SENATE BILL NO. 3026 (As Sent to Governor)

1 AN ACT MAKING AN APPROPRIATION FOR THE SUPPORT AND 2 MAINTENANCE OF THE OFFICE OF STATE AID ROAD CONSTRUCTION OF THE 3 MISSISSIPPI DEPARTMENT OF TRANSPORTATION FOR FISCAL YEAR 2024. 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI: 5 SECTION 1. The following sum, or so much thereof as may be 6 necessary, is appropriated out of any money in the State Treasury to the credit of the Office of State Aid Road Construction Fund, 7 for the purpose of defraying the expenses of the Office of State 8 9 Aid Road Construction of the Mississippi Department of Transportation for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 2023, and 10 11 ending June 30, 2024.....\$ 210,120,434.00. 12 SECTION 2. Of the funds appropriated under the provisions of this act, the following positions are authorized: 13 14 AUTHORIZED HEADCOUNT: 54 15 Permanent: 0 16 Time-Limited: With the funds herein appropriated, it shall be the agency's 17 18 responsibility to make certain that funds required for Personal

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Services for Fiscal Year 2025 do not exceed Fiscal Year 2024 funds 19 20 appropriated for that purpose unless programs or positions are added to the agency's Fiscal Year 2024 budget by the Mississippi 21 22 Legislature. The Legislature shall determine the agency's 23 personal services appropriation, which the State Personnel Board 24 shall publish. The agency's personal services appropriation may consist of restricted funds for approved vacancies for Fiscal Year 25 26 2024 that may not be utilized for active Fiscal Year 2023 27 Headcount. It shall be the agency's responsibility to ensure that the funds provided for vacancies are used to increase headcount 28 29 and not for promotions, title changes, in-range salary adjustments 30 or any other mechanism for increasing salaries for current 31 employees. It is the Legislature's intention that no employee 32 salary falls below the minimum salary established by the 33 Mississippi State Personnel Board.

34 Additionally, the State Personnel Board shall determine and 35 publish the projected annualized payroll costs based on current employees. It shall be the responsibility of the agency head to 36 ensure that actual personnel expenditures for Fiscal Year 2024 do 37 38 not exceed the data provided by the Legislative Budget Office. Ιf 39 the agency's Fiscal Year 2024 projected cost exceeds the 40 annualized costs, no salary actions shall be processed by the State Personnel Board except for new hires determined to be 41 42 essential for the agency.

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43 Any transfers or escalations shall be made in accordance with the terms, conditions, and procedures established by law or 44 allowable under the terms set forth within this act. 45 The State Personnel Board shall not escalate positions without written 46 47 approval from the Department of Finance and Administration. The 48 Department of Finance and Administration shall not provide written approval to escalate any funds for salaries and/or positions 49 50 without proof of availability of new or additional funds above the 51 appropriated level.

52 No general funds authorized to be expended herein shall be 53 used to replace federal funds and/or other special funds used for 54 salaries authorized under the provisions of this act and which are 55 withdrawn and no longer available.

None of the funds herein appropriated shall be used in violation of the Internal Revenue Service's Publication 15-A relating to the reporting of income paid to contract employees, as interpreted by the Office of the State Auditor.

60 SECTION 3. Of the funds appropriated in Section 1 of this act, it is the intention of the Legislature that an amount not to 61 62 exceed Five Hundred Thousand Dollars (\$500,000.00) is authorized 63 to be expended from funds received from the Mississippi 64 Development Authority as reimbursements for actual expenses incurred by the Office of State Aid Road Construction for 65 66 administering and providing engineering services to political subdivisions as authorized under Section 65-4-15, Mississippi Code 67

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State Aid Roads Administrative Fund for the fiscal year beginning
July 1, 2023, and ending June 30, 2024.

SECTION 4. Of the funds appropriated in Section 1, it is the intention of the Legislature that an amount not to exceed Thirty Million Dollars (\$30,000,000.00) is authorized to be expended for the purpose of replacement of structurally deficient bridges on the Local System Bridge Program (LSBP).

76 SECTION 5. It is the intention of the Legislature that the 77 Office of State Aid Road Construction shall maintain complete 78 accounting and personnel records related to the expenditure of all 79 funds appropriated under this act and that such records shall be 80 in the same format and level of detail as maintained for Fiscal 81 Year 2023. It is further the intention of the Legislature that 82 the agency's budget request for Fiscal Year 2025 shall be 83 submitted to the Joint Legislative Budget Committee in a format 84 and level of detail comparable to the format and level of detail provided during the Fiscal Year 2024 budget request process. 85

SECTION 6. In compliance with the "Mississippi Performance Budget and Strategic Planning Act of 1994," it is the intent of the Legislature that the funds provided herein shall be utilized in the most efficient and effective manner possible to achieve the intended mission of this agency. Based on the funding authorized, this agency shall make every effort to attain the targeted performance measures provided below:

140	SECTION 7. With the funds appropriated in this	act, the	
141	Office of State Aid Road Construction shall notify m	embers of the	
142	Mississippi Senate and House of Representatives upon	the award of	

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143 projects within their respective districts and at least five (5) 144 days prior to a public ceremony announcing the award of any grant in their district or any public announcement or ceremony regarding 145 the groundbreaking or opening of a facility, roadway or bridge for 146 147 which the Legislature has made funds available. Any signage 148 regarding any public event or any new facility, roadway or bridge shall include the following language: "Funds were made available 149 for this project by the Mississippi State Legislature." The 150 151 signage shall further state the four-year legislative term in 152 which the project was funded.

153 SECTION 8. It is the intention of the Legislature to 154 authorize the State Aid Engineer to utilize funds available to the 155 Office of State Aid Road Construction, from any source herein 156 appropriated or made available by the counties or any other source, to pay for costs necessary to comply with the National 157 158 Bridge Inspection Standards and the Federal Highway 159 Administration's requirements for bridge inspections and/or 160 special studies necessary to comply with federal laws. The State 161 Aid Engineer shall follow the same procedures as have heretofore 162 been established by Sections 65-9-9, 65-9-15 and 65-9-17, 163 Mississippi Code of 1972, for payment of such costs. The Office 164 of State Aid Road Construction may accept, budget and expend these 165 funds subject to and in accordance with rules and regulations of 166 the Department of Finance and Administration in a manner 167 consistent with the escalation of federal or state funds.

It is the intention of the Legislature that in 169 the letting of contracts for which the Office of State Aid Road 170 Construction administers and provides engineering services to 171 political subdivisions under the Economic Development Highway Act, 172 bids may be made from the lowest and best bidder after advertising 173 for competitive sealed bids once in a newspaper published or having a circulation in the county or municipality where the 174 175 contract will be performed, and the date published for the bid 176 opening may be not less than seven (7) working days after the 177 advertisement is published.

178 SECTION 10. It is the intention of the Legislature that 179 whenever two (2) or more bids are received by this agency for the 180 purchase of commodities or equipment, and whenever all things 181 stated in such received bids are equal with respect to price, quality and service, the Mississippi Industries for the Blind 182 183 shall be given preference. A similar preference shall be given to 184 the Mississippi Industries for the Blind whenever purchases are 185 made without competitive bids.

SECTION 11. It is the intention of the Legislature that the funds herein appropriated shall be expended in compliance with Section 27-104-25, Mississippi Code of 1972, that no state agency shall incur obligations or indebtedness in excess of their appropriation and that the responsible officers, either personally or upon their official bonds, shall be held responsible for actions contrary to this provision.

202 SECTION 13. The money herein appropriated shall be paid by 203 the State Treasurer out of any money in the State Treasury to the 204 credit of the proper fund or funds as set forth in this act, upon 205 warrants issued by the State Fiscal Officer; and the State Fiscal 206 Officer shall issue his warrants upon requisitions signed by the 207 proper person, officer or officers, in the manner provided by law. 208 SECTION 14. This act shall take effect and be in force from 209 and after July 1, 2023.
