SENATE BILL NO. 3049

1 AN ACT MAKING AN APPROPRIATION TO DEFRAY THE EXPENSES OF THE  
2 OFFICE OF THE SECRETARY OF STATE FOR FISCAL YEAR 2024.

3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI:

4 **SECTION 1.** The following sum, or so much thereof as may be  
5 necessary, is hereby appropriated out of any money in the State  
6 General Fund not otherwise appropriated, for the support and  
7 maintenance of the Secretary of State for the fiscal year  
8 beginning July 1, 2023, and ending June 30, 2024.....  
9 .....\$ 12,062,675.00.

10 **SECTION 2.** The following sum, or so much thereof as may be  
11 necessary, is hereby authorized for expenditure out of any special  
12 source funds which are collected by or otherwise become available  
13 for the purpose of defraying the expenses of the Secretary of  
14 State for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 2023, and ending  
15 June 30, 2024.....\$ 17,420,640.00.

16 **SECTION 3.** Of the funds appropriated under the provisions of  
17 Section 1, the following positions are authorized:

18 AUTHORIZED HEADCOUNT:



19 Permanent: 88

20 Time-Limited: 12

21 With the funds herein appropriated, it shall be the agency's  
22 responsibility to make certain that funds required for Personal  
23 Services for Fiscal Year 2025 do not exceed Fiscal Year 2024 funds  
24 appropriated for that purpose unless programs or positions are  
25 added to the agency's Fiscal Year 2024 budget by the Mississippi  
26 Legislature. The Legislature shall determine the agency's  
27 personal services appropriation, which shall be published by the  
28 State Personnel Board. Additionally, the State Personnel Board  
29 shall determine and publish the projected annualized payroll costs  
30 based on current employees. It shall be the responsibility of the  
31 agency head to ensure that actual personnel expenditures for  
32 Fiscal Year 2024 do not exceed the data provided by the  
33 Legislative Budget Office. If the agency's Fiscal Year 2024  
34 projected cost exceeds the annualized costs, no salary actions  
35 shall be processed by the State Personnel Board with the exception  
36 of new hires that are determined to be essential for the agency.

37 Any transfers or escalations shall be made in accordance with  
38 the terms, conditions and procedures established by law or  
39 allowable under the terms set forth within this act. The State  
40 Personnel Board shall not escalate positions without written  
41 approval from the Department of Finance and Administration. The  
42 Department of Finance and Administration shall not provide written  
43 approval to escalate any funds for salaries and/or positions



44 without proof of availability of new or additional funds above the  
45 appropriated level.

46 No general funds authorized to be expended herein shall be  
47 used to replace federal funds and/or other special funds which are  
48 being used for salaries authorized under the provisions of this  
49 act and which are withdrawn and no longer available.

50 None of the funds herein appropriated shall be used in  
51 violation of Internal Revenue Service's Publication 15-A relating  
52 to the reporting of income paid to contract employees, as  
53 interpreted by the Office of the State Auditor.

54 Funds have been appropriated herein for the purpose of  
55 funding Project SEC2 minimum salaries for all employees covered  
56 under the Colonel Guy Groff/Neville Kenning Variable Compensation  
57 Plan. It shall be the agency's responsibility to ensure that the  
58 funds are used to increase all employees' salaries up to the  
59 minimum level as determined by the State Personnel Board.

60 **SECTION 4.** None of the funds appropriated by this act shall  
61 be expended for any purpose that is not actually required or  
62 necessary for performing any of the powers or duties of the Office  
63 of the Secretary of State that are authorized by the Mississippi  
64 Constitution of 1890, state or federal law, or rules or  
65 regulations that implement state or federal law.

66 **SECTION 5.** No part of the funds appropriated herein shall be  
67 used, either directly or indirectly, for the purpose of paying any  
68 clerk, stenographer, assistant, deputy, or other person who may be



69 related by blood or marriage within the third degree, computed by  
70 the rules of the civil law, to the official employing or having  
71 the right of employment or selection thereof; and in the event of  
72 any such payment, then the official or person approving and making  
73 or receiving such payment shall be jointly and severally liable to  
74 return to the State of Mississippi and to pay into the State  
75 Treasury three (3) times any such amount so paid or received, to  
76 be recovered at suit of the Attorney General; provided that when  
77 the relationship is by affinity and the person through whom the  
78 relationship was established is dead, this provision shall not  
79 apply.

80         **SECTION 6.** Of the funds appropriated in Section 1 of this  
81 act, the Secretary of State may use funds appropriated for the  
82 purposes of defraying litigation expenses associated with the  
83 enforcement of the Mississippi Securities Act, the Regulation of  
84 Charitable Solicitations Act, and the administration of the Public  
85 Trust.

86         **SECTION 7.** In compliance with the "Mississippi Performance  
87 Budget and Strategic Planning Act of 1994," it is the intent of  
88 the Legislature that the funds provided herein shall be utilized  
89 in the most efficient and effective manner possible to achieve the  
90 intended mission of this agency. Based on the funding authorized,  
91 this agency shall make every effort to attain the targeted  
92 performance measures provided below:

118           **SECTION 8.** Of the funds appropriated in Section 1 of this  
119 act, no more than Five Hundred Thousand Dollars (\$500,000.00) is  
120 provided for paying principal and interest on bond issues for  
121 county voting systems.

122           **SECTION 9.** Of the funds appropriated in Section 2 of this  
123 act, One Million Seven Hundred Fifty Thousand Dollars  
124 (\$1,750,000.00), or so much thereof as may be necessary, is  
125 appropriated out of any money in the State Treasury to the credit  
126 of the Land Records Maintenance Fund, for the purpose of making  
127 distributions to local governments for taxes owed during the  
128 fiscal year.

129           **SECTION 10.** Of the funds appropriated in Section 2 of this  
130 act, Four Million Two Hundred Fifty Thousand Dollars  
131 (\$4,250,000.00), or so much thereof as may be necessary, is  
132 appropriated out of any money in the State Treasury to the credit  
133 of the Elections Support Fund, for the purpose of acquiring,  
134 upgrading, maintaining, or repairing voting equipment, systems,  
135 and supplies, hiring temporary technical support, conducting  
136 elections using such voting equipment or systems and training  
137 election officials during the fiscal year.

138           **SECTION 11.** Of the funds appropriated in Section 2 of this  
139 act, Eleven Million Four Hundred Fifty-five Thousand Two Hundred  
140 Forty-seven Dollars (\$11,455,247.00), or so much thereof as may be  
141 necessary, is appropriated out of any money in the State Treasury  
142 to the credit of the Public Trust Tidelands Fund, and is



143 authorized to be transferred by the Secretary of State to the  
144 Mississippi Department of Marine Resources.

145         **SECTION 12.** It is the intention of the Legislature that  
146 whenever two (2) or more bids are received by this agency for the  
147 purchase of commodities or equipment, and whenever all things  
148 stated in such received bids are equal with respect to price,  
149 quality and service, the Mississippi Industries for the Blind  
150 shall be given preference. A similar preference shall be given to  
151 the Mississippi Industries for the Blind whenever purchases are  
152 made without competitive bids.

153         **SECTION 13.** The money herein appropriated shall be paid by  
154 the State Treasurer out of any money in the State Treasury to the  
155 credit of the proper fund or funds as set forth in this act, upon  
156 warrants issued by the State Fiscal Officer; and the State Fiscal  
157 Officer shall issue his warrants upon requisitions signed by the  
158 proper person, officer or officers in the manner provided by law.

159         **SECTION 14.** This act shall take effect and be in force from  
160 and after July 1, 2023, and shall stand repealed from and after  
161 June 30, 2023.
