississippi Code of 1972, is
- 13 amended as follows:
- 14 45-2-1. (1) Whenever used in this section, the term:
- 15 (a) "Covered individual" means a law enforcement
- officer or firefighter, including volunteer firefighters, as 16
- 17 defined in this section when employed by an employer as defined in
- this section; it does not include employees of independent 18
- 19 contractors.
- 20 "Employer" means a state board, commission, (b)
- 21 department, division, bureau or agency, or a county, municipality

- 22 or other political subdivision of the state, which employs,
- 23 appoints or otherwise engages the services of covered individuals.
- 24 (c) "Firefighter" means an individual who is trained
- 25 for the prevention and control of loss of life and property from
- 26 fire or other emergencies, who is assigned to firefighting
- 27 activity, and is required to respond to alarms and perform
- 28 emergency actions at the location of a fire, hazardous materials
- 29 or other emergency incident.
- 30 (d) "Law enforcement officer" means any lawfully sworn
- 31 officer or employee of the state or any political subdivision of
- 32 the state whose duties require the officer or employee to
- 33 investigate, pursue, apprehend, arrest, transport or maintain
- 34 custody of persons who are charged with, suspected of committing,
- 35 or convicted of a crime, whether the officer is on regular duty on
- 36 full-time status, an auxiliary or reserve officer, or is serving
- 37 on a temporary or part-time status.
- 38 (e) "Cause of death" means any cause of death that
- 39 would be covered under the Public Safety Officers' Benefits Act of
- 40 1976, the Hometown Heroes Survivors Benefits Act of 2003,
- 41 generally codified at 42 USCS Chapter 46, or the Safeguarding
- 42 America's First Responders Act of 2020.
- 43 (2) (a) The Department of Public Safety shall make a
- 44 payment, as provided in this section, in the amount of One Hundred
- 45 Thousand Dollars (\$100,000.00) when a covered individual, while
- 46 engaged in the performance of the person's official duties, dies

- 47 or receives accidental or intentional bodily injury that results
- 48 in the loss of the covered individual's life and such death is the
- 49 result of a covered cause of death, provided that the death is not
- 50 the result of suicide and that the bodily injury is not
- 51 intentionally self-inflicted. Upon a Federal Line of Duty Death
- 52 Benefit that is awarded to the covered individual, the line of
- 53 duty benefit from Mississippi shall be automatic.
- 54 (b) The payment provided for in this subsection shall
- 55 be made to the beneficiary who was designated in writing by the
- 56 covered individual, signed by the covered individual and delivered
- 57 to the employer during the covered individual's lifetime. If no
- 58 such designation is made, then the payment shall be made to the
- 59 surviving child or children and spouse in equal portions, and if
- 60 there is no surviving child or spouse, then to the parent or
- 61 parents. If a beneficiary is not designated and there is no
- 62 surviving child, spouse or parent, then the payment shall be made
- 63 to the covered individual's estate.
- (c) The payment made in this subsection is in addition
- 65 to any workers' compensation or pension benefits and is exempt
- 66 from the claims and demands of creditors of the covered
- 67 individual.
- 68 (3) (a) There is established in the State Treasury a
- 69 special fund to be known as the Law Enforcement Officers and Fire
- 70 Fighters Death Benefits Trust Fund. The trust fund shall be
- 71 funded by an initial appropriation of Two Hundred Thousand Dollars

- 72 (\$200,000.00), and shall be comprised of any additional funds made
- 73 available by the Legislature or by donation, contribution, gift or
- 74 any other source.
- 75 (b) The State Treasurer shall invest the monies of the
- 76 trust fund in any of the investments authorized for the funds of
- 77 the Public Employees' Retirement System under Section 25-11-121,
- 78 and those investments shall be subject to the limitations
- 79 prescribed by Section 25-11-121.
- 80 (c) Unexpended amounts remaining in the trust fund at
- 81 the end of the state fiscal year shall not lapse into the State
- 82 General Fund, and any income earned on amounts in the trust fund
- 83 shall be deposited to the credit of the trust fund. However, any
- 84 unexpended amounts transferred in accordance with Section 2 of
- 85 Chapter 315, Laws of 2022, and remaining in the trust fund at the
- 86 end of the state fiscal year shall lapse into the Coronavirus
- 87 State Fiscal Recovery Fund.
- 88 (4) The Department of Public Safety shall be responsible for
- 89 the management of the trust fund and the disbursement of death
- 90 benefits authorized under this section. In the event the trust
- 91 fund is depleted, the Department of Public Safety shall request a
- 92 deficit appropriation at the next legislative session to replenish
- 93 the funds. \star \star
- 94 **SECTION 2.** This act shall take effect and be in force from
- 95 and after July 1, 2023.
