## SENATE BILL NO. 2818

- AN ACT TO CREATE NEW SECTION 41-26-150, MISSISSIPPI CODE OF 1972, TO ESTABLISH THE JACKSON WATER REIMBURSEMENT GRANT PROGRAM TO BE ADMINISTERED BY THE DEPARTMENT OF HEALTH FOR THE PURPOSE OF ALLOWING CERTAIN REIMBURSEMENTS TO BUSINESSES, NON-PROFITS AND 5 CITIZENS WHO WERE SUBJECT TO VARIOUS ISSUES, INCLUDING BOIL-WATER 6 NOTICES AND LACK OF WATER PRESSURE, INVOLVING THE JACKSON WATER 7 SYSTEM; TO REQUIRE THE DEPARTMENT TO PROMULGATE RULES AND 8 REGULATIONS TO ADMINISTER THE PROGRAM; TO PROVIDE FOR CERTAIN 9 CONSIDERATIONS THAT THE DEPARTMENT MAY MAKE IN AWARDING GRANT 10 FUNDS; TO REQUIRE THE DEPARTMENT TO PROVIDE ANNUAL GRANT FUNDING 11 IN THE AMOUNT OF TWENTY MILLION DOLLARS TO THE JACKSON WATER 12 REIMBURSEMENT GRANT PROGRAM; AND FOR RELATED PURPOSES.
- 13 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI:
- 14 SECTION 1. The following shall be codified as Section
- 41-26-150, Mississippi Code of 1972: 15
- 16 41-26-150. (1) There is hereby established the City of
- 17 Jackson Water Reimbursement Grant Program.
- 18 (2) The Department of Health shall administer the grant
- program for the purpose of allowing certain reimbursements to 19
- 20 businesses, non-profits and citizens who were subject to various
- 21 issues, including boil-water notices and lack of water pressure,
- 22 involving the Jackson Water System. Applicants may apply for

- 24 including but not limited to, the cost to pay for bottled water.
- 25 (3) The Department of Health shall promulgate rules and
- 26 regulations to administer the grant program. The rules and
- 27 regulations promulgated by the Department of Health may include
- 28 the following considerations for recipients of grant funds:
- 29 (a) The amount of applicants;
- 30 (b) The number of household members per applicant;
- 31 (c) The size of the business or non-profit applying for
- 32 grant funds, with a particular emphasis on distributing grant
- 33 funds to non-profits and small or disadvantaged businesses; and
- 34 (d) The number of children, disabled individuals or
- 35 elderly members of an applicant's household.
- 36 (4) The Department of Health shall provide grant funding in
- 37 the amount of Twenty Million Dollars (\$20,000,000.00) to the
- 38 Jackson Water Reimbursement Grant Program.
- 39 **SECTION 2.** This act shall take effect and be in force from
- 40 and after July 1, 2023.
