## SENATE BILL NO. 2718

1 AN ACT TO ESTABLISH A PAID INTERNSHIP PROGRAM UNDER THE 2 MISSISSIPPI DEPARTMENT OF INFORMATION TECHNOLOGY SERVICES TO TRAIN 3 AND RETAIN COLLEGE GRADUATES WITH A TECHNICAL OR ENGINEERING 4 DEGREE; AND FOR RELATED PURPOSES.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI: 5 6 SECTION 1. (1) Within the limits of the funds available to 7 the Mississippi Department of Information Technology Services 8 (MDITS) for such purpose, the executive director may grant a paid 9 internship to undergraduate-level students classified as juniors 10 or seniors and pursuing coursework toward a technical or engineering Bachelor's degree or to graduate-level students 11 12 pursing coursework toward a technical or engineering Master's degree. Qualified applicants shall receive funds which may be 13 14 used to pay for tuition, books and other education-related expenses and fees. It is the intent of the Legislature that the 15 paid internship program shall be used as an incentive for students 16 17 pursuing a technical degree to develop job-related skills and to 18 encourage technical careers at MDITS.

(a) Attend a university, college or technical school
approved and designated by MDITS;

(b) Work a total of three hundred thirty six (336)
hours each summer at MDITS in Jackson, Mississippi;

(c) Agree to work with MDITS upon graduation for a period of time equivalent to the period of time for which the applicant receives compensation, calculated to the nearest whole month, but in no event less than two (2) years; and

(d) Satisfy the following conditions:

30 Undergraduate stipulations: Applicants must (i) 31 have successfully completed a minimum of fifty-eight (58) semester 32 hours toward a technical or engineering bachelor's degree from a Mississippi institution of higher learning and earned a minimum 33 34 cumulative Grade Point Average (GPA) of 3.0 on a 4.0 scale, which 35 GPA the applicant shall maintain if accepted into the program; or 36 (ii) Graduate stipulations: Applicants must have 37 met the regular admission standards of and have been accepted into 38 a technical or engineering master's program at a Mississippi

39 institution of higher learning. Accepted applicants shall 40 maintain a minimum cumulative GPA of 3.0 on a 4.0 scale in all 41 coursework counted toward the technical or engineering master's 42 degree.

No. 2718 23/SS36/R1091 PAGE 2 (cap\kr) 43 (3)Before being placed into the program, each (a) applicant shall enter into a contract with MDITS, which shall be 44 deemed a contract with the State of Mississippi, agreeing to the 45 46 terms and conditions upon which the internship shall be granted to 47 them. The contract shall include such terms and provisions 48 necessary to carry out the full purpose and intent of this The form of such contract shall be prepared and approved 49 section. 50 by the Attorney General of this state and shall be signed by the 51 executive director and the participant.

52 (b) Upon entry into the program, participants will 53 become employees of MDITS during their time in the program and 54 shall be eligible for benefits such as medical insurance paid by 55 the agency for the participant; however, in accordance with 56 Section 25-11-105, those participants shall not become members of 57 the Public Employees Retirement System while participating in the 58 program. Participants shall not accrue personal or major medical 59 leave while they are in the program.

(c) MDITS shall have the authority to cancel any
contract made between the agency and any program participant upon
such cause being deemed sufficient by the executive director.

(d) MDITS shall have full and complete authority and
power to sue in its own name any participant for any damages due
to the state on any such uncompleted contract, which suit shall be
filed and handled by the Attorney General. MDITS may contract
with a collections agency or banking institution, subject to

68 approval by the Attorney General, for collection of any damages due to the state from any participant. The State of Mississippi, 69 70 MDITS and its employees are immune from any suit brought in law or 71 equity for actions taken by the collection agency or banking institution incidental to or arising from their performance under 72 73 the contract. MDITS, the collection agency and banking 74 institution may negotiate for the payment of a sum that is less 75 than full payment in order to satisfy any damages the participant 76 owes the state, subject to approval by the executive directors.

77 Any participant who fails to complete (4)(a) undergraduate-or-graduate-level coursework toward a technical or 78 79 engineering degree or withdraws from school at any time before 80 completing their education shall be liable to repay to MDITS all 81 monies received during the time the recipient was in the program at the rate of pay received by the participant while in the 82 83 program, including benefits paid by the agency for the participant 84 and monies received for tuition, books and other education-related expenses and fees with interest accruing at ten percent (10%) per 85 86 annum from the date the participant failed or withdrew from 87 The participant will not be liable for repayment for any school. money earned during the required summer hours. Such money shall 88 89 be considered earned by the participant at the federal minimum 90 wage rate.

91 (b) All paid internship compensation received by the 92 participant while in school shall be considered earned,

93 conditioned upon the fulfillment of the terms and obligations of 94 the paid internship contract and this section. However, no recipient of the paid internship shall accrue personal or major 95 medical leave while the recipient is pursuing junior or senior 96 97 undergraduate-level coursework toward a technical or engineering 98 Bachelor's degree or graduate-level coursework toward a technical or engineering Master's degree. The participant shall not be 99 100 liable for liquidated damages.

101 If the recipient does not work at MDITS for the (C) period required under subsection (2)(c) of this section, the 102 103 recipient shall be liable for repayment on demand of the remaining 104 portion of the compensation that the recipient was paid while in 105 the program which has not been unconditionally earned, with 106 interest accruing at ten percent (10%) per annum from the 107 recipient's date of graduation or the date that the recipient last 108 worked at ITS, whichever is the later date. In addition, there 109 shall be included in any contract for paid student internship a provision for liquidated damages equal to Five Thousand Dollars 110 111 (\$5,000.00), which may be reduced on a pro rata basis for each 112 year served under such contract.

SECTION 2. Section 1 of this act shall be codified in Title 114 25, Chapter 53, Mississippi Code of 1972.

SECTION 3. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after July 1, 2023.
