SENATE BILL NO. 2431

1 AN ACT TO AMEND SECTION 21-27-13, MISSISSIPPI CODE OF 1972, 2 TO RECONSTITUTE AND PROVIDE FOR COUNTY CONTROL OVER THE HOLLY 3 SPRINGS, MISSISSIPPI, UTILITY DEPARTMENT; TO AMEND SECTION 4 21-27-15, MISSISSIPPI CODE OF 1972, TO CONFORM; AND FOR RELATED 5 PURPOSES.

- 6 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI:
- 7 SECTION 1. Section 21-27-13, Mississippi Code of 1972, is
- amended as follows: 8
- 9 21-27-13. The governing authorities of any municipality
- 10 which now owns and operates, or hereafter shall own and operate,
- 11 any system or systems shall have the power and authority to create
- 12 a commission to control, manage and operate such systems, or any
- one or more of them, which said commission shall consist of not 13
- less than three (3) nor more than five (5) commissioners, to be 14
- 15 elected by the governing authorities of such municipality. In any
- 16 municipality operating under the council-manager plan of
- 17 government, such commissioners shall be selected by, and shall be
- under the control of, the mayor and councilmen of the 18
- 19 municipality, and not the city or town manager. Beginning July 1,

20	2023, In the City of horry Springs, Mississippi, Said Commission
21	will be reconstituted and such commissioners shall be selected by,
22	and shall be under the control of, the Marshall County Board of
23	Supervisors. Such commissioners shall have the power, authority
24	and duty to manage and control said system or systems and the
25	supply of the facilities and services thereof, both within and
26	without the limits of the municipality. Such commissioners shall
27	be qualified electors of the municipality and shall not hold any
28	other municipal office for honor or profit. Such commissioners
29	shall receive such compensation as may be specified and provided
30	by the governing authorities of said municipality, or in the case
31	of Holly Springs, Mississippi, by the Marshall County Board of
32	Supervisors; provided, however, that any commission formed for the
33	purpose of establishing a motor vehicle transportation system for
34	the transportation of passengers within the boundaries of the
35	governmental unit or units concerned, and within three (3) miles
36	thereof, may pay its commissioners from the operating budget of
37	such commission per diem compensation in the amount provided by
38	Section 25-3-69 for each day or fraction of a day engaged in
39	attendance of meetings of the commission or engaged in other
40	official duties of the commission, not to exceed forty-five (45)
41	days in any one (1) year. The governing authorities of the
42	municipality, or in the case of Holly Springs, Mississippi, the
43	Marshall County Board of Supervisors, are hereby authorized and
4 4	empowered to require such commissioners to furnish bonds for the

- 45 faithful performance of their duties, in the amount as may be
- 46 deemed proper, and to pay the premiums thereon from the municipal
- 47 treasury or the available funds of the said system or systems.
- 48 Where there are three (3) members of such commission, the term of
- 49 office shall be for a period of three (3) years, and where there
- 50 are four (4) members the term of office shall be for a period of
- 51 four (4) years, and where there are five (5) members the term of
- 52 office shall be for a period of five (5) years. However, in
- 53 making the first appointment of commissioners, one (1) shall be
- 54 appointed for a term of one (1) year, one (1) for a term of two
- 55 (2) years, one (1) for a term of three (3) years and, where
- 56 necessary, one (1) for a term of four (4) years, and one (1) for a
- 57 term of five (5) years, so that thereafter the term of office of
- 58 one (1) commissioner shall expire each year. Where the governing
- 59 authorities of the municipality do not elect to create a
- 60 commission as herein provided, then any system or systems owned
- 61 and operated by the municipality shall be controlled and managed
- 62 by the governing authorities of the municipality, who shall have
- 63 all the power and authority conferred upon such commission.
- 64 **SECTION 2.** Section 21-27-15, Mississippi Code of 1972, is
- 65 amended as follows:
- 66 21-27-15. The governing authorities of such municipality
- 67 shall have the power to remove any member of said commission for
- 68 inefficiency or incompetency or any other cause, but the governing
- 69 authority of any municipality which has created a commission under

- 70 the terms of Section 21-27-13, shall not have authority to abolish
- 71 the commission, or to diminish its powers, except by a vote of a
- 72 majority of the qualified electors of such municipality at a
- 73 special election, duly called and held for that purpose. However,
- 74 nothing herein shall limit, alter, impair or in any way change the
- 75 procedure prescribed for the sale or lease of a public utility
- 76 system under Section 21-27-33. The provisions of this section
- 77 shall not apply to the City of Holly Springs, Mississippi.
- 78 **SECTION 3.** This act shall take effect and be in force from
- 79 and after July 1, 2023.
