1 2	AN ACT MAKING AN APPROPRIATION OF SPECIAL FUNDS TO THE MISSISSIPPI STATE BOARD OF DENTAL EXAMINERS FOR FISCAL YEAR 2024.
3	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI:
4	SECTION 1. The following sum, or so much thereof as may be
5	necessary, is hereby appropriated out of any money in the State
6	Treasury to the credit of the Mississippi State Board of Dental
7	Examiners, for the support of said board for the fiscal year
8	beginning July 1, 2023, and ending June 30, 2024
9	\$ 1,047,856.00.
LO	SECTION 2. Of the funds appropriated under the provisions of
L1	this act, the following positions are authorized:
L2	AUTHORIZED HEADCOUNT:
L3	Permanent: 7

L5	With the funds herein appropriated, it shall be the agency's
L 6	responsibility to make certain that funds required for Personal
L7	Services for Fiscal Year 2025 do not exceed Fiscal Year 2024 funds
L 8	appropriated for that purpose unless programs or positions are
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19	added t	o the	agency's	Fiscal	Year	2024	budget	by	the	Missi	ssip	pi
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- 20 Legislature. The Legislature shall determine the agency's
- 21 personal services appropriation, which shall be published by the
- 22 State Personnel Board. Additionally, the State Personnel Board
- 23 shall determine and publish the projected annualized payroll costs
- 24 based on current employees. It shall be the responsibility of the
- 25 agency head to ensure that actual personnel expenditures for
- 26 Fiscal Year 2024 do not exceed the data provided by the
- 27 Legislative Budget Office. If the agency's Fiscal Year 2024
- 28 projected cost exceeds the annualized costs, no salary actions
- 29 shall be processed by the State Personnel Board with the exception
- 30 of new hires that are determined to be essential for the agency.
- 31 Any transfers or escalations shall be made in accordance with
- 32 the terms, conditions and procedures established by law or
- 33 allowable under the terms set forth within this act. The State
- 34 Personnel Board shall not escalate positions without written
- 35 approval from the Department of Finance and Administration. The
- 36 Department of Finance and Administration shall not provide written
- 37 approval to escalate any funds for salaries and/or positions
- 38 without proof of availability of new or additional funds above the
- 39 appropriated level.
- 40 No general funds authorized to be expended herein shall be
- 41 used to replace federal funds and/or other special funds which are
- 42 being used for salaries authorized under the provisions of this
- 43 act and which are withdrawn and no longer available.

44		None	of	the	funds	herein	appropriated	shall	be	used	in
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- 45 violation of Internal Revenue Service's Publication 15-A relating
- to the reporting of income paid to contract employees, as 46
- 47 interpreted by the Office of the State Auditor.
- 48 Funds have been appropriated herein for the purpose of
- funding Project SEC2 minimum salaries for all employees covered 49
- 50 under the Colonel Guy Groff/Neville Kenning Variable Compensation
- It shall be the agency's responsibility to ensure that the 51
- funds are used to increase all employees' salaries up to the 52
- minimum level as determined by the State Personnel Board. 53
- 54 SECTION 3. Of the funds provided under the provisions of
- this act, an amount not to exceed Twenty-seven Thousand Dollars 55
- 56 (\$27,000.00) shall be allocated to the Mississippi Board of
- 57 Pharmacy to defray the expenses of the Mississippi Prescription
- 58 Monitoring Program.
- 59 SECTION 4. It is the intention of the Legislature that the
- 60 funds herein appropriated shall be expended in compliance with
- Section 27-104-25, Mississippi Code of 1972, that no state agency 61
- 62 shall incur obligations or indebtedness in excess of their
- 63 appropriation and that the responsible officers, either personally
- 64 or upon their official bonds, shall be held responsible for
- 65 actions contrary to this provision.
- SECTION 5. It is the intention of the Legislature that 66
- 67 whenever two (2) or more bids are received by this agency for the
- purchase of commodities or equipment, and whenever all things 68

- 69 stated in such received bids are equal with respect to price,
- 70 quality and service, the Mississippi Industries for the Blind
- 71 shall be given preference. A similar preference shall be given to
- 72 the Mississippi Industries for the Blind whenever purchases are
- 73 made without competitive bids.
- 74 **SECTION 6.** The money herein appropriated shall be paid by
- 75 the State Treasurer out of any money in the State Treasury to the
- 76 credit of the proper fund or funds as set forth in this act, upon
- 77 warrants issued by the State Fiscal Officer; and the State Fiscal
- 78 Officer shall issue his warrants upon requisitions signed by the
- 79 proper person, officer or officers, in the manner provided by law.
- 80 **SECTION 7.** This act shall take effect and be in force from
- 81 and after July 1, 2023, and shall stand repealed from and after
- 82 June 30, 2023.
