The Legislature shall determine the agency's 50 51 personal services appropriation, which the State Personnel Board 52 shall publish. The agency's personal services appropriation may 53 consist of restricted funds for approved vacancies for Fiscal Year 54 2024 that may not be utilized for active Fiscal Year 2023 55 Headcount. If the agency's Fiscal Year 2024 projected cost exceeds the annualized costs, no salary actions shall be processed by the

193	SECTION 6. The Department of Mental Health and its
194	facilities shall have the authority, within funding and spending
195	authority appropriated under the provisions of this act to
196	transfer funds to the Division of Medicaid in payment of Medicaid
197	match and designate that the funds thus transferred shall be
198	applied to Medicaid match obligations arising in the subsequent
199	fiscal year.

- 200 SECTION 7. Any person within the Department of Mental Health 201 who must work on a statutory holiday or any holiday proclaimed by the Governor may, at the discretion of the Director of the 202 203 Institution and the Executive Director of the Department of Mental 204 Health and within available personnel funds, be paid "call-back 205 pay" in lieu of "compensatory time credit."
- 206 SECTION 8. Of the funds appropriated to the "Service 207 Budget, " funds are included for the support of community mental health services for Fiscal Year 2024. 208
- 209 Provided, however, that none of the funds appropriated for the support of community mental health services shall be made 210 211 available to any Regional Mental Health/Intellectual Disability 212 Center which does not receive from each of its participating 213 counties a dollar amount equivalent to what the proceeds of a 214 three-fourths (3/4) mill tax on all taxable property in the county 215 in Fiscal Year 1982 would have been or the amount of funds 216 contributed to the center by the county in Fiscal Year 1984,

whichever shall be greater. By means of performance contracts,

218	the Department of Mental Health shall disburse the funds
219	appropriated in this section for services for the mentally ill,
220	intellectually disabled and alcohol/drug abusers. The State Board
221	of Mental Health and the Department of Mental Health shall be
222	responsible for selecting the types of services which shall be
223	provided with the funds appropriated in this section, for
224	developing and monitoring performance contracts and for holding
225	contractors accountable for utilization of funds.

SECTION 9. Ellisville State School is authorized to draw up
to Four Hundred Fifty Thousand Dollars (\$450,000.00) from interest
earned on funds invested in Ellisville State School Client's Trust
Fund for the purpose of supplementing the cost related to
supplies, property, and equipment in direct care.

SECTION 10. The Department of Mental Health and its facilities shall have the express legal authority, within funding and spending authority appropriated under the provisions of this act to purchase land for use by residential facilities operated by the department, either directly or by means of transferring funds to the Bureau of Building, Grounds and Real Property Management, and to transfer such funds to the Bureau of Building, Grounds, and Real Property Management for the purposes of constructing and equipping group homes for persons with mental illness, intellectual disability, and/or substance abuse; constructing and equipping such other buildings as may be required for treatment of persons with mental illness, intellectual disability, and/or

- substance abuse; repair and renovate existing buildings; and to construct, repair and/or renovate employee housing. Any intermediate care facilities for individuals with intellectual disabilities (ICF/IID) constructed with funds authorized in this section shall be authorized to participate in Medicaid funding available for such services.
- 249 SECTION 11. It is the intention of the Legislature that the 250 Department of Mental Health shall maintain complete accounting and 251 personnel records related to the expenditure of all funds 252 appropriated under this act and that such records shall be in the 253 same format and level of detail as maintained for Fiscal Year 254 2023. It is further the intention of the Legislature that the 255 agency's budget request for Fiscal Year 2025 shall be submitted to 256 the Joint Legislative Budget Committee in a format and level of 257 detail comparable to the format and level of detail provided 258 during the Fiscal Year 2024 budget request process.
- 259 SECTION 12. It is the intention of the Legislature that none of the funds provided herein shall be used to pay certain 260 261 utilities for state-furnished housing for any employees. 262 utilities shall include electricity, natural gas, butane, propane, 263 cable and phone services. Where actual cost cannot be determined, 264 the agency shall be required to provide meters to be in compliance 265 with legislative intent. Such state-furnished housing shall 266 include single-family and multifamily residences but shall not

include any dormitory residences. Allowances for such utilities shall be prohibited.

Executive Director of the Department of Mental Health shall have authority to transfer cash from one special fund treasury fund to another special fund treasury fund under the control of the Department of Mental Health. The purpose of this authority is to more efficiently use available cash reserves. It is further the intention of the Legislature that the Executive Director of the Department of Mental Health shall submit written justification for the transfer to the Legislative Budget Office and the Department of Finance and Administration. None of the funds transferred with this section may be transferred to the Central Office for Personal Services.

SECTION 14. Of the funds appropriated under the provisions of this act, Twenty-three Million Three Hundred Twenty-nine Thousand Dollars (\$23,329,000.00) is provided to the Department of Mental Health to expand those community-based services that will improve the State of Mississippi's compliance with the Olmstead decision of the United States Supreme Court. Further, it is the intention of the Legislature that the Department of Mental Health shall have the authority to transfer such sums from this source as are necessary to implement or improve those community services that are more appropriately addressed by the Mississippi Department of Education and/or the Mississippi Department of

- 292 Rehabilitation Services to those agencies for that purpose. 293 Further, it is the intention of the Legislature that any sums 294 received from this source that are not expended during the fiscal 295 year ending June 30, 2023, by the Mississippi Department of Mental 296 Health shall be reappropriated for the same purpose during the 297 fiscal year ending June 30, 2024. Further, it is the intention of 298 the Legislature that the Department of Mental Health shall account 299 for the expenditure of these funds in sufficient detail to clearly 300 show the purposes for which such funds were expended. 301 Executive Director of the Department of Mental Health shall report 302 any such reappropriation to the Legislative Budget Office no later 303 than fifteen (15) days after the effective date of the

- 347 **SECTION 19.** None of the funds provided in Section 1, 2, or 3

370	SECTION 24. Of the funds appropriated in Section 1 of this

373	(\$2,568,169.00) is provided as an increase over and above the
374	Fiscal Year 2023 appropriation level of funding for Two Hundred
375	(200) ID/DD Home and Community Based Waiver slots.
376	SECTION 25. It is the intention of the Legislature that the
377	Department of Mental Health shall provide a report on the pilot
378	program created to provide mental health services to former
379	inmates of the Department of Corrections who are no longer
380	incarcerated within a correctional institution of the Department
381	of Corrections. This report shall be provided on December 15th of
382	the current fiscal year to the Chairmen of the Senate and House
383	Public Health and Appropriations Committees.
384	SECTION 26. With the funds appropriated herein, the
385	Department of Mental Health is authorized to make payment for
386	expenses incurred during Fiscal Year 2021 as follows:

389	SECTION 27. The money herein appropriated shall be paid by

the State Treasurer out of any money in the State Treasury to the

393	Officer shall issue his warrants upon requisitions signed by the
394	proper person, officer or officers in the manner provided by law.
395	SECTION 28. This act shall take effect and be in force from
396	and after July 1, 2023.
