## SENATE BILL NO. 3036 (As Sent to Governor)

1 2 3	AN ACT MAKING AN APPROPRIATION FOR THE PURPOSE OF DEFRAYING THE EXPENSES OF THE MISSISSIPPI GAMING COMMISSION FOR FISCAL YEAR 2024.
4	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI:
5	SECTION 1. The following sum, or so much thereof as may be
6	necessary, is hereby appropriated out of any money in the State
7	General Fund not otherwise appropriated for the purpose of
8	defraying the expenses of the Mississippi Gaming Commission for
9	the fiscal year beginning July 1, 2023, and ending
10	June 30, 2024\$ 9,022,834.00.
11	SECTION 2. The following sum, or so much thereof as may be
12	necessary, is appropriated out of any money in the special fund in
13	the State Treasury to the credit of the Mississippi Gaming
14	Commission, for the purpose of defraying the expenses of the
15	commission for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 2023, and ending
16	June 30, 2024\$ 1,637,292.00.
17	SECTION 3. Of the funds appropriated under the provisions of
18	this act, the following positions are authorized:

## 19 AUTHORIZED HEADCOUNT:

- 20 Permanent: 120
- 21 Time-Limited: 0
- 22 With the funds herein appropriated, it shall be the agency's
- 23 responsibility to make certain that funds required for Personal
- 24 Services for Fiscal Year 2025 do not exceed Fiscal Year 2024 funds
- 25 appropriated for that purpose unless programs or positions are
- 26 added to the agency's Fiscal Year 2024 budget by the Mississippi
- 27 Legislature. The Legislature shall determine the agency's
- 28 personal services appropriation, which the State Personnel Board
- 29 shall publish. The agency's personal services appropriation may
- 30 consist of restricted funds for approved vacancies for Fiscal Year
- 31 2024 that may not be utilized for active Fiscal Year 2023
- 32 Headcount. It shall be the agency's responsibility to ensure that
- 33 the funds provided for vacancies are used to increase headcount
- 34 and not for promotions, title changes, in-range salary adjustments
- 35 or any other mechanism for increasing salaries for current
- 36 employees. It is the Legislature's intention that no employee
- 37 salary falls below the minimum salary established by the
- 38 Mississippi State Personnel Board.
- 39 Additionally, the State Personnel Board shall determine and
- 40 publish the projected annualized payroll costs based on current
- 41 employees. It shall be the responsibility of the agency head to
- 42 ensure that actual personnel expenditures for Fiscal Year 2024 do
- 43 not exceed the data provided by the Legislative Budget Office. If

- 44 the agency's Fiscal Year 2024 projected cost exceeds the
- 45 annualized costs, no salary actions shall be processed by the
- 46 State Personnel Board except for new hires determined to be
- 47 essential for the agency.
- Any transfers or escalations shall be made in accordance with
- 49 the terms, conditions, and procedures established by law or
- 50 allowable under the terms set forth within this act. The State
- 51 Personnel Board shall not escalate positions without written
- 52 approval from the Department of Finance and Administration. The
- 53 Department of Finance and Administration shall not provide written
- 54 approval to escalate any funds for salaries and/or positions
- 55 without proof of availability of new or additional funds above the
- 56 appropriated level.
- 57 No general funds authorized to be expended herein shall be
- 58 used to replace federal funds and/or other special funds used for
- 59 salaries authorized under the provisions of this act and which are
- 60 withdrawn and no longer available.
- None of the funds herein appropriated shall be used in
- 62 violation of the Internal Revenue Service's Publication 15-A
- 63 relating to the reporting of income paid to contract employees, as
- 64 interpreted by the Office of the State Auditor.
- 65 **SECTION 4.** Of the funds appropriated in Section 2 of this
- 66 act, a portion shall be derived from the amount of forfeited
- 67 property that is seized by the Gaming Commission, which shall be
- 68 deposited into a special fund created by the Department of Finance

- 69 and Administration and may be expended by the commission for the
- 70 specific purpose of increasing law enforcement resources as
- 71 outlined in Section 41-29-185, Mississippi Code 1972.
- 72 **SECTION 5.** Of the funds appropriated in Section 2 of this
- 73 act, a portion shall be derived from the amount that is received
- 74 by the Gaming Commission under the Gaming Control Act, which shall
- 75 be deposited into a special fund created by the Department of
- 76 Finance and Administration and may be expended by the commission
- 77 for the purpose of investigating, permitting, interagency fees,
- 78 and providing fingerprint analysis by the Department of Public
- 79 Safety.
- 80 **SECTION 6.** It is the intention of the Legislature that
- 81 whenever two (2) or more bids are received by this agency for the
- 82 purchase of commodities or equipment, and whenever all things
- 83 stated in such received bids are equal with respect to price,
- 84 quality and service, the Mississippi Industries for the Blind
- 85 shall be given preference. A similar preference shall be given to
- 86 the Mississippi Industries for the Blind whenever purchases are
- 87 made without competitive bids.
- 88 **SECTION 7.** It is the intention of the Legislature that the
- 89 Gaming Commission shall maintain complete accounting and personnel
- 90 records related to the expenditure of all funds appropriated under
- 91 this act and that such records shall be in the same format and
- 92 level of detail as maintained for Fiscal Year 2023. It is further
- 93 the intention of the Legislature that the agency's budget request

94	for Fiscal Year 2025 shall be submitted to the Joi	nt Legislative
95	Budget Committee in a format and level of detail of	comparable to the
96	format and level of detail provided during the Fis	scal Year 2024
97	budget request process.	
98	SECTION 8. In compliance with the "Mississip	ppi Performance
99	Budget and Strategic Planning Act of 1994," it is	the intent of
100	the Legislature that the funds provided herein sha	all be utilized
101	in the most efficient and effective manner possibl	e to achieve the
102	intended mission of this agency. Based on the fur	ding authorized,
103	this agency shall make every effort to attain the	targeted
104	performance measures provided below:

119	set above have been or are being achieved shall be provided in the
120	agency's budget request submitted to the Joint Legislative Budget
121	Committee for Fiscal Year 2025.
122	SECTION 9. It is the intention of the Legislature that the
123	funds herein appropriated shall be expended in compliance with
124	Section 27-104-25, Mississippi Code of 1972, that no state agency
125	shall incur obligations or indebtedness in excess of their
126	appropriation and that the responsible officers, either personally
127	or upon their official bonds, shall be held responsible for
128	actions contrary to this provision.
129	SECTION 10. Of the funds appropriated in Section 1 of this
130	act, it is the intention of the Legislature that Seventy-five
131	Thousand Dollars (\$75,000.00) is authorized to be transferred to
132	the nonprofit organization, Mississippi Council on Compulsive
133	Gambling, which provides crisis intervention and support services.
134	SECTION 11. The money herein appropriated shall be paid by
135	the State Treasurer out of any money in the State Treasury to the
136	credit of the proper fund or funds as set forth in this act, upon
137	warrants issued by the State Fiscal Officer; and the State Fiscal
138	Officer shall issue his warrants upon requisitions signed by the
139	proper person, officer or officers in the manner provided by law.
140	SECTION 12. This act shall take effect and be in force from
141	and after July 1, 2023.
