- 6 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI:
- 7 SECTION 1. The following sums of money, or so much thereof

121	the maximum amount of services which may be provided fr	ee of

123	Code of 1972, the laboratory shall not provide any addi	tional
124	services from the funds appropriated under the provision	ons of
125	Sections 1 and 2 of this act if any charges for such se	ervices
126	previously provided are more than ninety (90) days past	due.
127	After all such delinquent charges have been paid by a c	client, the
128	laboratory may provide additional services to the clien	ıt.
129	SECTION 4. Of the funds appropriated in Section 2	of this

- 151 submitted to the Joint Legislative Budget Committee in a format
- 152 and level of detail comparable to the format and level of detail
- 153 provided during the Fiscal Year 2024 budget request process.
- 154 **SECTION 7.** The Board of Trustees of State Institutions of
- 155 Higher Learning shall report yearly to the Legislature any
- 156 institution not in compliance with Section 97-11-51, Mississippi
- 157 Code of 1972, which prohibits deficit spending.
- 158 **SECTION 8.** Any funds appropriated pursuant to this act and
- 159 paid as a fee to or deposited in a financial institution shall be
- 160 in compliance with Section 109 of the Constitution of the State of
- 161 Mississippi and Section 25-4-105, Mississippi Code of 1972.
- 162 **SECTION 9.** It is the intention of the Legislature that
- 163 whenever two (2) or more bids are received by this agency for the
- 164 purchase of commodities or equipment, and whenever all things
- 165 stated in such received bids are equal with respect to price,
- 166 quality and service, the Mississippi Industries for the Blind
- 167 shall be given preference. A similar preference shall be given to
- 168 the Mississippi Industries for the Blind whenever purchases are
- 169 made without competitive bids.

173	SECTION 11. It is the intention of the Legislature that the
174	funds herein appropriated shall be expended in compliance with
175	Section 27-104-25, Mississippi Code of 1972, that no state agency
176	shall incur obligations or indebtedness in excess of their
177	appropriation and that the responsible officers, either personally
178	or upon their official bonds, shall be held responsible for
179	actions contrary to this provision.
180	SECTION 12. The money herein appropriated shall be paid by
181	the State Treasurer out of any money in the State Treasury to the
182	credit of the proper fund or funds as set forth in this act, upon
183	warrants issued by the State Fiscal Officer; and the State Fiscal
184	Officer shall issue his warrants upon requisitions signed by the
185	proper person, officer or officers, in the manner provided by law.
