1 2 3	AN ACT MAKING AN APPROPRIATION FOR THE PURPOSE OF DEFRAYING THE EXPENSES OF THE STATE DEPARTMENT OF AUDIT FOR FISCAL YEAR 2024.
4	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI:
5	SECTION 1. The following sum, or so much thereof as may be
6	necessary, is hereby appropriated out of any funds in the State
7	General Fund not otherwise appropriated, for the purpose of paying
8	salaries and defraying the expenses of the State Department of
9	Audit in making the audits and investigations of public offices of
10	the state and counties as provided by Section 7-7-201 et seq.,
11	Mississippi Code of 1972, for the fiscal year beginning
12	July 1, 2023, and ending June 30, 2024\$ 8,736,506.00.
13	SECTION 2. The following sum, or so much thereof as may be
14	necessary, is hereby appropriated out of any special funds in the
15	State Treasury to the credit of the State Department of Audit's
16	special fund account for the purpose of paying salaries and
17	defraying the expenses of the State Department of Audit in making
18	the audits and investigations of public offices of the state and

19	counties as provided by Section 7-7-201 et seq., Mississippi Code
20	of 1972, for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 2023, and ending
21	June 30, 2024\$ 3,880,990.00.
22	SECTION 3. Of the funds appropriated under the provisions of
23	this act, the following positions are authorized:
24	AUTHORIZED HEADCOUNT:
25	Permanent: 154
26	Time-Limited: 0
27	With the funds herein appropriated, it shall be the agency's
28	responsibility to make certain that funds required for Personal
29	Services for Fiscal Year 2025 do not exceed Fiscal Year 2024 funds
30	appropriated for that purpose unless programs or positions are
31	added to the agency's Fiscal Year 2024 budget by the Mississippi
32	Legislature. The Legislature shall determine the agency's
33	personal services appropriation, which shall be published by the
34	State Personnel Board. Additionally, the State Personnel Board
35	shall determine and publish the projected annualized payroll costs
36	based on current employees. It shall be the responsibility of the
37	agency head to ensure that actual personnel expenditures for
38	Fiscal Year 2024 do not exceed the data provided by the
39	Legislative Budget Office. If the agency's Fiscal Year 2024
40	projected cost exceeds the annualized costs, no salary actions
41	shall be processed by the State Personnel Board with the exception
42	of new hires that are determined to be essential for the agency.

43	Any transfers or escalations shall be made in accordance with
44	the terms, conditions and procedures established by law or
45	allowable under the terms set forth within this act. The State
46	Personnel Board shall not escalate positions without written
47	approval from the Department of Finance and Administration. The
48	Department of Finance and Administration shall not provide written
49	approval to escalate any funds for salaries and/or positions
50	without proof of availability of new or additional funds above the
51	appropriated level.

- 52 No general funds authorized to be expended herein shall be 53 used to replace federal funds and/or other special funds which are 54 being used for salaries authorized under the provisions of this 55 act and which are withdrawn and no longer available.
- 56 None of the funds herein appropriated shall be used in violation of Internal Revenue Service's Publication 15-A relating 57 58 to the reporting of income paid to contract employees, as 59 interpreted by the Office of the State Auditor.
- 60 Funds have been appropriated herein for the purpose of 61 funding Project SEC2 minimum salaries for all employees covered 62 under the Colonel Guy Groff/Neville Kenning Variable Compensation It shall be the agency's responsibility to ensure that the 63 funds are used to increase all employees' salaries up to the 64 minimum level as determined by the State Personnel Board. 65
- 66 SECTION 4. In compliance with the "Mississippi Performance Budget and Strategic Planning Act of 1994," it is the intent of 67

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68	the Legislature that the funds provided herein shall be utilized
69	in the most efficient and effective manner possible to achieve the
70	intended mission of this agency. Based on the funding authorized,
71	this agency shall make every effort to attain the targeted
72	performance measures provided below:

107	agency's budget request submitted to the Joint Legislative Budget
108	Committee for Fiscal Year 2025.
109	SECTION 5. It is the intention of the Legislature that
110	whenever two (2) or more bids are received by this agency for the
111	purchase of commodities or equipment, and whenever all things
112	stated in such received bids are equal with respect to price,
113	quality and service, the Mississippi Industries for the Blind
114	shall be given preference. A similar preference shall be given to
115	the Mississippi Industries for the Blind whenever purchases are
116	made without competitive bids.

117	SECTION 6. Of the funds appropriated in Section 2 of this
118	act, it is the intention of the Legislature that Thirty Thousand
119	Dollars (\$30,000.00) is provided for the purpose of paying fees
120	for a CPA Review Course for the Office of the State Auditor's
121	employees to be reimbursed over a 12-month period by the employee
122	taking the course.

- 123 SECTION 7. It is the intention of the Legislature that the 124 State Auditor is hereby authorized to escalate, budget and expend 125 funds from any source made available to comply with the Single 126 Audit Act of 1984 for the purpose of employing staff, paying 127 related expenses, or to engage private accountants, as necessary, 128 to comply with the provisions of the act, in accordance with rules 129 and regulations of the Department of Finance and Administration in a manner consistent with the escalation of federal funds.
- 131 SECTION 8. No more than One Million Dollars (\$1,000,000.00) 132 may be provided to defray expenses incurred by the Office of the 133 State Auditor pursuant to the rules and regulations of the United States Department of Justice Federal Equitable Sharing Program. 134 135 These funds may only be used for nonbudgeted law enforcement 136 purposes by the Office of the State Auditor.
- 137 SECTION 9. It is the intention of the Legislature that the 138 State Department of Audit shall maintain complete accounting and 139 personnel records related to the expenditure of all funds 140 appropriated under this act and that such records shall be in the same format and level of detail as maintained for Fiscal Year 141

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142	2023. It is further the intention of the Legislature that the
143	agency's budget request for Fiscal Year 2025 shall be submitted to
144	the Joint Legislative Budget Committee in a format and level of
145	detail comparable to the format and level of detail provided
146	during the Fiscal Year 2024 budget request process.
147	SECTION 10. Of the funds appropriated in Section 2 of this
148	act, it is the intention of the Legislature that Two Hundred
149	Thousand Dollars (\$200,000.00) is provided for the purpose of the
150	Accountancy Fellowship Program as provided by Section 7-7-204, et
151	seq., Mississippi Code of 1972.

SECTION 11. The money herein appropriated shall be paid by the State Treasurer out of any money in the State Treasury to the credit of the proper fund or funds as set forth in this act, upon warrants issued by the State Fiscal Officer; and the State Fiscal Officer shall issue his warrants upon requisitions signed by the proper person, officer or officers in the manner provided by law.

SECTION 12. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after July 1, 2023, and shall stand repealed from and after June 30, 2023.

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
