SENATE BILL NO. 2556

- AN ACT TO AMEND SECTION 49-1-15, MISSISSIPPI CODE OF 1972, TO CLARIFY QUALIFICATIONS FOR APPOINTMENT AS A CONSERVATION OFFICER; AND FOR RELATED PURPOSES.
- 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI:
- 5 **SECTION 1.** Section 49-1-15, Mississippi Code of 1972, is
- 6 amended as follows:
- 7 49-1-15. (1) All appointments of conservation officers
- 8 shall be under rules adopted and promulgated by the commission.
- 9 No person shall be appointed from and after July 1, 2001, unless
- 10 he meets the following requirements:
- 11 (a) Is at least twenty-one (21) years of age; and
- 12 (b) Has successfully completed sixty-four (64) semester
- 13 hours at an accredited community college or university or has an
- 14 associate degree from an accredited community college or has
- 15 passed the Law Enforcement Academy and has at least * * * two (2)
- 16 years experience in law enforcement.
- 17 (2) Each applicant, prior to entering into performance of
- 18 his duties, at the expense of the department, shall attend and

- 19 complete an appropriate curriculum in the field of law enforcement
- 20 at the Mississippi Law Enforcement Officers' Training Academy or
- 21 other training academy whose curriculum complies with requirements
- 22 of the Board on Law Enforcement Officer Standards and Training.
- 23 Conservation officers shall, on a periodic basis, be required to
- 24 successfully complete additional advanced courses in law
- 25 enforcement in order that they will be properly improved and
- 26 trained in the modern, technical advances of law enforcement.
- 27 **SECTION 2.** This act shall take effect and be in force from
- 28 and after July 1, 2023.
