SENATE BILL NO. 3015 (As Sent to Governor)

1 2 3	AN ACT MAKING AN APPROPRIATION TO THE MISSISSIPPI BOARD OF ANIMAL HEALTH FOR THE PURPOSE OF DEFRAYING THE EXPENSES OF THE BOARD FOR FISCAL YEAR 2024.
4	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI:
5	SECTION 1. The following sum, or so much thereof as may be
6	necessary, is hereby appropriated out of any money in the State
7	General Fund not otherwise appropriated, for the purpose of
8	defraying the expenses of the Mississippi Board of Animal Health
9	for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 2023, and ending
10	June 30, 2024\$ 1,641,833.00.
11	SECTION 2. The following sum, or so much thereof as may be
12	necessary, is hereby authorized for expenditure out of any special
13	source funds which are collected by or otherwise become available
14	for the purpose of defraying the expenses of the Mississippi Board
15	of Animal Health, for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 2023, and
16	ending June 30, 2024\$ 1,253,690.00.
17	SECTION 3. Of the funds appropriated under the provisions of
18	this act, the following positions are authorized:

19 AUTHORIZED HEADCOUNT:

- 20 Permanent: 23
- 21 Time-Limited: 5
- 22 With the funds herein appropriated, it shall be the agency's
- 23 responsibility to make certain that funds required for Personal
- 24 Services for Fiscal Year 2025 do not exceed Fiscal Year 2024 funds
- 25 appropriated for that purpose unless programs or positions are
- 26 added to the agency's Fiscal Year 2024 budget by the Mississippi
- 27 Legislature. The Legislature shall determine the agency's
- 28 personal services appropriation, which the State Personnel Board
- 29 shall publish. The agency's personal services appropriation may
- 30 consist of restricted funds for approved vacancies for Fiscal Year
- 31 2024 that may not be utilized for active Fiscal Year 2023
- 32 Headcount. It shall be the agency's responsibility to ensure that
- 33 the funds provided for vacancies are used to increase headcount
- 34 and not for promotions, title changes, in-range salary adjustments
- 35 or any other mechanism for increasing salaries for current
- 36 employees. It is the Legislature's intention that no employee
- 37 salary falls below the minimum salary established by the
- 38 Mississippi State Personnel Board.
- 39 Additionally, the State Personnel Board shall determine and
- 40 publish the projected annualized payroll costs based on current
- 41 employees. It shall be the responsibility of the agency head to
- 42 ensure that actual personnel expenditures for Fiscal Year 2024 do
- 43 not exceed the data provided by the Legislative Budget Office. If

- 44 the agency's Fiscal Year 2024 projected cost exceeds the
- 45 annualized costs, no salary actions shall be processed by the
- 46 State Personnel Board except for new hires determined to be
- 47 essential for the agency.
- Any transfers or escalations shall be made in accordance with
- 49 the terms, conditions, and procedures established by law or
- 50 allowable under the terms set forth within this act. The State
- 51 Personnel Board shall not escalate positions without written
- 52 approval from the Department of Finance and Administration. The
- 53 Department of Finance and Administration shall not provide written
- 54 approval to escalate any funds for salaries and/or positions
- 55 without proof of availability of new or additional funds above the
- 56 appropriated level.
- 57 No general funds authorized to be expended herein shall be
- 58 used to replace federal funds and/or other special funds used for
- 59 salaries authorized under the provisions of this act and which are
- 60 withdrawn and no longer available.
- None of the funds herein appropriated shall be used in
- 62 violation of the Internal Revenue Service's Publication 15-A
- 63 relating to the reporting of income paid to contract employees, as
- 64 interpreted by the Office of the State Auditor.
- 65 **SECTION 4.** It is the intention of the Legislature that
- 66 whenever two (2) or more bids are received by this agency for the
- 67 purchase of commodities or equipment, and whenever all things
- 68 stated in such received bids are equal with respect to price,

- 69 quality and service, the Mississippi Industries for the Blind
- 70 shall be given preference. A similar preference shall be given to
- 71 the Mississippi Industries for the Blind whenever purchases are
- 72 made without competitive bids.
- 73 **SECTION 5.** The Mississippi Board of Animal Health is
- 74 authorized to accept and expend any grant, donation, or
- 75 contribution from any individual, public or private organization,
- 76 or government entity for purposes of defraying the operational
- 77 costs of the department. Such grants, donations, contributions,
- 78 and any carryover funds shall be received and expended under the
- 79 rules and regulations of the Department of Finance and
- 80 Administration in a manner consistent with the escalation of
- 81 federal funds not to exceed Five Hundred Thousand Dollars
- 82 (\$500,000.00).
- 83 **SECTION 6.** It is the intention of the Legislature that the
- 84 funds herein appropriated shall be expended in compliance with
- 85 Section 27-104-25, Mississippi Code of 1972, that no state agency
- 86 shall incur obligations or indebtedness in excess of their
- 87 appropriation and that the responsible officers, either personally
- 88 or upon their official bonds, shall be held responsible for
- 89 actions contrary to this provision.
- 90 **SECTION 7.** Of the funds in Section 2 of this act, Two Hundred
- 91 Fifty Thousand Dollars (\$250,000.00) is provided from the Animal
- 92 Health Disaster Response Fund as created in House Bill No. 603,
- 93 2023 Regular Session. These funds are provided for expenses

- 94 incurred by the Board of Animal Health in responding to animal
- 95 disease outbreaks as outlined in House Bill No. 603, 2023 Regular
- 96 Session.
- 97 **SECTION 8.** Of the funds appropriated under the provisions of
- 98 Section 2 of this act, One Hundred Twelve Thousand Five Hundred
- 99 Dollars (\$112,500.00), or so much thereof, shall be derived out of
- 100 any money in the State Treasury to the credit of the Capital
- 101 Expense Fund, as created in Section 27-103-303, Mississippi Code
- 102 of 1972, and allocated in a manner as determined by the State
- 103 Treasurer. These funds are provided to the Board of Animal Health
- 104 for the purpose of purchasing new vehicles.
- 105 **SECTION 9.** The money herein appropriated shall be paid by
- 106 the State Treasurer out of any money in the State Treasury to the
- 107 credit of the proper fund or funds as set forth in this act, upon
- 108 warrants issued by the State Fiscal Officer; and the State Fiscal
- 109 Officer shall issue his warrants upon requisitions signed by the
- 110 proper person, officer or officers in the manner provided by law.
- 111 SECTION 10. This act shall take effect and be in force from
- 112 and after July 1, 2023.
